The Bare Bones Bikes - Disconnect and Ride

Often I speak of all the new technology in our industry. I like to discuss the products and features that are coming down the pipeline that we all consider "upgrades". We talk of electrification, navigation systems, touch screens, USB ports....we lament the use of anti-lock brakes, lean angle sensors and traction control. While these have value for many people, I continue to hear requests for a bike that is basic, visceral and you can just ride. Something that lets you feel the motor, the open road and all the elements around you. If you are on the older side (or young and love history), you remember the bikes with a foot clutch, a kick-starter and a carburetor that needs constant attention as you navigate changes in elevations. These bikes took fortitude to ride. You often needed an interest in "wrenching" and occasionally needed a back-ground in mechanics to keep them running. Some would say they are the true spirit of what a bike is about. Regardless of your preference - the feeling we all get from riding is something often hard to explain. Certainly it is hard to explain to someone that has never tried this activity. You may have heard that Harley just announced the return of the FLHT - Electric Glide Standard. This bike is part of the touring family. It has bags and a fairing and that is pretty much it. There is no radio, no USB ports - it has nothing but motor, gears and a desire to rip the open roads. I am personally excited to see this bike. It will be on the floors by the time you start reading this. As we see the NMMRO take some wins at the state level on "distracted drivers," it is great to see a bike that also takes that into consideration. If we can teach our kids (and ourselves) to put down the technology and focus on the moment - we will be a far more engaged people. Here at Santa Fe Harley-Davidson & KTM, we don't believe in transactions, we believe in interactions. We know that relationships are more valuable than bank accounts. Be sure to load up on Uninsured/Under-insured Motorist coverage in case something bad does happen. This includes having the coverage and ensuring the limits are higher than the state-minimum to make sure you are protected. It is my experience based on years of handling accident claims that the worst drivers often have minimal insurance or none at all.
