

COUNCIL NEWS

Summary of Congregation Council Minutes – October 14, 2025

(The full minutes are posted on the bulletin board near the church office.)

Pastor's Report: Pastor Barb informed the Council that Confirmation is going well.

Membership Update: Kristi Montgomery shared the Statistical Report for September. Total weekend attendance YTD is 5,478. The average weekend worship attendance YTD is 137.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer, Deb Vath, reported that giving is 10% off YTD pledges. Concerning expenses, Deb explained that the Pastor Salary expense is below budget because our Pastors have been working only part-time.

She also informed the Council that another quarterly payment of approximately \$7,400 will be made to Zion Childcare on our loan for the Portico/Canopy. Linda Dutchess moved to accept the Treasurer's Report with Patti Lauritzen seconding the motion. All ayes.

Old Business:

Call Committee Report: Currently, there is no candidate to be interviewed.

"Caring for Our Community" Support: It was reported to the Council by Deb Willwerth that there has been a great response in the request for volunteers. The ministry is continuing to identify individuals that may welcome the support.

Technology Committee: Erin Montgomery has not received any inquiries about serving on this committee. Deb Vath has volunteered to work with Erin.

Nominating Committee: Kristi Montgomery has been recruiting volunteers to serve on the committee.

Stewardship Committee: Linda Dutchess shared with the Council that a response date for the pledge cards to be returned needs to be decided. November 15th and 16th was discussed by the Council as a return date. The letters and cards will be mailed.

New Business:

B & G Request - Funds for Lawn Mower / Snow Blower: Building and Grounds would like to purchase a new snow blower/lawn mower unit. The estimated cost is \$7,000. The old snow blower/lawn mower snow broom attachment was sold for \$800. The committee has \$2,000 from a 2025 Greatest Needs grant leaving approximately \$4,700 left to be funded. Deb Vath made a motion for the Council to approve the purchase of a snow blower/lawn mower with the additional funding to come from the Building Repair/Improvement Balance line in Special Funds. The funding from the Building Repair/Improvement Balance.is not to exceed \$5,000. The motion was seconded by Patti Lauritzen. All ayes. There was also a discussion on the need for a new computer to run the HVAC system. Dennis Schoening has sent the specs that a new computer must meet in order run the system successfully. More discussion with Dennis will be
