The eternal God is your refuge, and underneath are the everlasting arms.

Deuteronomy 33:27

I can only imagine the life experiences that led to the writing of this hymn. There must have been self-reflection and community and world situations that brought authors Anthony Showalter and Elisha Hoffman to write and add a tune to this song. Showalter said that Deuteronomy 33:27 came to him as he was writing letters of consolation to two former students whose wives had died.

Today these words can bring a sense of comfort to us as well as a reminder to the reality of our dependence upon God. A reminder as we have so many unanswered questions as we received the devastating and tragic news of mass shootings. Words that can encourage us in the midst of our fears and the challenges of these times. The words perhaps brought comfort to those former students of Showalter. Today may we embrace them for our journey that is sometimes filled with grief and pain. Let us remain prayerful for God's love to fill our hearts in such a way that we become the vessels we are called to be. I ask that we remain in prayer for our faith walk as Christians and as United Methodists. I mention in the report of the cabinet these words:

"We continue in a season of waiting. This is frustrating in many

LAY SERVANT MINISTRIES SPRING SCHOOL

The Spring 2022 Lay Servant Ministry School was held at St. Mark UMC, Greenwood, on April 24 and May 1. This was the first in-person school since 2019. Two classes were cancelled due to low registration; however, two advanced classes were well-attended.

Many people do not realize that Lay Servant Ministry classes are available to anyone who is interested in knowing more about the United Methodist Church and how to be a more engaged lay person, or to be equipped as local church leaders.

Each district in the SC Conference has its own Lay Servant Ministry Team that plans and oversees the two Lay Servant Ministry Schools per year. However, anyone in any district can take a class offered in another district. The only requirement is that everyone must take the Basic class which is a pre-requisite for most other classes.

Announcements about upcoming schools and the courses to be offered are always sent to current lay servants, lay speakers, certified lay ministers, and all pastors. The same information is always available on the Conference Lay Ministry webpage, the Greenwood District web page (www.umcsc.org/greenwood), the District Facebook page, and other District social media outlets.

Whatever the reason for taking a class, new friendships are made and participants find that learning is really fun.

Rev. Darlene Kelley, pastor of the Mt. Pleasant/O'Neal St. Charge, issued a challenge to hold a Summer Food Drive. Yes, food drives are not just for Thanksgiving and Christmas! Many of our neighbors live in a constant food desert and it is our responsibility as followers of Jesus to care for them

The District has accepted the challenge as our Summer Mission Project. Everyone individual families, Sunday School classes, UMW circles, UMM groups, youth groups are all encouraged to participate.

Staples such as peanut butter, canned soups and vegetables, cereal, canned meats, bottled juices, shelf-stable milk are always needed. Personal items are also needed, such as feminine products, diapers, soap, shampoo, lotion, toothpaste.

Kelley says, "You can make a difference! You can make the world a little better, a little healthier, and a little happier, especially for the elderly and for children."

Our Summer Food Drive Challenge kicks off on June 19 and continues through July 17. Please keep a tally of the amount of food collected and send that information to the district office by July 20. Let us know the name of the food pantry/food bank that received your contributions.

Ways to tally your collections:

- Number of pounds; or
- Tally of individual items. Ex: 100 cans of vegetables; 125 cans of soup; 10 5lb. bags of sugar, etc.

LAY SERVANT MINISTRIES COMING TO YOUR CHURCH?

The Greenwood District Lay Servant Ministries (LSM) would like to bring LSM classes to your church beginning with the Basic class, which is an overview of Lay Servant Ministries and a pre-requisite for the Advanced Lay Servant classes. Other classes will be made available.

To get credit for any class requires a total of 10 contact hours. The pastor and the instructor can decide on the dates and times for each course offered. The church may also request to offer a specific course.

To offer any course requires a minimum of 5 people to attend. Any course offered will cost \$20.00 per person. Books are to be purchased by the participants. Registration scholarships are available.

If the church decides to provide a meal, that cost is separate from the \$20 cost of the course.

Anyone can attend these classes. Participants do not have to become a Local or Certified Lay Speaker.

Churches are encouraged to partner with each other in offering one or more courses which will make for a more meaningful experience for all participants.

Juneteenth became a federal holiday on June 17, 2021, when President Biden signed it into law. Prior to that June 19 was celebrated unofficially by states, groups, and individual citizens.

On June 19, 1865, Union army troops arrived in Galveston, TX, and freed approximately 250,000 enslaved people. This was two and one-half years after the Emancipation Proclamation. Juneteenth marks the end to slavery in the U.S. and is considered be the longest-running African-American holiday. Slavery was formally abolished in December 1865 with the adoption of the Thirteenth Amendment.

We celebrate this day with all our brothers and sisters.
