
New Zion Library Books for December 2024



The Paris Library is a novel by Janet Skeslien Charles that starts with Odile, a young woman who works at the American Library in Paris in 1939. When the Nazi's occupy Paris, Odile and her fellow librarians join the Resistance with the best weapons they have: books. The novel continues in 1983 with Lily, a teenager who is intrigued by the air of mystery about her elderly, solitary neighbor from Paris. The two of them share a love of language and books, never suspecting that a dark secret connects them too. Donated by Linda Smith.

New on our shelves are two books that describe "remarkable events that shaped history": *It Happened on the Oregon Trail* by Tricia Martineau Wagner and *It Happened on the Lewis and Clark Expedition* by Erin H. Turner.

Signs and Wonders: A Beginner's Guide to the Miracles of Jesus by Amy-Jill Levine recounts the most prominent miracle stories in the Gospels and asks the questions "what does it mean?" and "so what?" COUNCIL NEWS

Summary of Congregation Council Minutes - October 8, 2024

(The full minutes are posted on the bulletin board near the church office.)

Pastor's Report: Council reviewed Pastor Julie's monthly report printed in the Council packet.

Membership Update: Travis Morehead shared the Statistical Report for September. The average attendance of In-Person worship for September was 148 per week. YTD, the total In-Person attendance is 5,797 and the average weekend worship attendance YTD is 145. Congregational Membership as of month end September is 566 Baptized Members and 471 Confirmed Members.

Treasurer's Report: Deb reported that as of September month end, giving in Pledged envelopes and Unpledged envelopes is at 84% of pledged giving. Expenses were reviewed and YTD Income vs Expenses is (\$22,667). Deb gave a review of all funds. A motion was made by Linda Dutchess to approve the Treasurer's Report. Laurie Behrens seconded the motion. All ayes.

Old Business:

Portico/Canopy Update: It was reported to the Council that all work has been completed on the Portico/Canopy project and we are waiting for the final bills. Treasurer Deb Vath brought before the Council a motion that the cost of the striping and repairs be paid out of the Forward in Faith funds. Dennis Andersen seconded the motion. The Council voted unanimously in favor of the motion.

Budget Process - 2025 Budget: All budget reports from the committees are due back in early November.

Stewardship Committee Report: Linda Dutchess reported from the committee that Stewardship material would be out by the end of October.

Pictorial Directory: Linda Dutchess explained to the Council the process of creating an Online Directory. There will be many advantages to this format.

New Business:

Greatest Needs Committee Update: Tabled until the November Council meeting.

God's Work. Our Hands. will be a collaborative venture with St. Paul and Faith Lutheran Andover joining Zion.
