About Our Presenter

Susan J. Falk's subjects range from landscapes, figurative works and still-life. Collaborating with poets and environmentalists, Falk received an Environmental Hero Award for her efforts to help save a forest in Glen Valley. She has been featured in the Cascadia Review, as well as a guest speaker for the Verge Conference at Trinity Western University, Arts and the Environment. A life-long artist and veteran teacher, Falk has been involved in the Fraser Valley arts community for decades. Falk served on the board of directors of the Fort Gallery for 11 years and has also been part of the Langley Centennial Museum advisory committee. In 2015, she was invited to show her lifesized bears and salmon paintings in a one-woman show in Kyoto, Japan. More recently she completed a residency at the Shadbolt Centre for the arts. Life Drawing is a major part of her creative environment where experimentation and free-flowing ideas are expressed with enthusiasm and energy. About this Workshop:

With many requests for a 'call back' of Lalita, this workshop has been customized to build on the skills learned in the previous SSWRAS colour workshop. The course is also an excellent choice for participants who have not taken the weekend workshop but have some prior experience in painting and colour theory who wish to go to the next level in their understanding and use of colour.

This new SSWRAS Course consists of 3, 2 hour zoom sessions and includes:

ZOOM + access to class video post sessions


Exercises pre-course (optional)

Homework exercises between sessions

Tailored feedback at the beginning of the next session (optional)

This zoom course will consist of information and exercises for you to do both in and out of class. The majority of the practice will occur between classes,



so it is recommended participants will plan to have time for a minimum of six hours per week to paint. Videos of each session will be available to view for 2.5 weeks following each session.

Participants can opt to email photos of their homework to Lalita in order to receive tailored feedback at the beginning of the next session. The focus will be on oil and acrylic, however, the information presented applies to all colour media.


Some of the artists showing their work are new to the society and may not know how the payment for sold paintings work.

Cheryl Vandenberg and Rita Dahlie are responsible for the Oceana PARC Playhouse.
























ART MARKET Group of 10

Sponsored by SSWRAS

This event will now be known as the Art Market-Group of 10. The first market is March 9 and 10, 2024. The following Market will be May 25 & 26.

The goal of these markets is to provide an opportunity to members who may do other art besides painting. For example, jewelry makers, sculptors, woodworkers, photographers. You may be a painter who produces cards, prints, fabric art etc. This is an opportunity for you.

As members you can apply to participate in this market experience once every 2 years. The art society provides you, the artist, the use of the Turnbull Gallery, and the society's tables, easels, tablecloths and payment system supervised by the treasurer. You are expected to set up on the Friday and supervise your booth for the two days of the market. The society takes 20% of the sales.

These markets will require you to register through the website and pay a non-refundable fee of \$25. The website will be set up to accept the first ten who register. If you did a show last year please do not register for this year's events.

Please note: The society will set up the advertising materials, order and provide them to the group out of the registration fee. We will also provide Facebook and Instagram material for you to post. TWO OF THE AREAS: measure approximately:

8.5 feet wide x 4.5 feet high

THE THIRD AREA: measures approximately:

5.5 feet wide x 4.5 feet high

PLEASE GO TO THE PELICAN ROUGE AND LOOK AT THE SPACE BEFORE YOU MAKE ANY HANGING PLANS.

DISPLAY TIME: Work will be displayed for a month at a time.

It is up to artists if they wish to take all the space, or if they would like to <u>share the space</u>.

Generally your time will start at the beginning of the month and will end at the end of the month. I have left these times flexible and will help co-ordinate the taking-down and hanging times between artists if necessary.

HANGING YOUR WORK:

PLEASE HANG/TAKE DOWN YOUR WORK AFTER 4 PM.

This is by the owners request.

There will be a hammer, nails and sticky-tac or masking tape available to use for labels. It is kept behind the counter. *Ask Diane or Helen for it.*

If you need help, please let me know and I can help you if I am available.

BOX OF CARDS: You may include a small box of greeting cards.

Make a record of how many cards you have and leave this at the shop.

Mark each cards one price (eg. \$5) - NOT 5 for \$20.00

SMALL ORIGINALS & PRINTS: You may bring a small shoebox size of small prints and/or originals.

LEAVE YOUR BOX OF ORIGINALS, PRINTS & GREETING CARDS IN THE COFFEE SHOP FOR THE MONTH FOLLLOWING YOUR DISPLAY.

FOR EXAMPLE: If you display in April, you may leave your items for the month of May.

Find your inspiration in Darts Hill Garden

Photographers, painters, and multimedia artists find inspiration in Darts Hill Garden Park in all seasons of the year. The Darts Hill Garden Conservancy Trust Society supports and encourages temporary art and art making in the garden.

The Darts Hill Garden Conservancy Trust Society (DHGCTS) is now accepting applications from local artists for its Artist in Residence Program (AiR).

The AiR is a self-directed program offering opportunities for artists to work outdoors in Darts Hill Garden Park, 1633 170th St. Surrey, BC, V3S 9X3.

This residency accommodates artists working in painting, drawing, installation, photography, sculpture, print, fibre, video, film, literary, and applied arts for the production of new or ongoing bodies of work.

In exchange, artists will schedule at least 4 days during Garden Open days (Saturday or Sunday only) to interact with the public through their art, with the possibility to exhibit their AiR project in the garden.

In exchange, artists will donate a piece of art created during their residency to the DHGCTS with the understanding that the donation may be auctioned, sold, or gifted as deemed appropriate. Additionally, in cooperation with the artist, DHGCTS reserves the right to reproduce images of selected artwork which may be sold to the public. Donations must be received by the Society within six months of the completion of the residency.

A tour of the garden before submitting proposals will be available on request.

Qualifications

This residency is open to artists throughout the City of Surrey and all other communities from Squamish to Hope. The DHGCTS is seeking an artist who will benefit from outdoor work experience in the garden and has an ongoing, self-directed, independent practice. Multiple artists may apply together, and collectives are welcome. Suitability and limitations of the outdoor environment of the garden park will be taken into consideration. Artists

are required to become a member of the DHGCTS in order to participate in the program, but do not need to be members to apply.

Application submission deadline: NOON, on April 30, 2024



Wayne Wagstaff - Art Trick Article

Have you ever taken a picture and wanted to paint it. Then when you do, you find it hard to copy the 8×11 picture onto a 16×22 canvas! Well you can always just paint on small canvases or try to draw freehand on the canvas. For me neither works. I just get my standard Brother Work Smart printer to print a poster. A poster is a printout using 4 pages to hold the painting, in other words a 16×22 print.

I normally go into MS Word or any text program you have. I change to landscape, insert a picture, adjust the picture size (if I want it say 14 x 18), select print and change the page size.



Each printer app will look different but the thing is they all should have multiple page option. If you do not find it, go onto the Internet and search for printing on multiple pages, select a video and enjoy!

Now you can trace the picture on the canvas and leave the fun stuff to you and your brush!
