What Does It Mean to Be Holy?

Holiness comes from a Greek term meaning "sacred" or "set apart." It involves being distinct from the ordinary, morally pure, and dedicated to God. As believers, we're called to manifest virtues like righteousness and purity while committing to God's standards rather than worldly ones.

How Can We Prepare Our Minds for Holy Living?

Scripture tells us to "gird up the loins of our mind" - meaning we must be mentally prepared and focused. This requires:

- Being sober and clear-headed
- Maintaining self-control
- Avoiding distractions
- Living with purpose and intention
- Exercising spiritual self-restraint

What Behaviors Should We Leave Behind?

As God's children, we must put away "former lusts" including:

- Sexual immorality
- Substance abuse
- Gossip and slander
- Dishonesty and greed
- Idolatry
- Anger and bitterness
- Inappropriate entertainment
- Pride and arrogance
- Conformity to secular values

What Does Holy Conduct Look Like? True holiness is demonstrated through:

- Separation from sin
- Pure thoughts and actions
- Righteousness and integrity
- Genuine love for others
- Obedience to God's commands
- Ongoing transformation
- Joy regardless of circumstances
- Reverence for God
- Inner peace
- Kindness and gentleness
- Self-control

Life Application

This week, focus on living intentionally as God's holy representative. Ask yourself:

Are my daily choices reflecting God's character?

What worldly influences do I need to remove from my life?

How can I better demonstrate holy conduct in my relationships?

Am I maintaining spiritual disciplines like prayer and Bible study?
