Insurance Tip

Check with your insurance company to see if your camera gear is covered on your homeowner policy, for theft, loss or breakage (with deductibles). Many policies allow these as long as it is only used for personal purposes. Amateurs who sell the occasional image could be denied a claim. Further, even if you never sell an image but just have prices on your website (or on a picture in a gallery?), your claim could be disallowed. You may need separate coverage as a commercial entity.

The moral of the story is to do your due diligence if you have gear of significant value.

What is CAPA?

VPC is and has been a member in good standing of CAPA since 1988

The Canadian Association for Photographic Art

CAPA is a national association and consists of clubs and individual members interested in the art and science of photography. As a member of CAPA, VPC works on the principle of promoting the art of photography and provides opportunities for members to learn and develop their photographic skills and as an outlet for their artistic expression.

VPC always encourages members to submit images for CAPA competitions either as individuals (if you get a membership) or as part of the club (you do not need to be a member for this). Many of the members of VPC are also individual members of CAPA.

CAPA has monthly newsletters on their website going back to September 2017 if you are interested. The link can be found on our new website launching this week on the links page.

CAPA Competitions

CAPA "Club" competition entries, must be submitted to the Vernon CAPA representative by the deadline date for that specific competition as noted in our club newsletter and calendar. The entry committee selects the images to be submitted for club entries.

Borders may or may not be allowed for CAPA submissions. Please read the guidelines for the competition carefully.

Sizing requirements for CAPA and VPC are the same, based on the CAPA Guidelines. You may find and download the explanation of sizing and naming from our new club website launching this week on the Links page.

EXIF camera data is now required as part of our picture files to help CAPA determine whether AI has been used to produce the image.

CAPA Competition Guidelines

As a member of CAPA, members of the Vernon Photography Club (VPC) can participate in CAPA national competitions for clubs. VPC Club entries are limited to a total of up to six images altogether from up to six different club members. Coordination and submission of images to CAPA is done by the VPC CAPA representative. Eligibility Criteria: Prior to submitting any photo in a CAPA competition, all entrants must first read the CAPA Eligibility Criteria relating to images submissions and comply with the conditions. The CAPA Criteria can be found on our club website links page.

Important Notes on CAPA competitions:

Each club member may submit up to a maximum of two images for consideration in each club competition.


Individual CAPA members may also submit directly to the competitions.

A few other reminders before you send in your pictures:

- -CAPA requires the unmodified EXIF data (camera and image details). Some editors erase it, so check that it is there.
- -CAPA won't accept images that have received awards previously.
- -Keep your original unaltered image file in case CAPA asks for it.
- -Check that your pixel dimensions are right (check our website for help) and the size is less than 1.8Mb

If you have any questions, email any time and we'll sort it out.



Meet Some Fellow Members




Meet John Gallant
