Huron Perth Catholic District School Board is hosting a **Grade 7 and 8 Skilled Trades Experience** event at the Stratford Recreational Complex from **April 22nd to April 25th from 9:30 a.m. to 2:15 p.m.**

The goal of this event is to expose young students to the various skilled trades opportunities available to them as they begin considering potential career pathways.

Unfortunately, many students do not receive enough exposure to skilled trades during their elementary education. This event could be a pivotal moment for students to recognize a potential career pathway and focus more on their secondary education to align with that profession.

I am reaching out to see if your company would be interested in participating in this experience. If you are interested, we would be grateful if an employee from your company could attend this one day event and help guide students through a hands-on learning experience specific to your trade.

I will provide all necessary materials for the activity as well as a secondary student that will assist you for the day. The employee would work with the students on a small project, allowing them to share insights and skills from your industry. Small groups of students will rotate to different stations throughout the day that highlight different trades at each stop. Each rotation will be approximately 20 minutes long.

Grand Trunk Renewal Project – Project Co-Ordinator

The Grand Trunk Renewal project is a transformative project outlined in the 2018 Master Plan prepared by Urban Strategies for the City of Stratford. Focused on preserving the existing building, the Plan envisions a phased reinvestment approach, adaptively reusing the existing historical structure and surrounding area for new uses. The project's next steps involve collaboration with non-profit and for-profit partners to explore potential uses and design options. The site's development aims to bring a range of benefits to the city, encompassing residential, recreational, educational, institutional, community, commercial, and cultural uses and a fiscally sustainable reinvestment model.

This position works within the investStratford team and reports to the CEO of investStratford. The incumbent's primary working relationships will be with the CEO of investStratford, the Strategic Initiatives Lead of the City of Stratford and various external consulting groups and resources. The individual will liaise with the Chair(s) and Members of the Grand Truck Ad-Hoc Committee on a frequent basis.

This is a full-time (35 hours/week), project-based, contract position to start on/around April 14, 2025, for one year, with an option to extend should the project require. The annual compensation ranges from \$60,000 to \$65,000 per year, depending upon experience. This is a hybrid-work position and flexibility will be required including nights and weekends as needed.

investStratford has received special project funding for this role from the City of Stratford.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Project Co-ordination

- Support the CEO (investStratford) and Strategic Initiatives Lead (City) in coordinating all project components
 involving stakeholders, external consultants and experts, project teams and the Ad Hoc Committee.
- Support local community relationships and community engagements
- Maintain accurate records of project activities, decisions, and progress and maintain the client relationship management software (CRM) for the project
 Draft and distribute communications such as newsletters, project updates, and press releases and act as the primary point of contact for internal and external stakeholders regarding project updates and inquiries

Site-Related Activities

- · Schedule and coordinate site visits for stakeholders, project teams, and community members
- Prepare and distribute site visit agendas, materials, and safety guidelines, including Personal Protective Equipment and liability documentation
- Accompany the volunteers for on site visits to provide logistical support and documentation
- Support site activations for stakeholders and community groups/members

Ad-Hoc Committee Meetings

- Schedule, organize and attend committee meetings (monthly), including securing venues, sending invitations,
- and preparing meeting materials
 Provide support and track follow-up from committee meetings to ensure timely response and completion of items and facilitate smooth information flow between project teams, committees, and leadership
 Work collaboratively with committee members to ensure alignment and progress to the City of Stratford Ad-Hoc Committee By-laws and meeting procedures.
