Library News

The One Year Book Of Hope by Nancy Guthrie is a 365-day devotional meant to accompany readers through pain, grief, disappointment or hardship, helping them find comfort and hope in God.

- *Each day includes a Scripture reading and a thoughtful reflection grounded in real-life struggles.

- *The book is organized around 52 weekly themes-topics like "The Love of God," "Heaven: Longing for Home," "School of Suffering," "Joy," and "Letting Go"

- *At the end of each week, there are guided questions for reflection, meditation, and prayer, to help readers process their pain, lean into faith, and find hope beyond their suffering.

Overall it's a gentle companion for anyone walking through loss or hardship-offering daily bites of encouragement, honesty about suffering, and a way to cling to trust in God during difficult seasons. This book was donated by Diane Dinning

Holding On To Hope Also by Nancy Guthrie, is a heartfelt reflection on suffering, written from writer's own experience of deep loss. Using the story of Job as it's framework, she explores how to trust God when life is painful and prayers seem unanswered. She emphasizes God's sovereignty, goodness, and presence even in the darkest seasons. The book invites readers to lament honestly, cling to God's promises, and find real hope-not in changed circumstances, but in God himself and the redemption He promises. Donated by Diane Dinning.

Unwrapping the Greatest Gift, A Family Celebration of Christmas by Ann Voskamp is a Family Advent devotional that follows the Jesse Tree tradition, guiding readers through the Bible's story from creation to Christ's birth. Each day in December includes a Scripture passage, a retold Bible story, a short reflection, and activities that help families see how every part of God's plan leads to Jesus-the "greatest gift". The book encourages families to slow down, connect spiritually, and celebrate Christmas with renewed wonder and gratitude.

Confirmation Class Special Project

Essential to being a follower of Christ is not only faith, but also service. We care for others because Christ has cared for us. Faith naturally expresses itself in good deeds. As James put it:

¹⁴What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone claims to have faith but does not have works? Surely that faith cannot save, can it? ¹⁵If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food ¹⁶and one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill," and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that? ¹⁷So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead. (James 2:14-17).

So, as part of our confirmation program this year, the students are engaging in a variety of service projects. This January, they are assembling PIT bags in coordination with the local YWCA Empowerment Center.

January is the State's Annual Point In Time (PIT) Count for homelessness. This is a time where the YWCA staff and other volunteers go out into the community, to find and record people on the streets experiencing homelessness. This "count" guides the State in needs in our communities. Other agencies across the State participate as well in their communities. When doing the count, the Y staff always hand out items to people like bottled water, hand warmers, etc.

YOUR HELP IS VITAL! You can help the confirmation students and benefit homeless people in our area by donating items for this project. Listed below are items needed for these PIT bags:

- Bottle of Water
- Granola or Protein bar
- Hand Warmers
- Gloves
- Pair of Socks
- Travel sized toiletries – Shampoo, Conditioner, Lotion, Body Wash, Soap, Comb
- Toothbrush & toothpaste
- ChapSticks

From January 4 to January 18, special baskets will be in the narthex at church to receive your donations. Any and all items are appreciated. Students will be assembling the PIT bags on Wednesday, January 21.

COUNCIL NEWS

Summary of Congregation Council Minutes – November 11, 2025

(The full minutes are posted on the bulletin board near the church office.)

Pastor's Report: Pastor Barb informed the Council that the process on how the Stewardship cards will be returned during the Saturday and Sunday worship services has been prepared.

Membership Update: Kristi Montgomery shared the Statistical Report for October. Total weekend attendance YTD is 6,008. The average weekend worship attendance YTD is 137.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer, Deb Vath, reported that giving is 5% off YTD pledges. The amount of Expenses vs Income leaves us at (33,000) YTD. A discussion was held concerning the Greatest Needs Funds purpose and the process for requesting funds for needed projects. Linda Dutchess made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report. Marsha Smith seconded the motion. All ayes.

Old Business:

2026 Budget Process : Deb Vath reported to the Council that all committees have submitted their anticipated expenditures for 2026 with the exception of one committee's budget which will be sent as soon as possible. The Finance Committee will be meeting to work on the budget for 2026.

Nominating Committee: Kristi Montgomery will set a date for this committee to meet.

Stewardship Committee: Linda Dutchess shared with the Council that the letters, cards and a return envelope have been mailed to congregational members with a requested return date of November 15th and 16th.

New Business:

WalMart Business Charge Card: Deb Vath brought before the Council the possibility of opening a new charge card at WalMart for the purchase of groceries for Faith Foundations. It is hoped that buying groceries at WalMart would be a savings over the current account at Hy Vee. It was noted that the groceries would need to be ordered using the online process. The Council had a discussion on the card limit of a Walmart card. Deb Vath made a motion to open an account at WalMart with a \$750 limit. The current limit at Hy Vee is \$500. Laurie Behrens seconded the motion. All ayes.

Congregation Annual Meeting - Kristi Montgomery informed the Council that a date must be approved by the Council for the Annual Meeting. Historically, the date for the Annual Meeting is the last Sunday of January with a contingency date of one week later. These dates are January 25, 2026 and February 01, 2026. Patti Lauritzen moved to accept these dates for the Annual Meeting and Dennis Andersen seconded the motion. All ayes.
