

### Catherine Robertson, AFCA

is our guest artist at our September meeting.



Bio

Born and raised on the Pacific Coast and 30 years spent exploring its waterways, bays and coves, on the two Monk design cruisers her father built, along with skiing its mountains in winter and hiking them in

summer, resulted in her deep love and regard for these wild places and the creatures that call them home. Naturally enough, they are most often the themes found in her paintings and drawings.

Self taught but for a few workshops with senior artists, she discovered that, as one mentor said, "paint, paint, 'paint", to the much asked question, how does one become successful. Truly, hard work and devotion over a long period of time seems to prove this to be true. Catherine started painting seriously in 1972 after discovering her mother's unused oil paints in a dusty, dark part of the basement and has devoted her time to learning oils, acrylics and most particularly, good drawing skills ever since. She likes the thought, as put to her by a very successful artist, that "a good painting sits onboard a good drawing", where perspective is correct and values are worked out to be harmonious and true. A strong composition, well balanced and inviting, along with the fun, delight and attractiveness of pattern is very important to her. This incorporates the patterns of size, value, texture, warm & cool, etc. and, although it sometimes takes much trial, error and thought, the fun is in the success when that is finally achieved to the artists' own eye.

Catherine taught drawing, painting in both oils and acrylics for 35 years and is now devoting all her time to her own paintings. She was offered her AFCA Status with the Federation of Canadian Artists in 2020 along with being invited and juried unanimously into the



Mondial Art Academia in Southern France, MAA, and was awarded Artiste de Mois for the month of July 2020. Her work can be seen at the Peninsula Gallery, Sidney, BC. and she shows many of her pieces on her Facebook website, as well as her own website, robertsongallery. com

### What will she be presenting?

Because her paintings take several sittings of several hours to complete, she thought perhaps it would be a helpful demo that shows how she starts a painting, using the all-important-to-her thumbnail sketch where composition and values are generally worked out. Often the beginning is over a toned canvas, likely Cadmium Red Light, especially doing snow scenes, or perhaps just drawing in the basic shapes, as they are shown in my thumbnail, using a small, flat brush, and black acrylic onto the canvas.

The chances are excellent that the theme of the September demo will be her beloved snowy lane, perhaps Red Flyer sleds and a dog or cat or even

perhaps a snowplow in the scene. Often there is a bright red Volkswagen but only time will tell!

There are countless great memories, including many that have little or nothing to do with art. You shared personal stories that inspired, encouraged, and touched me in ways that will resonate for the rest of my life. Some of you became close friends. It's not naive to hope our paths will continue to intersect in the future.

Starting in September, the gallery will have a new manager, Chakara Brown, who has been here over the summer learning the ropes. Most importantly, she is absorbing the ineffable "feel" of the place, the welcoming calm environment we have always strived to nurture. Chakara is a warm and approachable person who greatly looks forward to working with the gallery's clients and artists. Please drop by to say hello.

Frances is also retiring, this time for sure, whereas Byron,



Sydney and Deborah are all staying. These valuable staff members will provide important continuity and friendly faces.

Rest assured that until the formal transfer, I remain 1000% committed to giving great service and tidying up as many loose ends as possible. My focus is exceedingly task-oriented right now, even as the days are increasingly swirling with bittersweet emotions and memories.





# Many people profit when an artwork is sold in the secondary market – but not the artist.

The Artist's Resale Right would allow visual artists to receive 5% when their work is resold – just as they do in at least 94 other countries.

CARFAC has been advocating for an Artist's Resale Right (ARR) for many years. Here is a summary of their proposal.

# THE ARTIST'S RESALE RIGHT

COPYRIGHT FOR VISUAL ARTISTS

> In line with the Prime Minister's Mandate Letter to the Minister of Canadian Heritage, we urge the Government of Canada to amend the Copyright Act to include the Artist's Resale Right.





Unlike artists in other countries, Canadian visual artists are not currently paid for sales of their work in the secondary market. The **Artist's Resale Right (ARR)**, as promised by the government in an amended Copyright Act, would entitle visual artists to receive a royalty payment each time their work is resold publicly.

The ARR is significant as artwork often grows in value over time, and artists currently have no legal right to receive income from this growth.



CARFAC and RAAV propose that 5% of all eligible secondary sales of artwork sold for at least \$1,000 should be paid back to the artist.

## The ARR is a copyright royalty, not a tax.

It would not be collected by the government nor would it be spent by government. Furthermore, the government would not be involved with collecting, distributing, or monitoring the payment of royalties. To simplify the administrative process, a copyright collective society would oversee the payment of royalties.



## IN CONCLUSION

### THE TIME TO ACT IS NOW

We ask that the federal government fulfill Minister Rodriguez's Mandate Letter commitment and introduce a bill to amend the Copyright Act before the end of 2022, which includes the Artist's Resale Right.

### ABOUT CARFAC AND RAAV

CARFAC and RAAV represent Canada's 21,000 visual artists.







### CANADIAN ARTISTS' REPRESENTATION / LE FRONT DES ARTISTES CANADIENS (CARFAC)

CARFAC is Canada's national professional membership association with 4,000 visual artist members. We believe that artists, like professionals in other fields, should be paid fairly for their work, and we educate the visual arts community about artists' economic and legal rights.

### REGROUPEMENT DES ARTISTES EN ARTS VISUELS DU QUÉBEC (RAAV)

With over 1600 members, RAAV is the only association legally mandated to represent visual artists in Quebec. The main mission of RAAV is to work in the improvement of the living conditions and professional practices of artists in visual arts in Quebec.

Montreal abstract artist Claude Tousignant, whose painting Accélérateur Chromatique 90 resold in 2012 for \$110,000, is among the artists supporting reform of the law. He would have received \$5,500 had changes to copyright law being prepared by Ministers, been in place when it was resold.

The late Inuk artist, Kenojuak Ashevak, sold a work called Enchanted Owl in 1960 for \$24 and it was later resold for \$158,500.

"Our government is currently advancing work on potential amendments to the Copyright Act to further protect artists, creators, and copyright holders," said Laurie Bouchard, a

spokeswoman for Champagne. "Resale rights for artists are indeed an important step toward improving economic conditions for artists in Canada."

CARFAC, which represents Canadian artists, wants artists to get five per cent of the value of their work when it is resold, and for their estate to receive funds according to copyright rules decades after their death.

It says at least 90 countries, including the United Kingdom and France, already have resale rights for artists, but Canada is lagging behind, driving many artists to abandon their craft because they cannot make a living from it.

There are over 21,000 visual artists in Canada, and according to the 2016 census, their median income is \$20,000 a year from all income sources.

"It's important to really acknowledge that half of our artists live in poverty," said April Britski, executive director of CARFAC. "We all benefit from arts and culture, and our creators deserve a better, more stable income."

The forthcoming change in the law follows years of campaigning by Sen. Patricia Bovey, the first art historian in the Senate.

Bovey, former director of the Winnipeg Art Gallery, said France has had resale rights for over 100 years and the change to copyright laws is far overdue in Canada.

The senator said she knew of many artists who had sold works at the beginning of their careers for small sums, and seen them appreciate "by 10 times or more."

Inuit artists, who often live in remote areas and sell locally, are among those who would particularly benefit if they get a slice of resale value at galleries and auctions.

"Artists are the group in Canada who make up the largest percentage of the working poor — below the poverty line," Bovey said. "It's our artists who tell us who we are, where we are, what we as a society face. If they can't financially support themselves we will lose that really important window on who we are as Canadians."
