West Point Time Capsule

A time capsule, nearly 200 years old, was opened on the grounds of the United States Military Academy, at Thayer Hall, West Point, New York on Monday, 28 August 2023.

The time capsule was discovered back in May of this year when engineers and public works officials were renovating the statue of Thaddeus Kosciuszko, a Polish-born general who helped fortify the academy during the American Revolution.

Following its discovery, administrators and students built much hype around the box. A panel of historians was invited to speculate on its contents, but they did not get a chance to do so.

"The box didn't quite meet expectations," Paul Hudson, West Point's archaeologist, said to the crowd as he removed shards of fragmented sediment from the box during its opening. While disappointed, the experts on stage said they would sift through the contents to see whether there was anything of historical interest caked to the bottom.

"We don't want to think that they went to all the trouble to put this box in the monument and not put anything in it," Hudson added.

The 194-year-old time capsule that was opened and originally believed to contain only silt, produced a handful of historical artifacts, the Academy said on Wednesday, 30 August 2023.

After analysis, the academy said that it found five coins of varying worth and ages from the 1800s. A sixth coin, a 5-cent piece, was from 1795; and a nearly two-inch Erie Canal commemorative medal from 1826 emerged from the crusty, gray box as well.



The complete list of items removed from the box were:

- A Liberty dollar coin from 1800
- A 50-cent coin from 1828
- A 25-cent coin from 1818
- A 10-cent coin from 1827
- A 5-cent coin from 1795
- A 1-cent coin from 1827
- An <u>Erie Canal commemorative medal</u> from 1826

"This is an incredible story that involves so many of West Point's heroes, and many of them are the Army's and our nation's heroes," West Point's dean, Brigadier General. Shane Reeves, said at the event.

"We should reflect upon and be inspired by our history to pause and realize we have the immense honor and responsibility to continue the legacy that Kosciuszko started, and that West Point continues to live up to his vision from so long ago," Reeves added.

POSTSCRIPT: Who knows what historical luminaries may have handled these coins before they made their way to West Point in 1829? Robert E. Lee graduated from West Point in 1829 and may have had a hand in the placement of both the time capsule and the coins in the Kosciuszko statue. George Washington was president in 1795 when the 5-cent coin was minted in Philadelphia, which was also the nation's capital at the time. Makes you wonder.

WHO WAS ANDRZEJ TADEUSZ BONAWENTURA KOSCIUSZKO?

Kosciuszko (KaaZee-uh-skow) is

woven into our American History and stood with our Founding Fathers, yet, many do not know who he was or what he did. I didn't, until I asked myself that question.

Born February 1746 in the Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth, now known as Belarus, Kosciuszko was a Polish Military Engineer, Leader and Statesman that became a National Hero to Poland. There are 3 Statues/Memorials dedicated to him in Poland and a Polish Military Base bearing his name where the U.S. has deployed Troops stationed there right now. Here in America Kosciuszko has 6 memorials. The statue in the Boston Public Gardens depicts him holding the architectural plans for West Point. At West Point there is a portrait of Thomas Jefferson and a statue, in both Jefferson wears a fur jacket that was given to him by Kosciuszko. He wrote many times to Jefferson advocating for a Military Academy for Military Officers, and in the early onset of West Point Kosciuszko was known as "The Father of The Academy".

On August 30th 1776 he submitted an application to The 2nd Continental Congress and was assigned to the Continental Army as a Colonel the next day. Throughout The Revolutionary War Kosciuszko carried a sword that was inscribed "DO NOT DRAW ME WITHOUT REASON AND DO NOT

SHEATH ME WITHOUT HONOR". He served in many battles as well as designing and overseeing construction of numerous state-of-the-art fortifications most notably West Point. He was appointed Engineer In Charge of West Point Fortifications by General George Washington in 1778 and promoted to Brigadier General in 1783. On March 16th 1802 West Point was Founded and America's First College of Engineering. Kosciuszko died in 1817 and in 1828 his monument at West Point was completed, however, it was unclear whether or not it was recorded or documented that a time capsule was placed inside the monuments base!

In 2021 a West Point Cadet, Eric Kramer, was at the Kosciuszko monument and noticed some structural cracks in the base and brought it to the attention of the appropriate personnel. Military Engineering Students and Faculty snapped into action

and within 2 years, May 2023, "discovered" the one cubic foot lead box time capsule! With Military precision a ceremony was scheduled on 28 August 2023 for a live unveiling of



the time capsule's contents at Thayer Hall in the Robinson Auditorium.

Some Faculty considered inviting Jerry Rivers, AKA Geraldo Rivera, thinking this unveiling might reminisce the 1986 debacle that left millions completely disregarding Jerry ever since, but they decided to let Jerry stay home. Initially a lot of silt was found due to damage to the box over 195 years buried in the monument's base. Within a few days all the items were forensically removed and on August 30 the announcement of 6 U.S. minted coins, an Erie Canal

Commemorative Medal and some archival documents were found. The coins were one of each denomination. I estimated an approximate value of \$5K using the Red Book, but grading is paramount and I'm a mere novice. The coins were covered in silt/dirt and the photos aren't terrible. - 1800 Liberty Dollar Normal dies
- 1828 Half Dollar Curl Base, No Knob 2, Large Letters
- 1818 Quarter -Capped Bust, Normal Date
- 1827 Dime Pointed Top
- 1795 Half Dime Flowing Hair
- 1827 One Cent Medium Letters?!

I did recently acquire a new vision prescription, however I still needed to use binoculars to get a good look at these coins. The reverse of the 1827 One Cent looked to me as if the 2nd "S" in STATES is directly above the "N" in ONE depicting the MEDIUM LETTERS noted in the Red Book as only being minted from 1829-1837.

I'm not sure if I'm seeing something or not. A more qualified and educated pair of eyes could explain more, maybe even contact the West Point Archival Team. Take a look at these coins, enjoy the history, and remember the individuals that helped to create our Nation.
