STUDENT DOCUMENTARY HIGHLIGHTING BLACK WOMEN IN THE UNIVERSITY OF SOUTH CAROLINA'S HISTORY TO DEBUT IN MARCH

COLUMBIA, S.C. — In recognition of Women's History Month, former University of South Carolina Student Body Vice-President Hannah White is officially releasing "The Backbone", a feature-length documentary chronicling the perspectives and experiences of Black women at the University of South Carolina since its desegregation in 1963.

"The Backbone" features over 20 outstanding Black women alumnae in the University's history including:

- Dr. Henrie Monteith Treadwell '65 First Black student to graduate from UofSC since 1877
- Gail Bush Diggs '77 Second Black woman to be Homecoming Queen at UofSC
- Jotaka Eaddy '01 First Black woman to be Student Body President
- Yvonne Miller '05 First Black woman to serve as Student Body Vice-President
- Markeshia Grant '12 Former Gamecock Women's Basketball Player
- Karli Wells '16 2020 Vision Protest Activist

The film began as White's senior Honor Thesis project and expanded into a much more complex film, prompting her to form a team that includes South Carolina Gamecock Women's Basketball Production Manager Kendric Lindsey as the film's Producer & Editor and UofSC alumna Lyric Swinton as Production Manager.

"Through this film, I wanted to ensure that people never forget the role that Black women have played in making the University of South Carolina what it is today," said White. "This documentary is dedicated to all of the Black women who have made the University of South Carolina what it is today. Although we were only able to highlight a few of many stories from Black women in UofSC's history, we acknowledge and honor the contributions of ALL Black women to our campus. Whether you were affiliated with the University as a student, professor, administrator, custodian, food service worker, groundskeeper, etc., thank you for being the backbone."
