Bright and early yesterday morning 123 workmen entered the funnel-shaped mass or wreckage in the New Wonderland building and recovered the bodies of three more men, making a total of eleven dead, as a result of the terrible event of Saturday afternoon. The more one observes the wreckage the stronger is the conception of the awful whirlpool of death that held absolute sway for that one brief moment while the heavy roof was falling live stories to the basement. There were few that entertained even a faint hope yesterday of seeing anyone rescued alive, yet when the news of the slight accident to Benjamin Webb, one of the rescuing party, was passed about the city. It was distorted into a wild tale about a man rescued alive. One look at the wreck is enough to make anyone wonder how any of the workmen in the ill-fated building escaped with his life Saturday. And after twenty-four hours beneath such a snarl and ponderous weight of debris, the discovery of a living victim was not even hoped for by the rescuers. So that yesterday was not the daywall to knock down loose brick work. This is the wall from which a section 50 feet across and 20 feet deep peeled off at 5:20 Saturday evening, and caused the grand stampede from the wrecked building. Each man crawled out on his hand and knees, at a height of at least 75 feet from the basement floor, and on a ragged, tremulous surface only 16 inches wide - this, too, in the teeth of the stiff wind. While resting upon his knees and left hand, each worked away with a long stick in his right hand, knocking off the loose bricks. Then, for a change, they straddled the wall and worked, away at the loose masonry with both hands.

It soon became apparent that this work was decidedly risky for the men, although it should be understood that they were not ordered there, but went voluntarily. Then they were called off, and upon the arrival of hook and ladder truck No. 1, Capt. Peter Garr and ten men went to work with long pikes and succeeded in throwing down considerable more. The work of both laborers and firemen was most praiseworthy, for a large part of the wall left standing after Saturday evening crash was buckled several inches around the center. At last everything appeared to be in snug shape for the recommencement of the rescue work.

From 9 o'clock until 9:45 the entire force of men was busy in throwing out of the way the debris they had cast down. Finally, they got down to the level, where they had left off Saturday evening. After a few minutes of well-directed effort the labors of the men were rewarded by the recurrence of the shout: "Here's a man!" All that could be seen of the body at that moment was the upturned sole of a shoe and part of the man's ankle. The ninth victim proved to be Peter Pfeifle, a carpenter-laborer, who had resided at 777 Chene Street. He had been in the employ of Teakle & Golden, the carpentry contractors for the building. He was the worst injured man that had been taken from the wreck. He had suffered compound fractures of both lower legs, right upper arm fractured and both shoulders broken. He was tenderly lifted into a wicker-ware stretcher and conveyed in F. G. Marshall's conveyance to that morgue. As the stretcher was being carried to the wagon, Mayor Maybury and others doffed their heads as it passed.

Then with redoubled energy, willing hands wielded shovels, pickaxes, crowbars, saws and axes, while sledge hammers and chisels soon ate through large iron beams, permitting them to be more easily removed. The sonorous blows of axes on heavy planks were mingled with the grating crush of sliding beams and the shouts of the searchers. By 10 o'clock the men at work must have numbered more than 125. Supt. Gallagher had about twenty White Wings in ordinary dress at work, but he delegated the authority of directing all the men to John Campbell and his two efficient foremen, James Finley and Frank Crosby. The men were handled well. Gangs of forty or fifty would seize hold of a rope attached to an immense beam and drag it up out of the building into the alley. Herbert Hockin was one of the best workers seen. He was everywhere at once and just where he was needed, performing dangerous pieces of work with perfect calmness and good judgment.

William F. Graff. A native-born citizen of Marshall, Michigan, and the representative of an early pioneer family of this part of Calhoun county, William F. Graff is well known both as a prominent member of the Knights of Pythias, and as a clerk in the Marshall Post Office. He was born November 24, 1883, a son of the late John Graff. His paternal grandfather, John G. Graff, was born and reared in Wurtemberg, Germany. Immigrating in early manhood to America, he made his way directly to Michigan, settling in Calhoun County, and for many years being an honored and respected resident of Marshall.
