

About the Phlebotomy Course

The Phlebotomy course is designed to provide students with the knowledge and skill to enter a career as a phlebotomist. Students will receive a foundation of anatomy and physiology, lab tests, and specimen collection skills. Practical application is reinforced as students perform venipuncture each week. Upon successful completion of the course, students will receive a certificate of completion from ABBE Education as well as the opportunity to become nationally certified.

Students must be at least 18 years of age

HOW LONG WILL IT TAKE ME TO COMPLETE THE COURSE?

The Phlebotomy course is 300 hours over a period of about 8 weeks.

WHAT TIME DOES THE CLASS MEET?

New classes begin every semester. Class times vary. However, the course is usually offered in the evenings.

WHAT TOPICS ARE COVERED IN THE COURSE?

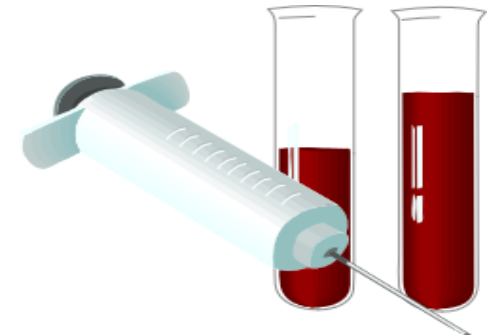
The course covers the following topics: infection control; basic anatomy; medical terminology; lab tests; communication; professionalism; and successful specimen collection.

HOW MUCH DOES THE PHLEBOTOMY COURSE COST?

The cost of the course is \$850 which does not include \$115 for the NHA Certified Phlebotomy Technician examination to be administered at ABBE education. Upon successfully passing the exam, you will obtain national certification. The textbook, phlebotomy packet, lab coat, and safety goggles must be purchased prior to the first day of class.

WHAT IS A PHLEBOTOMIST'S STARTING WAGE?

The average starting wage is between \$11-14 per hour.

- Collects venous blood samples and other specimens for laboratory analysis
- Prepares specimens for transport to ensure stability of sample
- Transports specimens to the laboratory while promoting good public relations with patients and health care personnel
- Maintains safe working conditions.
