LPN's work in a variety of settings including hospitals, physician offices, long term care centers, and outpatient clinics. Under the direction of a Registered Nurse or Physician, LPN's provide care to patients of all ages.

Career Outlook

Employment of licensed practical and licensed vocational nurses is projected to grow 6 percent from 2021 to 2031, about as fast as the average for all occupations.

Salary Forecast

The median annual wage for licensed practical and licensed vocational nurses was \$48,070 in May 2021. The median wage is the wage at which half the workers in an occupation earned more than that amount, and half earned less. The lowest 10 percent earned less than \$37,150, and the highest 10 percent earned more than \$63,790.

In May 2021, the median annual wages for licensed practical and licensed vocational nurses in the top industries in which they worked were as follows:

Government	\$52,210
Nursing and residential care facilities	49,620
Home healthcare services	48,350
Hospitals; state, local, and private	47,000
Offices of physicians	46,870

Most licensed practical and licensed vocational nurses (LPNs and LVNs) work full time. Some work nights, weekends, and holidays because medical care takes place at all hours. They may be required to work shifts of longer than 8 hours.
