TOPIC 1: INTRODUCTION

If you are interested in business ownership and management as a career, this project is for you.

TEAM CONCEPT: S-BET

A Student Based Enterprise Team (S-BET) is 4 interns who collaborate to create 4 youth enterprises.

FOUR WEEK PROJECT SUMMARY

A student-based enterprise (SBE) is a for-profit corporation created, formed, owned and managed by high school and college students, hired as student entrepreneur interns for the 4-week period below.

Each day, work hours are divided into work sessions. There are 6 to 10 work sessions each day. Session attendance is required for work time credit. This requires you to be present on video to begin each session. Session time ends with, and includes a break. Each intern will be paid by the hour at a rate and on such dates as agreed between the intern and BYI.

PROJECT PURPOSE

This project creates 4 student-based enterprises. A student-based enterprise is a business with capital resources that is owned, led, and managed by student interns. It markets and sells, for a profit, products and services that meet human needs in the highly competitive global marketplace.

Step 1: Review this Handbook: Then, decide to register.

Step 2: Advance Registration: Advance registration is required, using form at website.

Step 3: Zoom Registration Personal Interview: Upon submittal of registration form the intern will be directed to a website page to schedule a zoom registration interview.



TOPIC 2: DAILY 6-HOUR ZOOM MEETINGS

For Covid 19 safety, all work will be performed in zoom meetings. On the Saturdays prior to each of 4 work weeks, you will receive via email 5 meeting invitations (1 for each day of the upcoming week).

Task Sessions: Each zoom meeting is broken down into short task sessions. These sessions specify tasks that you and the remaining interns are invited to perform.

<u>Action Items</u>: Each task session contains action items that specify what you are being invited to do, using your talents and abilities.

Break Periods: After each session there is a 5 – 15 minute break. During each break you must leave the meeting to complete score cards.

These are your opportunities to practice specific skills from the two skill lists below to accomplish the task assigned. You will be evaluated based on a skills rubric. 


Should more than 4 eligible youth register to participate before you, you will become an alternate. As an alternate, you will be offered one of the four positions should a participating intern discontinue for any reason. You will assume the position of the discontinued intern. You will begin to acquire points starting with the first session you attend. And you will be eligible for daily awards, and project awards. The points accumulated by the discontinued intern will be assigned to you.



TOPIC 7: STUDENT-BASED ENTRPRISE

You will form, own, structure and become a student executive of your own student-based enterprise. Also, you will become a board member of other student-based enterprises. A student-based enterprise is a business with capital resources that is owned, led and managed by student interns. It markets and sells, for a profit, products and services that meet human needs in the highly competitive global marketplace.

Topic 10: THE 4 MODULES

Module 1: Enterprise Creation Challenge – Week 1

Your challenge this week is to create your business enterprise. Daily goals are realized via task sessions that produce points that measure how well you complete each task assigned. Four award certificates are issued to start each day, based on points awarded by the 3 judging interns and one mystery judge using score cards. Points accumulate from day to day, and are posted to your profile. Monday (Enterprise Creation Day), Tuesday (Executive Role Play 1), Wednesday (Executive Role Play 2), Thursday (Executive Role Play 4).

Module 2: Enterprise Prototype Challenge – Week 2

Your challenge this week is to develop your business prototype (your untested business model). A business model is the design of how your business will operate. A prototype is an untested model. Daily goals are realized via task sessions that produce points that measure how well you complete each task assigned. Four award certificates are issued to start each day. Points accumulate from day to day, and are posted to your profile. Guest business owner presenters are included. Monday (Business Model Canvas Exploration 1), Tuesday (Business Model Canvas Exploration 2), Wednesday (Business Model Design 1), Thursday (Business Model Design 2, Friday (Business Model Design 3).

Module 3: Fish Tank Challenge – Week 3

Your challenge this week is to obtain seed capital for your prototype. Daily task sessions produce points based on your "pitch card" performance and investor commitments obtained. You are given "play" money to invest in your prototype and other prototypes. Daily goals are realized via task sessions that produce points that measure how well you complete each task assigned. Four award certificates are issued to start each day. Points accumulate from day to day, and are posted to your profile. Guest business owner presenters are included. Monday (Understanding Finance Terms), Tuesday (Seed Capital Strategy Day), Wednesday (Note Creation Day), Thursday (Pitch Deck Creation Day, Friday (Pitch Deck Pitch Day)

Module 4: Enterprise Activation Challenge – Week 4

Your challenge this week is to test certain components of your untested business model prototype in the marketplace. Daily task sessions produce points based on the results you produce. Award certificates are issued to start each day. Points are posted to your profile. Four project enterprise awards will be presented. Monday (Board of Directors Day), Tuesday (Strategy Development Day), Wednesday (Prototype Test Day 1), Thursday (Prototype Test Day 2), Friday (Prototype Test Day 3 and Project Awards).
