EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN, WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK, WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

DEFINITIONS/ELIGIBILITY

CBLM – Qualifying class for 2027 CBLMs. Riders must be members of a participating organization at the time of the show to be eligible.

GAIG – Qualifying class for the 2026 GAIG/USDF Championships (declare qualifying ride on entry form) – Entry fee plus additional \$20 fee required, **MUST BE PAID PRIOR TO THE START OF THE CLASS.** Effective for the 2026 regional championships, owners must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Junior Active, Senior Active, Life, or Recorded Farm (with Active Farm Owner)). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.

Open – Open to all Horses and Riders. Show management may split into AA's and Junior/Young Rider sections based on class size.

AA - Open to Adult Amateurs only; competitors must compete as adults from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 22 & they must hold a current USEF Amateur Card.

JR/ YR – Open to Juniors and Young riders only; Individuals are eligible as JR until the end of the calendar year in which they reach 18 or YR until the end of the calendar year in which they reach 21 (specify on entry form).

MFS – USDF or FEI Musical Freestyle only; no Pas de Deux or Quadrille. Except for FEI Junior or Young Rider Freestyle entries, competitors in freestyle qualifying classes must submit a photocopy of a test verifying eligibility to enter class.

TOC - Test of Choice (specify test level on entry form). May be qualifier if proper test ridden and fees paid.

OPPORTUNITY CLASSES - No USEF/USDF memberships or Horse ID required for Opportunity classes if entered **ONLY** in Intro and/or Opportunity classes. Horses entered only in Opportunity classes are exempt from the \$25 USEF fee. However, horses entered in these classes are still subject to and must comply with all D&M rules and are subject to drug testing at the competition. Riders/horses are permitted to cross-enter into other recognized classes at this show.

ENTRIES: ONLINE ENTRIES ONLY. ALL REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION MUST BE UPLOADED AND FULL PAYMENT RECEIVED PRIOR TO THE CLOSING DATE FOR YOUR ENTRY TO BE PROCESSED. Online Entries will be processed through www.horseshowoffice.com. Individuals utilizing the online entry system for this competition do so with the agreement that they have read the OFFICIAL PRIZE LIST and agree to follow all the class specifications, requirements and conditions in the OFFICIAL PRIZE LIST.

Payment by PayPal and Check Only. Entries must be received by the closing date. Mail, Telephone and email entries will not be accepted. All entries MUST include the below MANDATORY documentation:

- Current 2026 Entry Forms with current Federation Agreement and VA USEF Waiver. Entry form must be signed in all three required signature blocks in accordance with USEF rules, as well as signature in COACH block if applicable. Electronic signatures accepted. *Competitors are reminded that USEF rules require entry forms to be signed completely in all three signature blocks. JR/YR riders are reminded to include their birth date or their entries will be returned. Junior riders CANNOT sign as Rider or Trainer. Please have your parent or guardian sign. You MUST include an emergency contact and phone # (see stabling).*
- A valid negative Coggins test (through 9/7/2026). Entries will not be accepted without a current Coggins. A photocopy is acceptable provided the date, results, horse name, and vet signature are legible.
- You must also include documentation of your horse's Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within 6 months of the show. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the grounds upon request by Competition Management (GR845).
- For Musical Freestyles, please upload your Music in MP3 or WAV format with your entry documents. Please also bring two CD copies with you to the show in case of any technical difficulties.

Horse Registration Requirements:

- USEF Requirement: Every horse must have a unique USEF Horse ID (HID) or USEF Annual/Lifetime Recording number to compete.
- USDF Requirement: Horses must also possess a USDF HID or Lifetime Business Recording.
- Exemptions: Horses entered *only* in Opportunity classes, Introductory positions, or Leadline are exempt from these horse registration requirements.

Temperature Log and Health Statement MUST be provided at checkin. The Temperature Log must include temps taken 3 days prior to the show and continue through the show. The completed Temperature Log must be provided to the Secretary prior to departing the show. **Any horse with an elevated temperature WILL be asked to leave the show grounds.**

Show management reserves the right to refuse entries, make changes, deletions or corrections as deemed necessary.

NO REFUNDS AFTER CLOSING DATE for any reason including the cancellation of classes due to Acts of God, acts of terrorism, inclement weather and/or other emergencies. Full refund minus Office Fee if the Entry Secretary is notified by email on or before the closing date.

GAIG/USDF Q FEES refunded if request received before start of class (unless applied to other indebtedness); otherwise, will be paid to USDF.

***POST ENTRIES:** (received after the closing date) may be accepted on a space-available basis. Must include \$50 Late Fee.

ENTRY CONFIRMATION: Entry confirmation will be EMAILED to each competitor upon processing of entry. Please be sure to include a valid and legible email address. Please check this for any errors. If you have any questions or did not receive this confirmation, contact the Secretary immediately. You must provide an emergency contact and Phone # for the RIDER during the show and if stabled, an emergency contact & phone # must be written on the stall card for each stabled horse.

A Rider's **first NO SHOW** will result in the rider being a show scratch and all their remaining rides for the show will be made available to be filled.

EFFECTIVE 12/1/22: To be eligible to compete at Federation Licensed Competitions, coaches, trainers, and legal guardians signing as coaches or trainers on behalf of their minors must be Senior Active Members in good standing, Riders and owners are eligible for one (and ONLY one) Show Pass per year. Trainers and coaches are no longer eligible to participate under a Show Pass. If you plan to show both days, you will need to USEF and for those 18 & over, you will need to complete the safe sport training.

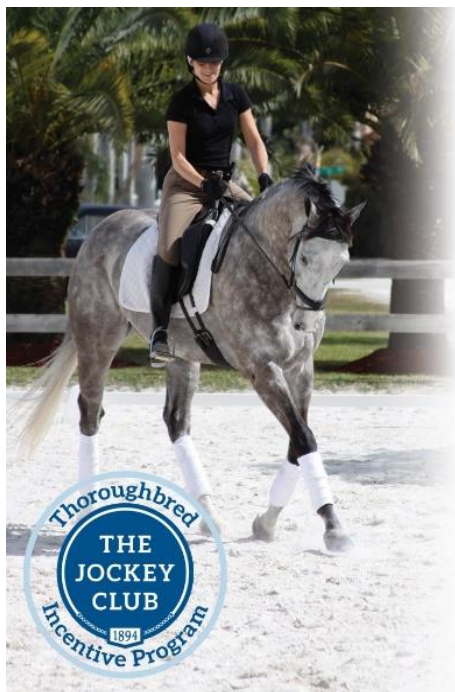
USEF Presidential Modification, 2/23/26: Beginning December 1, 2026, under GR 1101.10, all horses competing in USEF-licensed or -endorsed competitions must be microchipped with a 15-digit ISO compliant 11784/11785 chip. [www.usef.org](https://www.usef.org/compete/resources-forms/competition-management/competition-safety-biosecurity/microchipping) For more information, please visit, <https://www.usef.org/compete/resources-forms/competition-management/competition-safety-biosecurity/microchipping> (Please be aware there are 15-digit ISO compliant microchips that also take your horses temperature, so you may want to purchase this kind.)

LEVELS: USDF Intro, USEF Training Level through FEI Grand Prix, USDF and FEI Musical Freestyle, including 2027 CBLM and 2026 GAIG/USDF Qualifiers.

AWARDS: Trophy and six ribbons in each class to be pinned Open, AA, JR/YR except for NDPC TOC and Young Horse Test. High Score Awards may be presented (if entries warrant) in the following categories: Overall High Score Open, Adult Amateur and JR/YR; High Score Level Awards for each level (Intro through Fourth); FEI High Score. Other awards may be presented at management's discretion. Management reserves the right to split/combine classes if entries warrant. Scores below 61% are not eligible for HS Awards. **The awards table will close one hour after the completion of the show each day. Ribbons and awards not picked up at show will not be mailed. It is the competitor's/owner's responsibility to pick up engraved wine glasses from the Andy's Laser Engraving Trailer.** If you are unable to pick up your awards, you may have someone else pick them up and sign for them on your behalf.

National Dressage Pony Cup Championship and High Point Awards: An NDPC High Score Ribbon and Reserve High Score Ribbon will be presented to the highest (and second highest) scoring pony from class #191 on Saturday and #291 on Sunday. Only ponies with valid USEF measurement certificate to be presented to the show secretary will be eligible. Ponies not in possession of a pony measurement card must notify show management with entry submittal that they will require an official measurement. Rider/Owner will be notified prior to the show when/where to bring Pony for measurements. All measurements will take place on the show grounds either Friday afternoon or Saturday morning (depending on TD and Veterinarian's schedule). Owner will be responsible for paying all associated costs for measurements directly to the vet plus a \$10.00 fee payable to VADAF.

Thoroughbred Incentive Program (TIPS): TIPS Awards will be presented in the following categories: Introductory Dressage High Point Thoroughbred, Training Level Dressage High Point Thoroughbred, First Level Dressage High Point Thoroughbred, Second/Third/Fourth Level Dressage High Point Thoroughbred, FEI Levels Dressage High Point Thoroughbred, Freestyle Dressage High Score Thoroughbred, and High Score Dressage Thoroughbred (Overall). It is the rider's responsibility to provide the horse's TIPS number to the show secretary with their entry. For more information on the TIPS program, please visit: <https://tjctip.com>.

3% Online Entry Fee

During the show, acceptable payment is cash, check or PayPal. **PayPal is accepted for online entries ONLY.** Make checks payable to: **VADAF**

PayPal dispute: \$70 charge per dispute, chargeback and/or withdrawal.

RETURN CHECK POLICY: Entry will be removed from the schedule, charged the return check fee and placed on the Wait List until a money order or certified check is received by the Secretary.

USEF SAFE SPORT TRAINING REQUIREMENT: If you are a USEF Competing Member 18 years of age or older you are required to complete the core Safe Sport Training within 7 days of activating your membership. If you do not complete the training, you are ineligible to participate in all USEF activities including competitions. TAKE the SAFE SPORT TRAINING at USEF.org by logging into your member dashboard.

NON-COMPETING HORSES: must fill out a current entry blank & sign rider, owner, trainer, submit a current Coggins test (valid through 9/7/2026) and current Flu/Rhino (within 6 months of these shows) vaccination record, pay the \$30 non-refundable Office Fee and \$50.00 non-compete horse fee; Grounds/stabling fees are additional. Non-competing horses do NOT pay the USEF D/M fees and there are no membership requirements.

FLY HOODS (EAR COVERS) are permitted for all classes in order to protect horses from insects. The fly hoods should be discreet and should not cover the horse's eyes. After completion of the test, the rider or his representative is responsible for removing the fly hood to present to the designated ring steward for inspection. USEF DR121.7

NEW BRIDLE & BIT CHECK PROCEDURES: As of 2024 DR126:2 indicates TD is responsible for checking a minimum of 50% of the assembled bits and bridles of horses entered. This will be done at the barns, ringside and at the request of the competitor.

FREESTYLES: The sound system will be available for testing (times to be announced at the show). You should upload your MP3 or WAV file with your online entry. Please bring two CDs with your freestyle music to the sound check in case they are needed.

ARENAS: Arena 1, 2 and 3 are outdoor rings with sand/blue stone footing (each will have a competition arena measuring, 20m x 60m). There will be one outdoor warm-up ring measuring 215' x 145' and one

outdoor lunging ring measuring 100' x 200'. Both have sand/bluestone footing. Rings may be watered periodically should the weather conditions warrant.

DOGS: All dogs MUST be kept on a leash while on the show grounds. Any dog off leash is subject to a \$50 fine per USEF rules.

TIMES: Official Times will be posted on Horse Show Office www.horseshowoffice.com.

EARLY ARRIVAL/LATE DEPARTURE: Arrival time is **Noon on Friday 9/4/2026**. Management reserves the right to charge an Early Arrival Fee. If you require a late departure or overnight stay on Sunday, you MUST notify the show secretary prior to the closing date. Overnight stays will incur additional stabling charges at the daily stable rate.

STABLING: \$125.00 for the weekend, arriving on Friday **noon** through Sunday 6:00 p.m. Daily rate \$60.00. NO initial bedding. Bedding available for purchase. Permanent Stalls with small half doors and stall mats. Stallions may need additional stall guards for doors. If you have a stallion you are required to also get a tack stall. Stall dimensions are 10' x 10'. If entering both shows, please reserve your stabling on the September 5th entry ONLY. Be sure to use your USDF numbers when entering online. This will ensure both days entries are connected. Barn lights will be off from 11:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. each night.

NIGHT SECURITY/NIGHT WATCH SERVICES: Night Security and Night Watch Services will be Haley Jones, 434-713-3446

MEDICAL-WASTE/SHARPS CONTAINERS: In accordance with GR1210.4 sharps containers are provided in the stabling area and shall be used for disposal of ALL needles and other sharp instruments. They MUST NOT be discarded in stalls, manure pits, garbage cans or on the competition grounds. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

HOSPITALITY: Food will be available for purchase on-site during show hours. Additionally, there will be complimentary snacks and coffee for competitors located in the Hospitality Stall in the barn area (see show map for location)

Under Virginia Law, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for an injury to or the death of a participant in equine activities resulting exclusively from the inherent risks of equine activities. CODE OF VIRGINIA TITLE 3.1. AGRICULTURE, HORTICULTURE AND FOOD, CHAPTER 27.5 EQUINE ACTIVITY LIABILITY ACT, VA. Code Ann. 3.1-796.130 (1994).

MOTORIZED VEHICLE STATEMENT: In accordance with GR901.29: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. ***The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation.*** Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT (GR901.9) Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above, Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage Competitions, Endurance Rides and Vaulting Competitions: (See GR828.4 of the Federation rules). Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4- H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in

English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Dear USEF Participant:

USEF thanks you for participating in this competition and your support of USEF's continuous efforts to provide the safest environment possible for our athletes and other participants. Strategies for safeguarding athletes continue to evolve, and we are fully committed to keeping pace with best practices.

The purpose of this letter is to remind you that you are bound by the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and [Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies](#), also known as the MAAPP. 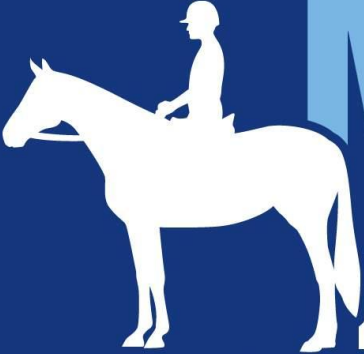
- I. Adoption of the VADA Policy by the Chapters:
 - a. Chapters are to report by October 1st on implementation status, providing specific details on how the policy was adopted by the chapter;
 - b. Chapters are encouraged to share any best practices; implementation strategies, member communications and/or training aids with committee chair to be used as a resource for all chapters – ongoing, as material and resources are developed.
- II. SafeSport Training Program:
 - a. Chapters shall report to the VADA President by March 1 of each year, beginning with 2026, with a list of planned club activities for the coming year and identify those positions in each activity for which SS Training would be required;
 - b. Any additional programs added throughout the year must be reported no later than 14 days before the event, with covered positions identified;
 - c. Each chapter is responsible for keeping documentation of planned activities, covered positions and the people who fill such positions, as well as the date such individuals have completed the required SS Training. A spreadsheet will be developed as a template for the chapters to use to capture this information.
 - d. Each chapter shall initially reimburse any individual who is not a current USEF member who becomes a subscribing member in order to complete SS Training.
 - e. Beginning March 1, 2027 and then by March 1st of every year thereafter each chapter shall submit the following:
 - i. Their documentation for the prior year of held activities, covered positions and the people who filled such positions, as well as the date those individuals completed the training. This information shall be submitted to the VADA Secretary using the spreadsheet developed by VADA and provided to the chapters for this purpose
 - ii. A request for reimbursement for all payments made by the chapter for USEF Subscriber memberships to enable individuals to take SS Training. This request shall be made to the VADA Treasurer no later than March 1. Reimbursement will be made within 30 days.
 - f. In addition to reimbursing the chapters for all payments made for USEF Subscriber memberships to enable individuals to take SS Training, VADA will also compensate each chapter for their efforts related to the above activities as follows:
 - i. For 1-10 payments made by the chapter, \$50
 - ii. For 11 – 20 payments made by the chapter, \$100
 - iii. For 21 – 30 payments made by the chapter, \$150,
 - iv. An additional \$50 for each additional set of up to 10 payments

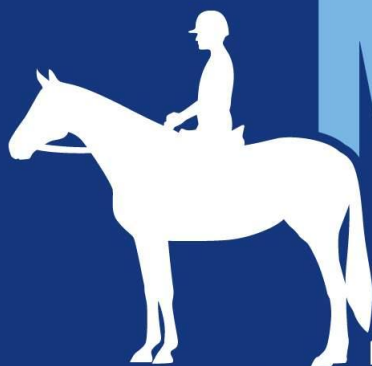

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$100), 5-years (\$400), or life (\$2,000). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$80). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$280) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$55 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$45). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$95. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$140) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.

2026 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2026 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Active or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse Recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s).
A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.
- Horses must be entered in qualifying and championship classes under their official recorded names and ownership as specified in USEF GR1102.3, and transfers of ownership or lease registrations must be completed in compliance with USEF rules GR1105 and GR1108 prior to the competition in order for the horse to compete under the name of the new owner or lessee. (USEF DR127.2)

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Active or Life Membership or Annual Recorded Farm/Business (with Senior Active Competing Farm Owner in good standing)). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.

* PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider.

Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program

The USDF Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program recognizes adult amateurs competing in equitation and promotes correct seat, position, and use of the aids in dressage. An Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class presented by Big Dee's Tack and Vet Supply will be held in conjunction with each of the nine USDF Regional Dressage Championship competitions, providing adult amateurs with additional opportunity for recognition. Ribbons awarded through 8th Place and gift certificates awarded to top four riders.

Adult amateurs wishing to qualify to compete in an Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final may do so by meeting the following requirements.

Qualifying Requirements

To be eligible for the USDF Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class, rider must have

- a) Earned a score of 70% or higher in any dressage seat equitation class (except walk/trot) at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Dressage competition within the qualifying period of the applicable regional championship.
- or*
- b) Qualified to compete in any regional dressage championship class (excluding freestyles).

Membership Requirements

- Rider must have a USDF Participating Membership at the time the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Rider must be an adult amateur, in accordance with GR1306 of the USEF rules, and be designated with USEF as an adult amateur when the score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Owner must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Horse must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.

No Participant nor any participant's parent, guardian, or representative shall have or make any claim against or recover from any equine activity sponsor, equine professional, or any other person for injury, loss, damage, or death of the participant resulting from any of the intrinsic dangers of equine activities. It is further understood that each owner, rider, spectator, and other participants assume any and all risks of loss or injury and agrees to hold harmless, regardless of negligent acts or omissions VADACC, Inc, The Deep Run Hunt Club, USDF, USEF, its instructors, officers, directors, agents, show management, show committee, and all other horse show personnel.

Under Virginia law, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for an injury to or the death of a participant in equine activities resulting exclusively from the inherent risks of equine activities. CODE OF VIRGINIA TITLE 3.1. AGRICULTURE, HORTICULTURE AND FOOD, CHAPTER 27.5. EQUINE ACTIVITY LIABILITY ACT, Va. Code Ann. § 3.1-796.130 (1994)

I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable -casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

If not currently a USEF Active Competing member or Subscriber, I acknowledge that I will be enrolled for no cost as a USEF Fan and my USEF Fan Account will continue to annually automatically renew in USEF's sole discretion. Additionally, I acknowledge that the benefits of a USEF Fan are subject to change without notice. USEF may in its sole discretion, at any time, terminate my USEF Fan status. I acknowledge that I may opt out at any time by going to MyUSEF Dashboard or calling (859) 810-8733.

ATTENTION COMPETITORS –HEADGEAR RULE FOR DRESSAGE

Protective headgear is defined as headgear in compliance with the accepted testing standards published on the Federation's (USEF's) website. Protective headgear must carry the applicable quality testing tag and/or label. See GR801. From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, mounted participants in exhibition classes, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para Dressage tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until the headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear may be the same as or a coordinating color with the coat, and may include contrast coloring, accent, and crystal decoration

MODIFIED DRESS CODE FOR RIDERS IN OPPORTUNITY CLASSES

Riders in classes and tests at all levels in Level 1 Competitions, and riders in Opportunity classes in Level 2 and Level 3 Competitions, may compete wearing breeches and shirts of any color as permitted in DR120.8. Jackets or vests of any type are allowed but not required and neckwear may be worn only if the rider chooses to compete in a riding jacket. Boots and protective headgear are required as specified in DR120.1-6. USEF DR120.5.

ACCORDINGLY, JACKETS ARE NOT REQUIRED FOR ANY RIDERS IN OPPORTUNITY CLASSES AT THE COMPETITION.

USDF Hold-Harmless Clause
