NFT Art

NFT (Non-Fungible Token) art is all the rage with art collectors on a global scale. A recent NFT transaction was described as "titled #0000 Murakami. Flower by Takashi Murakami and it attracted a bid of 144 ether, or about \$260,395".

NFT art is a digital asset that is collectable, unique, and non-transferrable. Because each NFT is unique in its concept and design and cannot be duplicated, each NFT becomes limited and rare. NFTs get their value because the transaction proves ownership of the art. When you own an NFT, you can keep or wait for it to appreciate, and then sell or trade it.

How much NFT was sold in 2021? By the numbers: NFT sales reached \$17.7 billion in 2021, up from \$82.5 million in 2020 — a jump of more than 200 times. Total NFT profits when reselling or buying also skyrocketed from \$12 million in 2020 to \$5.4 billion in 2021.Mar 9, 2022

It is up to artists if they wish to take all the space, or if they would like to share the space.


Pelican Rouge will handle all sales and take a 20% com-mission on all sales.



If you have found yourself frustrated by "muddy" or dull colour in your oil paintings, having difficulty mixing the colours you want, or overwhelmed by choice at the art supply store or from your paint collection, this workshop is for you!

This workshop will help you understand colour more thoroughly, match colours more efficiently, choose effective pigments for your goals, and merge conceptual and perceptual understanding of colour. Through a series of exercises, discussions, and demonstrations, you will gain knowledge in topics such as the colour wheel, properties of colour (hue, chroma, and value) and how they relate to one another, colour temperature, direct and indirect painting, colour charts, and how to avoid "muddy" colours for clear and vibrant results in your paintings. There will be instructor demos, discussions and explanations, and plenty of hands-on painting time with the opportunity to ask questions.

Some oil painting experience recommended (no acrylic please). Suitable for intermediate painters and adventurous beginners.
