Electrocardiograph (EKG) technicians are part of the healthcare team who perform diagnostic tests that help doctors identify cardiovascular problems in patients. The tests can help discover any irregularities in the heart that may lead to a heart attack or heart disease. They work mostly in hospitals but can also work in long-term specialty care facilities or private practices. The EKG technician explains the test to patients prior to conducting them (Htl, 2023).

Career Outlook

EKG Technician jobs are expected to grow 10% or more over the next 10 years.

Salary Forecast

The average EKG Technician salary in the United States is **\$42,000** as of June 26, 2023, but the range typically falls between **\$37,200** and **\$48,600**.
