Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' The second is this: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no commandment greater than these.

Mark 12:30-31 (NIV)

There is a content creator on social media who regularly posts videos about her day and after she shares she always reminds folks to be kind. A reminder that, A little bit of kindness can turn a person's bad day into a good day. Or a bad day into a tolerable day.

As I pondered on one of her videos the other day, I was reminded that yes kindness is good. Kindness and a smile can go a long way. Showing kindness by saying simple hello or opening the door for someone are simple ways to show caring, concern and love for others.

In Mark 12:28-34, we find a profound exchange between Jesus and a teacher of the law. The teacher, impressed by Jesus' wisdom in handling the debates of the Pharisees and Sadducees, asks Him a crucial question: "Of all the commandments, which is the most important?" Jesus responds with what is known as the greatest commandment - to love God with all our being and to love our neighbor as ourselves.

Jesus cuts to the heart of the matter, emphasizing the primacy of love in the life of a believer. Our relationship with God and with others hinges on love. Love is not merely an emotion but a choice, an action, a commitment. It requires the totality of our being - our heart, soul, mind, and strength. When we love God wholeheartedly, we align our desires, thoughts, and efforts with His will. This love is demonstrated in our worship, obedience, and devotion to Him.

The teacher of the law recognizes the profound truth in Jesus' words, acknowledging that loving God and loving others surpasses all religious rituals and sacrifices. Jesus affirms his response commending him for his understanding and telling him that he is not far from the kingdom of God.

There is much going on in our present time, and I sometimes wonder where the love has gone. I wonder what has happened to kindness. What has happened to care and concern for our fellow human.

I know there are many that are showing love to others. I know there are many who are loving their neighbors as themselves. But often, it is overshadowed by divisiveness and evil in the world.

I have seen the pain in the eyes of many.

But yet I read these words, love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength. AND... love your neighbor as yourself.

I pray that we all show kindness. I pray that we all show love to God and to neighbor.

May we all examine our own lives. Are we living out the greatest commandment with sincerity and obedience? Are we loving God wholeheartedly and loving our neighbors sacrificially? May we be inspired by Jesus' words to prioritize love in all our relationships, knowing that in doing so, we draw nearer to the kingdom of God.
