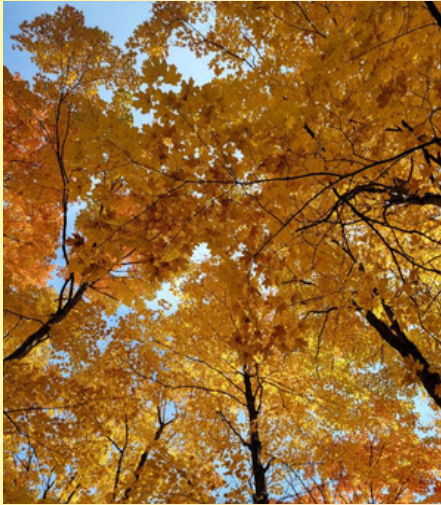

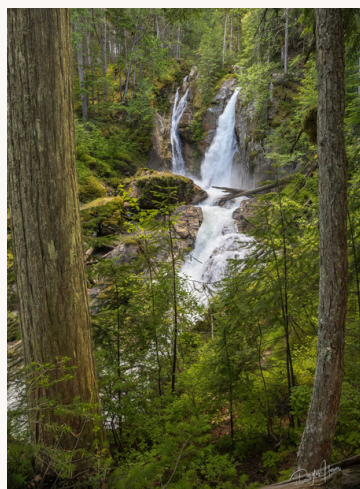

Outing News

September Outing - The first outing of the year will take us on a fall road trip up the Okanagan Connector for a stop at Kentucky-Alleyne Provincial Park. This is a very pretty spot located in rolling grasslands and dry open forests surrounding the sparkling turquoise waters of Kentucky and Alleyne Lakes. We will next travel on to Merritt and drive up Hwy 5A to Nicola Lake. Along the way we will stop at the historic church and graveyard in Nicola, at the Quilchena Hotel, and at Our Lady of Lourdes Church before heading up the Douglas Lake Road. We will travel through the grassland ecosystems of the Douglas Lake Ranch, in their fall splendor, eventually arriving in Westwold, along Hwy 97.

Here are the details for the outing:

Date – Friday, September 27, 2024- Meet up Time – 8 AM at the Village Green Mall, in the SE corner behind the ESSO gas station. Here we will buddy up to minimize the number of vehicles and provide lots of opportunity to visit. We expect that this outing will be a full day – we should be back into Vernon by approximately 4:30 PM.

What to Bring – As we will be experiencing fall weather and we will be travelling through large elevational changes, ensure that you have appropriate clothing – layering would be a good choice. We will be doing some walking so good footwear is also recommended. The church and graveyard at Nicola are covered in Prickly Pear Cactus and participants should be aware of this when walking about. Restaurants are not located in convenient spots along the route so it is recommended that you bring a packed lunch although we will be stopping near General Stores at Quilchena and at the Douglas Lake Ranch. Be sure to bring extra, charged batteries for your camera. As for lenses to bring along, most of the shots will be landscape or building photography but there may also be situations where a long lens would be advantageous (perhaps the Black Bear and her cub that we saw a couple of weeks ago will still be around). It also never hurts to throw in your tripod. – you may want to do some bracketing or focus stacking. We hope that you will be able to make it on this outing! October Outings – October features a bonus outing! The first October outing will be to the Armstrong Demolition Derby to capture a bunch of vehicles being destroyed. - Check that your pixel dimensions are right (check our website for help) and the size is less than 1.8Mb
- Name your file as follows: TITLE - NAME - THEME

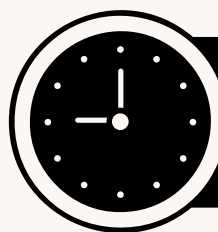
