Elena Markelova *is our guest presenter Demo Artist for February 12th*



About our Presenter

Elena Markelova is a Russian-born, Vancouver-based artist. Her work is inspired by the beauty she interprets in cities, nature, and the creatures that inhabit the Pacific Ocean. Elena is most known for her double exposure animal watercolours and detailed maps.

Elena describes that her journey as an artist began when she was very young. After many years of study of many different mediums and techniques she has realized that she has an unconditional love for watercolours. 'There is magic in the unique ability of the medium to produce exciting, interesting and sometimes unexpected ways to blend and mix colour.'

Elena moved to British Columbia, Canada from Siberia in 2012 and found her two loves, her husband and the wilderness. Elena was amazed by the beauty of nature and the wildlife that inhabits the land, air and water. She describes that: 'I was amazed by the beauty of nature and the wildlife that inhabits the land, air and water. I will always remember the first breath of that autumn air – the smell of grass and leaves; even rain and wet rocks had their smell. For the girl who grew up in an industrial part of Siberia that was so unique.' Her love of nature and wildlife has motivated Elena to donate to a portion of her painting sales to various global and local associations.

Before moving to BC, Elena had never seen a bear or other animals in their natural habitat. On her first trip to the mountains in BC, she saw a black bear cub. Since then, nature and the wild places have become her true love and inspiration. The strength of Elena's collection is the combination of landscapes and wildlife in a unique way.

In this demo:

Elena will demonstrate her painting of 'The Lone Wolf'. She describes that the Lone Wolf is a symbol of independence and not being afraid to break away from the status quo and be different. She will demonstrate her unique 'double exposure style' that combines a portrait of the wolf with a moonlit mountain landscape using different watercolour techniques and some of Elena's favourite tricks to add more life to the painting.

Elena's unique style is on display in her 'Map of Vancouver' that is on permanent exhibition at the Museum of Vancouver. She is a member of IWS Canada and often participate in their events.

Ian de Hoog

Beautiful Birds in Watercolour

About the Presenter:

lan de Hoog is a Canadian artist and teacher working primarily in watercolour. He is an active member of the Semiahmoo Arts Society and the Federation of Canadian Artists. As an instructor, lan is a frequent contributor to the Visiting Artists series for the Opus Arts Supply chain in British Columbia and is a watercolour instructor for the Shadbolt Centre for Fine Arts in Burnaby, BC and Winslow Art Center on Bainbridge Island, WA. In addition to this Ian has also traveled throughout BC to give various workshops and demonstrations to different art groups and societies.





In this Workshop:

In this workshop lan will demonstrate and share ideas about how to quickly, and beautifully, capture birds in a loose watercolor style. As he shares the art of painting birds using watercolor techniques, lan will explore and explain different techniques such as wet-onwet, dry brush, moisture control and layering to capture the essence of birds.

Participants will learn how to select the relevant information from a reference image and then prepare a line drawing with only the essential information. They will also learn Colour Mapping and how to derive the colours from the bird and then apply them to what's in their palette to create a harmony that is inspired by the bird and leaves a little room for interpretation.

Over the course of the 2-day workshop students can expect to complete 2 full paintings and a few sketches. lan's painting demonstrations will be broken down into sections, allowing students an opportunity to apply the teachings before moving to the next section.

Angela's favourite subject to paint is abstract landscapes in watercolour, and the process to abstract the landscape is a patient, experimental, playful process of repetition. She will demonstrate a "literal" first version, followed by sketches that help her understand the composition and main elements in the scene, and then iterate and edit out unnecessary details in successive variations. This process lends itself well to a series of classes once weekly, so students can really tune themselves into the scene and be thinking through its development.

She likes to bring in a bit of mixed media, like watercolour sticks, water-soluble pencils, graphite powder or stencils as the process develops.

Cheryl Vandenberg and Rita Dahlie are responsible for the Oceana PARC Playhouse.





This event will now be known as the Art Market-Group of 10. The first market is March 9 and 10, 2024. The following Market will be May 25 & 26.

The goal of these markets is to provide an opportunity to members who may do other art besides painting. For example, jewelry makers, sculptors, woodworkers, photographers. You may be a painter who produces cards, prints, fabric art etc. This is an opportunity for you.

As members you can apply to participate in this market experience once every 2 years. The art society provides you, the artist, the use of the Turnbull Gallery, and the society's tables, easels, tablecloths and payment system supervised by the treasurer. You are expected to set up on the Friday and supervise your booth for the two days of the market. The society takes 20% of the sales.

These markets will require you to register through the website and pay a non-refundable fee of \$25. The website will be set up to accept the first ten who register. If you did a show last year please do not register for this year's events.

Please note: The society will set up the advertising materials, order and provide them to the group out of the registration fee. We will also provide Facebook and Instagram material for you to post. Other forms of advertising and contacting the local paper etc., will be up to the group to facilitate.

You will need to be prepared to upload one photo of your art that can be used for advertising purposes.

Registration for the first market will be open December 28, 2023. And close once it is filled.

The next shows are in May and November. Announcements regarding registry will be announced 3 months in advance of the show.

SPACE: The "art wall" space is separated by "pillars". As a result, there are 3 separate (but adjacent) areas along the length of the one wall.

TWO OF THE AREAS: measure approximately:

8.5 feet wide x 4.5 feet high

THE THIRD AREA: measures approximately:

5.5 feet wide x 4.5 feet high

PLEASE GO TO THE PELICAN ROUGE AND LOOK AT THE SPACE BEFORE YOU MAKE ANY HANGING PLANS.

DISPLAY TIME: Work will be displayed for a month at a time.

It is up to artists if they wish to take all the space, or if they would like to <u>share the space</u>.

Generally your time will start at the beginning of the month and will end at the end of the month. I have left these times flexible and will help co-ordinate the taking-down and hanging times between artists if necessary.

HANGING YOUR WORK:

PLEASE HANG/TAKE DOWN YOUR WORK AFTER 4 PM.

This is by the owners request.

There will be a hammer, nails and sticky-tac or masking tape available to use for labels. It is kept behind the counter. *Ask Diane or Helen for it.*

If you need help, please let me know and I can help you if I am available.

BOX OF CARDS: You may include a small box of greeting cards.

Make a record of how many cards you have and leave this at the shop.

Mark each cards one price (eg. \$5) - NOT 5 for \$20.00

SMALL ORIGINALS & PRINTS: You may bring a small shoebox size of small prints and/or originals.

LEAVE YOUR BOX OF ORIGINALS, PRINTS & GREETING CARDS IN THE COFFEE SHOP FOR THE MONTH FOLLLOWING YOUR DISPLAY.

FOR EXAMPLE: If you display in April, you may leave your items for the month of May.

SALES: The owners will handle all sales and take a 20% commission. Leave an inventory of your work with Helen or Dianne so they can mark off any sales.



In our final <u>Just Paint</u> article of the year Materials & Applications Specialist Scott Fischer tests several brands of tape for use within mixed media art.

Can I Use Tape in Mixed Media Works?



Tape is an immensely useful tool for artists and designers. It is a go-to option when masking off areas of a painting or establishing the layout of a design. Masking tapes and painter's tapes are uniquely designed to offer low tack adhesion and easy release, making them perfect for these applications. That being said, some artists like to use tape as a medium or collage material in their mixed-media art. While this would be considered an off-label use of these products, our Lab decided to test a few commonly used painter's tapes to see how they hold up to lightfast testing. This article shares the methods we used, observations and considerations when using tape within a work of art.
