# LVBC helps clients from the Family Self-Sufficiency Program



In early spring 2022, Kim Grimes with the Washington Housing Authority reached out to us and asked us to be a part of their Program Coordinating Committee. This committee was formed specifically to help clients participating in the Family Self-Sufficiency (FSS) initiative. FSS is a program that enables HUD-assisted families to increase their earned income and reduce their dependency on welfare assistance and rental subsidies. Participants work with an FSS service coordinator, Ms. Grimes, to identify their financial and employment-related goals, including education or training, and that's where LVBC comes in.

Since my first meeting with Kim Grimes and the committee in April, Kim has referred, and we are currently assisting, six students working towards their GEDs. With our help, a seventh student, has completed a course through BCCC, received his Certified Kitchen Cook certificate from the American Hotel and Lodging Educational Institute and has secured employment in this field. These students have been very motivated and consistent in their studies. They demonstrate an eagerness to learn as well as a willingness to work hard and overcome obstacles. LVBC is proud to be a part of their journey.

Tutors donated 936.5 hours of their time to their students and volunteers donated 662 hours to LVBC for fundraising, recruiting, advertising, and other activities for a grand total of 1598.25 hours. At the rate of \$29.95 (Independent Sector estimate of worth of an hour of time) a total of \$47,867.59 was invested in Beaufort County.
