The philosophy at Mililani Presbyterian Preschool is designed to help develop positive self-concept, enhance creativity, and enrich each child's life socially, intellectually, spiritually, and emotionally.

At MPP we provide an atmosphere of acceptance in which the individual needs of each child are considered and in which the child can flourish and grow under the guidance of qualified staff.

Our program is based on the belief that parents are the first teachers. We help them to nurture a child's social/emotional, physical, spiritual and cognitive development by basing all procedures and decisions on developmentally appropriate practices, and individually identified strengths.

Our approach to learning recognizes the tremendous capacity and desire of young children to discover and explore the environment of their immediate world enabling them to convert their natural curiosity into a process for learning.
