UNDER COVER AGENT CREATED THE 1804 SILVER DOLLAR

The son of a Royal Navy Captain was born in Portsmouth New Hampshire on the 29th of June 1784. Edmund Roberts Jr. traveled to England at 16 and returned to Portsmouth after 8 years where he became a Merchant Shipowner and Supercargo (superintendent of cargo) involved in the lucrative New England Triangle of Trade. Throughout history countless sailors have died at an early age due to the dreaded Dysentery and just 19 days prior to his 52nd birthday, this would be the fate of "Special Agent" Edmund Roberts, but not before he gave away some of America's rarest coins to foreign rulers and incused his mark in the numismatic world that nobody knows about!

Marrying into a prominent family and having influential friends kept his trading vessels afloat after surviving The War of 1812, the 2nd Barbary Pirate War, as well as French and Spanish Privateers where he had suffered significant financial loss. Roberts was offered audience to the Sultan of Muscat/Oman in 1828 while on one of his trade excursions where he was asked to escort some of the Sultan's vessels back to America to petition for trade to counterbalance the British influence.

Upon return Edmund wrote a letter to his personal friend U.S. Senator Levi Woodbury enlightening him on the aggravations endured by American Shipping, that could be alleviated by negotiating commercial treaties. In 1831 Woodbury was appointed Secretary of the Navy by Andrew Jackson, and seeing an opportunity to capitalize on his good friend's idea, Edmund Roberts was appointed "Special Agent" by the Secretary of State and signed off as such on the 27th of January 1832.



He then reported to The U.S.S. Peacock under the guise of "Captain's Clerk" on the Ship's Station Bill. Only he and the captain of the vessel knew of his True Mission, as well as The President. All others were on a "Need to Know" basis. Roberts Mission, that he chose to accept... without the disavow aspect, was to infiltrate and gain specific and precise knowledge of the nature and character of

different Asian governments and to establish trade treaties. Special Agent Edmund Roberts Jr. was America's First Envoy to the Far East.

After his first year as "Special Agent Roberts," he felt the gifts he was given by U.S. Officials to present to the foreign rulers were cheap, and gaudy. Not fearing it would "blow his cover", he was just embarrassed to present them. Edmund, once again, took feathered quill in hand and wrote a letter suggesting better gifts, coins specifically. This letter made it all the way to President Andrew Jackson's desk, where he agreed and stated in part, "Duplicate specimens of each kind now in use whether Gold, Silver, or Copper." Now this request somewhat confused mint officials. It was problematic for 2 denominations of coins. The Silver Dollar and the 10 Dollar Gold Eagle because neither of these coins had been produced in about 30 years. As Irony would have it, in an effort NOT to create an instant rarity by striking a Silver Dollar or Ten Dollar Gold Eagle dated incorrectly, Mint Director Samuel Moore searched through their archives to ascertain the last time these coins were struck. The Mint's records, and The Red Book, bear witness to 19,570 1804 Draped Bust Silver Dollars struck, as well as 3,757 1804 Ten Dollar Gold Eagles. What the mint's records don't show, but any edition of The Red Book does show in the last paragraph of the 1804 Dollar heading, is the probable fact that while 19,570 Draped Bust Silver Dollars were indeed struck that year, 1804, they were most likely dated 1803

due to slack mint procedures and the dies were still usable for that final year.

So, beginning in 1834 the mint produced four coin sets to be given as Envoy Gifts. There are three Classes of 1804 Silver Dollars. Eight Class I 1804 Silver Dollars were produced in 1834 & 1835. On the Reverse there will be a narrow gap between the lettering STATES and OF. Class II were produced in 1858 & 1859, having a noticeably wider gap between STATES and OF on Reverse with a plain edge. Class III were produced through the 1860's. The dies were destroyed in 1869 and sales of this Class III coin continued through the 1870's. These Class III coins maintain the wider gap on Reverse between STATES and OF, while including the lettered edge. In regard to the 1804 Capped Bust or Turban Head Ten Dollar Gold Coin, apparently there was only four produced, one for each 1834/5 sets, and can be identified by the PLAIN 4 designation, no Crosslet at the end of 4, and they were proofed.

It has been recorded by Official U. S. State Department Records, on the 1st of October 1835, Special Agent Edmund Roberts presented Sayyid Bin Sultan Al-Busaidi, Sultan of Muscat and Oman,



with the Envoy Gift Set of Coins making him the very first person to possess the coveted 1804 Silver Dollar. In April of 1836 King Rama III of Siam Received his set. Two months later Special Agent Roberts met his fate in Macau, and the remaining two sets of Envoy Gift Coin Sets were returned to the U.S. Mint.

Interesting side note and lesser known fact about the Siam coin set. Today Siam is known as Thailand. The 1944 Novel "Anna and The King of Siam" as well as the 1946 film starring Rex Harrison and the 1956 musical starring Yul Brenner, "The King & I" are all banned in Thailand. Being no stranger to smuggling practices, having traveled to Thailand, and seeing it as a "challenge" when I was a younger man, I have smuggled in copies of all three versions to friends in Thailand. The story

is set in the 1860's and the real life account, including embellishments, of school teacher/governess Anna Leonowens instructing King Rama IV's children. It's really a love story, and it's not hard to speculate how Anna had come into possession of the Siam coin set, because her descendants sold it to a London Coin Dealer in the late 1950's, and on November 1, 2005 the President of Rare Coin Wholesalers of Dana Point California, Steven L. Contursi purchased the set for 8.5 million dollars!

This article was inspired by a lecture given by Dr. Jesse Kraft on the American Numismatic Society Youtube channel titled "The 1804 Silver Dollar" where more interesting history through to today can be seen concerning the 1804 Silver Dollar.
