HONOR

George Edward Hawkins, Sr., son of the late Landres Hawkins and Rebecca Joyner, was born on September 11, 1946, in Roanoke Rapids, NC. He later relocated to Philadelphia, PA, then retired to Bear, DE.

He completed his high school education and graduated from Benjamin Franklin High School in Philadelphia, PA, in 1964. After graduating, he enlisted in the United States Navy. George received several commendations: Vietnam Service Medal with Bronze Star, Vietnam Campaign Medal with Device, National Defense Service Medal, and Navy Unit Commendation for service with the Naval Support Activity - Saigon. After his dedicated service in the Navy, he received his Honorable Discharge from the United States Navy in 1971. He then attended and graduated from J.F. Kennedy Vocational School, as an automatic Screw Machinist. He worked for over 30 years receiving outstanding performance certificates and awards throughout his tenure until he retired.

George married the late Hettie Joanne Best-Hawkins who preceded him in death. And from this union, George and Joanne were blessed with two sons. Tony Hawkins and George E. Hawkins, Jr. Their sons blessed them with four grandchildren: Tony – two granddaughters, Jasmine Hawkins and Jenna Hawkins. George Jr. – two grandsons, Taheer Lamont Hawkins and George Edward Hawkins, III.

George Sr. then united in holy matrimony, until his transition, to Kimalee T. Channel-Hawkins. In this union, he was gifted with another son, Kenneth James Hawkins, who married Amanda Hope Hawkins, which gave George and Kimalee the grandson, Isaiah Francis Hawkins.

George Sr. was one of six children. Proceeding him in death: Mary Hawkins-Knight, Alice T. Hawkins, Diane B. Hawkins-Soloman and Jerry W. Hawkins. His only surviving brother, Walter L. Hawkins.

As the oldest son, George Sr., learned early what it meant to provide for his family, an important characteristic which he instilled in his sons. They all have testified that their father was a good man and taught them the importance of being a provider and protector for their family.
