Family Advent Celebration



Zion Book Club meets in our church library the 3rd Wednesday of each month. Our next being Wednesday, November 19th @ 10:00 right after Prayer/Bible Study. We will be discussing The Music of Bees by Eileen Garvin.

The Music of Bees by Eileen Garvin is a heartwarming and reflective novel that explores themes of loss, healing, and the importance of community. The story centers around Alice, a woman in her 40s who is grappling with the aftermath of a tragic accident that left her emotionally scarred. She decides to take a new direction in her life by purchasing a small farm in the Pacific Northwest and starting a beekeeping business.



As Alice tends to her bees, she forms unexpected connections with two other individuals, both of whom are also facing their own personal struggles: Jake, a young man recovering from a traumatic past, and his neighbor, a troubled teenager named Harry. The novel's title reflects the idea that nature, in this case, the music of bees buzzing, can provide solace and help individuals find peace and understanding.

Through the act of caring for the bees, Alice begins to heal, learning that life's rhythms can be unpredictable, but also full of unexpected beauty. *The Music of Bees* touches on the importance of resilience, personal

growth, and the way that small acts of kindness can change lives.

It's a gentle, uplifting story about the connections we form with others, nature, and ourselves.



COUNCIL NEWS

Summary of Congregation Council Minutes - August 12, 2025

(The full minutes are posted on the bulletin board near the church office.)

Pastor's Report: Pastor Barb informed the Council that she will be joining Pastor Holmer on Wednesday evenings for Confirmation instruction.

Membership Update: Kristi Montgomery shared the Statistical Report for August.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer, Deb Vath, reported that giving is only at 88% of the budget. Deb also reviewed line items for Expense costs against Budget. Zion's current income vs expenses is (-\$36,669). Marsha Smith moved to accept the Treasurer's Report. Linda Dutchess seconded the motion. All ayes.

Old Business:

Call Committee Report: There was no update for the September meeting.

Interim Planning: Pastor Barb informed the Council that this is going well.

"Caring for Our Community" Support: It was reported to the Council by Deb Willwerth that there has been a great response in the request for volunteers. Additional information will be shared with the Congregation about this ministry.

Music Leader for Faith Fundations: President Kristi Montgomery informed the Council that we are still in need of a Music Leader for Faith Fundations. It was recommended that the job description include the time commitment needed each Wednesday. This time commitment is approximately 15 minutes per week.

New Business:

Nominating Committee: Kristi Montgomery brought to the Council the need to form a Nominating Committee in September. She can nominate 3 people to be on the committee besides herself.

Stewardship Committee: Linda Dutchess shared with the Council the status of and the path forward for the committee.

Pork and Sauerkraut Supper: Melissa Werner reported to the Council that the number of tickets sold to date have not been as many as expected at this time. However, ticket sales historically increase when the date of the supper gets closer. Melissa also shared with the Council that more volunteers are needed.

Confirmation TV and Stand: A donation was made to Zion of a Television and Stand that was requested for use in Confirmation instruction.
