Dear Partners in Ministry,

Even as Zion faces more transitions ahead, so too the entire Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) is facing transitions with the upcoming retirement of both Presiding Bishop Elizabeth and Eaton and ELCA Secretary Deacon Sue Rothmeyer. Think about how much our world has changed just since the pandemic beginning in 2020—and how sad it would have been be if our congregation and the larger church hadn't changed to meet new needs. And yet, amid all the new things, we remained grounded in Christ, crucified and risen, as this article about the upcoming churchwide assembly points out.



The 2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly will be held July 28—Aug. 2, 2025, in Phoenix, Arizona. The ELCA Churchwide Assembly, the primary decision-making body of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, is a process of communal spiritual discernment. When the ELCA Churchwide Assembly convenes, its voting members meet with confidence in God's grace around word and water, wine and bread, to carry on their work on behalf of the entire church.

Over the course of the 2025 churchwide assembly, voting members will:

- Elect a new Presiding Bishop and Secretary of the ELCA.
- Hear reports and review the work of churchwide officers, leaders and units.
- Receive and consider proposals from synod assemblies.
- Elect board members and other leaders as specified by the constitution or bylaws.
- Establish ELCA churchwide policy, adopt a budget, and conduct other business related to the ELCA churchwide organization.
- Worship together.

ELCA Churchwide Assembly Theme: For the Life of the World

The first Council of Nicaea was convened 1,700 years ago, beginning the process of setting forth Christian convictions in what we know today as the Nicene Creed. The creed proclaims the life-giving truth of the triune God and our steadfast faith in Jesus Christ "for ... the life of the world to come." These convictions continue to live and breathe among us in word and sacrament.

Early in her tenure, Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton set forth her own convictions to guide the members of the ELCA in understanding our unique identity, and these convictions have become a recognized way of articulating who we are:

- We are church.
- We are Lutheran.
- We are church together.
- We are church for the sake of the world.

We are church for the sake of the world — for the abundant life promised by God and fulfilled in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ for all creation.

We recognize the wisdom of Dietrich Bonhoeffer, who said, "The church is the church only when it exists for others." Our constitution's "Statement of Purpose" boldly proclaims this commitment to be a people "called and sent to bear witness to God's creative, redeeming, and sanctifying activity in the world."

Rooted in the ancient creeds, we are called to live boldly in service to a world longing for healing, justice and hope. We will continue to faithfully pursue God's mission of reconciliation for the life of the world.

As both Zion and the entire ELCA transition yet again, we invite your continuing prayers ... for the sake of the world.

Monthly Birthday Fellowship


July's birthday fellowship in the Gathering Space will be held on Sunday, July 20th, after the 9:00 worship service.




New Zion Library Books for July 2025



Summary of Congregation Council Minutes – May 13, 2025

Pastor's Report: Pastor Julie informed the Council that she will be retiring on July 31, 2025 due to health concerns. The Synod is working to find a replacement until we call a new pastor. Graduation recognition to be scheduled. The Committee for Community Caring is ongoing.

Membership Update: Kristi Montgomery shared the Statistical Report for April. Total weekend attendance YTD is 2473. Pastor Julie made a motion to accept the membership of Rick and Sheree Schoel with Patti Lauritzen seconding the motion. All ayes.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer, Deb Vath, reviewed the Budget, Special Funds and Fund balances as of April 30th. The \$16,000 Child Care loan payment was made in April. Linda Dutchess moved to accept the Treasurer's report. Dennis Anderson seconded the motion. All ayes.

Clinton County Emergency Management Facility Shelter Request/Agreement: Copies of the Facility Shelter Agreement were given to each Council member present to review. New Computer for Office: The office is in need of a new computer. Twin States Technical Services in Davenport, who is currently being used as our network support, has submitted a quote of \$1,327.04 for a Dell desktop computer and setup. The funds for the purchase will come from Special Funds - Office Equipment. Patti Lauritzen moved to approve the purchase from Twin States. Denise Forney seconded the motion. All ayes.
