Spring is here! I hope everyone is healthy and happy moving into the second quarter of 2021!

Applying for positions can be very frustrating if you never hear back from the organization. I often discuss this frustration and ask candidates the below question to help get them to the next step in the hiring process.

Q: Are you getting to an initial interview after applying for a position you are interested in?

A: If the answer is **NO** - It is time to go back and review your resume. Your resume may not be explaining your skills and experience to the recruiter or HR manager. Target your resume per position you apply for and make sure the reviewer sees right away you meet all minimum job requirements. I also suggest using industry keywords and proper grammar and spelling.
