"Easter: Celebrating the Unexpected"

Having just wrapped up jotting down an outline for what I'm going to share with the children during tonight's (Wednesday, April 20th) Faith FUNdations opening time together, I shouldn't have been surprised by the phone call I received just seconds later.

On this Wednesday of the week of Easter, I am going to talk with the children about "expectations." 1) What do you expect to happen when I flip these light switches? *(The lights will turn off.)* 2) What do you expect to happen when I push the top of this bottle of hand sanitizer? *(Hand sanitizer will squirt out the spout thing.)* 3) There's a ring of jingle bells sitting here. What do you expect will happen if I pick it up and start to shake it? *(It will make a jingling sound.)* 4) How about if I jump up? *(I expect to come back to the ground. Gravity is pretty predictable.)* Of course, it is also possible that I could hurt myself. Maybe I should expect THAT to happen!

And then I'm going to hold up a plastic Easter egg. The children have seen many of these, so they will certainly have expectations. So what is it that they will expect? Probably candy; but something good anyway. However, they will then probably be surprised to find that what they expected to find wasn't there. The egg will be empty. This will be my jumping off point to share about how EVERYONE expected Jesus being killed meant that he was done for – that he would always be dead. Nobody expected an empty tomb!

So, having just set my "expected/unexpected" "life/death/life" notes away to be used later tonight with the kids, my phone rang. Someone had died. Could I preside at a funeral this weekend for a member of an area congregation that doesn't currently have a pastor? An unexpected phone call on behalf of a grieving family. An unexpected call to share the Good News of the blessing and life of God in the midst of death.

Whether a death is expected or unexpected, we *can* expect a host of different feelings and thoughts. And these "different feelings and thoughts" will almost always have some difficult ones as a part of the mix. This is to be expected.

But what an awful heaviness would always be hanging on us if our expectation was that death is the final word – that death is IT. And this is what death – in and of itself – shouts out at us: THE END! But this is the very reason that Easter Sunday – the celebration of the Resurrection of Our Lord – is such an incredibly big deal. The resurrection of Christ and his empty tomb has bought about the totally unexpected "sure and certain hope of the resurrection to eternal life." (This is a quotation from the worship service committal prayer lifted up at the cemetery.) In Jesus Christ, our expectations have changed! Thanks be to God! I look forward to worshipping with you throughout this Easter season – and then the Easter season that we could call "life on earth." As we worship together, I expect that we will be blessed with a Word of life in the midst of that which shouts out death. May we, in the grace of God, expect the unexpected!

Zion Child Care & Preschool

We are currently registering for 3 year old and 4 year old preschool for the fall. We have a couple of afternoon spots left. They meet 11:45 am – 2:45 pm. Our 3's program meets on Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday each week. Tuition is \$165 per month. Our 4's program meets Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday each week. We participate in the 4 year old voluntary preschool grant with Clinton Community School District and the State of Iowa, meaning any child that is 4 years old and lives in Iowa, tuition is FREE!! Tuition for a 5 year old or resident from another state is \$240.00 per month.


New Zion Library Books for May 2022




The First Mrs. Rothschild by Sara Aharon is a novel set in Europe in the 1700's and tells the story of the beginnings of the Rothschild dynasty, the repression of the Jewish population in Frankfurt, and the heroic success of the first Mr. Rothschild. Written as a diary, his wife documents how he overcame being orphaned and invited her into his dreams of family and success. By the end of their lives, their five sons were bankers in five European cities that funded much of the import trade, even supplying armies with

money and supplies, and gaining equal citizenship for the Jews in Frankfurt.

The Secret, Book & Scone Society by Ellery Adams is the first book in a series of mystery stories about a group of women who find friendship and purpose in their lives through helping others and solving mysteries!






The Whispered Word is the second book and continues the story of the four women who live in a small town just off the Appalachian Trail and love books. Unfortunately, there are

WE ARE PLANNING TO RESTART ZION'S BOOK CLUB! The third Wednesday in May will be our debut with the novel *Little Faith* by Nickolas Butler, which was inspired by true events that happened in Wisconsin. Questions of faith arise for Lyle and Peg when their estranged daughter and grandson return home and get involved in an extremist church. The pastor of this church believes that Isaac, the grandson, has the ability to heal the sick. Lyle, whose own faith was shaken after a tragedy years ago, finds himself torn. Uneasy about the practices of this church, he is afraid that if he rebuffs this church, his daughter and grandson will disappear for good. But when Isaac's safety is threatened, Lyle is forced to make a decision that may fracture the family beyond repair. This is a novel about friendship and



community, the ways in which belief is both forged and dismantled, and the lengths we go to protect our own.

We have 3 ladies that monitor the door and greet the children and parents each week. Marcia Krogmann, Jane Noecker & Linda Shaff





COUNCIL NEWS

Summary of Congregation Council Minutes – March 8, 2022

(The full minutes are posted on the bulletin board near the church office.)

Pastor's Report: Pastor Luepke noted that the heaviness of Covid seems to be lifting. On the Russian invasion of Ukraine, we need to lift our prayers and do what we can from here. He also shared that we can recognize God's gifts and blessings and to also recognize what gives us joy. The return of the children to the front of the sanctuary for the children's sermon is one of these joys. Pastor informed the Council that he is doing emergency and pastoral care for Immanuel Lutheran Church in Clinton and for Zion Lutheran Church in Elvira. He has also been asked to be on call for funerals at Faith Lutheran Church in Andover.

Treasurer's Report: General Funds were reviewed and Skip Carstensen reported that we are ahead of budget year to date.

Old Business: Jurgen Duhr reported to the Council that the work on the organ will begin on Monday, April 18th with work expected to be complete and the organ available for use on May 14th.

Pastor brought the work of the Governance Taskforce before the Council. This taskforce was put together by the Council and its work was interrupted by the Covid pandemic. The taskforce was reviewing the way Zion's governance was put together and was to review and update the constitution. The Council agreed to ask that the work continue, and that Jim Pillers, who had served as the leader of this task force, be asked to continue to lead this effort.

Committee assignments were discussed. The assignments are a way of having a Council liaison on each committee. Each Council member will commit to an assignment.

New Business: It was reported to the Council that we will be resuming weekly Communion. In April, the opportunity to come to the Communion rail for Communion will be offered.

President Travis Morehead reported to the Council that Fellowship will resume on March 13th. Opportunities for different committees or individuals to participate in hosting Fellowship will be forthcoming.

Council member Melissa Werner brought before the Council the desire to move forward with the Sauerkraut Supper this year with a tentative date of September 15th. There will be a need for numerous volunteers.

Deb Vath brought before the Council the desire to resume the Kids Against Hunger project this Spring. The Social Ministry committee will follow up on the project.

Deb Vath reported to the Council on the Blood Drives held at Zion. There will be three drives per year. The second drive will be June 20^{th} with the third one to be held in October.
