



Still, we knew not all kids had good internet or devices, especially in far-away areas. So, our teachers found smart ways to help—like recording lessons and sending them to parents through WhatsApp.

This way, even students living in the most remote places could keep studying. No child missed out on learning—helping every student was something we made sure to do every single day.

Construction activities restarted with renewed energy. Though funding remained challenging, careful financial planning allowed us to move forward with this critical project.






Financial Resilience Through Support from our Donors




- Nav Jeevan Sanstha is very proud because all the students in our 10th batch passed the SSC exam.
