Something Bigger than Ourselves

On June 8, two of our young people will affirm their baptisms (be confirmed). Later in June, we will also be receiving new members. In both cases, I'll ask this question:

You have made public profession of your faith. Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism:

to live among God's faithful people,

to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper,

to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed,

to serve all people, following the example of Jesus,

and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

That's a daunting question. When I talk with confirmation students about the promises they will make, I usually ask them how they intend to keep these promises? How will they serve <u>all</u> people or strive for justice and peace in <u>all the earth</u>. Sometimes I'm impressed by their answers. Sometimes I feel a little bad about how overwhelmed they look.

It's no less overwhelming a question for me. Perhaps you don't suffer from this particular sin, but sometimes I find myself acting as if I believe I'm the center of the universe. It's sort of the reaction I have when the Pharisees get mad at Jesus for healing somebody on the Sabbath—they act as if the most important thing going on is their job of enforcing religious rules—and they miss the miracle of Jesus restoring someone to health and community. But the truth is, sometimes I find myself stuck in a "Yes, it <u>is</u> all about me!" mentality.

Confirmations and reception of new members remind me that these are Confirmation promises I made too. And my own answer to the question of how I'll serve and strive in

all the earth is "by being a part of a congregation of the ELCA." Because I know that I can only do so much. It's not insignificant, but it is limited. But, thanks be to God, the reach of Zion Lutheran Church is greater than my own reach. The reach of the Southeastern Iowa Synod is greater than that of Zion. The reach of the ELCA is greater yet.

On May 17, Jeanne Crow, Craig Iben, and I attended our Synod Assembly. It was one day packed full of stories—stories about how the synod uses the offerings we forward to them—stories of how the synod staff spends its time—stories of how Bishops and churchwide staff and others are reaching literally around the globe in the name of Jesus Christ—stories of how we're trying to raise up more pastors—stories of new ministries begun to reach people who we haven't been serving. It's exciting!

We don't always have room to include all the information about these things in the *Courier* or weekly bulletin announcements. And thank you! Thank you for being members and friends and supporters of Zion Lutheran Church, and therefore of the Southeastern Iowa Synod and the ELCA. Thank you for responding in word and deed with a resounding "I do, and I ask God to help and guide me!"

Because we do so much more together than we could by ourselves.

New Zion Library Books for June 2025


Sorry, we have nothing "new" in the library this month. But that doesn't mean there isn't a wealth of books on all sorts of topics to read! Help yourself!

How Can You Become a Member of Zion?

Every once in a while, we have a flurry of people asking how they can become members of Zion. There are three main ways, and all of them begin by having a conversation with the pastor:

- 1. Baptism. For people who have never been baptized, that's where we start—by talking about and scheduling a baptism! In baptism, God claims us as God's own children, and we become members of the body of Christ. We make promises about how we intend to live—or, for children, their parent(s)—make promises about raising them in the Christian life. We baptize people of all ages during our regular worship services. If you were baptized somewhere else, be assured that we recognize baptisms from all other Christian churches.
- 2. Affirmation of Baptism. This is the usual way that baptized adults join Zion. Sometimes there's a class so people can learn more about Lutheranism; other times it's a conversation about what you believe. We usually receive new members in worship, asking them if they intend to live as Christ leads us, and introducing them to the assembly.
- 3. Transfer from Another Congregation. For those who belong to a different congregation but want to join Zion, we ask for a Letter of Transfer from the previous congregation. We try to introduce these new members to the assembly during worship.

COUNCIL NEWS

Summary of Congregation Council Minutes – April 8, 2025

(The full minutes are posted on the bulletin board near the church office.)

Pastor's Report: Pastor Julie shared with the Council that things are going well. Preparations for Holy Week are progressing.

Membership Update: Kristi Montgomery shared the Statistical Report for April. Total weekend attendance YTD is 1621.

Treasurer's Report: The amount paid on the Forward in Faith loan in April will be \$16,000 for the first quarter of 2025. All other funds were also reviewed. Linda Dutchess moved to accept the Treasurer's Report for March. Denise Forney seconded the motion. All ayes.

Old Business:

Call Committee Report: The Call Committee will meet with Pastor Kuckuck on 03/12/2025. The committee is at the point in the process where they can receive names for a Call if there are any names available.

New Business:

Scholarship Committee: Kristi reported that the committee has an opening for one more member to be appointed by the Council. The deadline for applying for a scholarship is 04/17/2025. All applications will be reviewed and presented to the Council for approval.

Interim Pastoral Support: Visitation support was the main topic of discussion. We may want to consider a new hire to help with this ministry. This item will be placed on the agenda for the April Council meeting.

Interim Pastoral Support: Pastor Julie will contact Pastor Kuckuck to discuss what options are available for interim pastoral support.

"Caring for Our Community" Support: It was stated that coordination and communication would be one of the goals of this initiative.

Technology Committee: It was reported to the committee that the Greatest Needs fund has contributed to technology upgrades. The upgrades were on the funded list of Greatest Needs for 2025. There was a discussion on forming a committee to assess the technological needs of the church. Suggestions on the possible makeup of the committee were shared.
