Past and Present of Washtenaw County, Michigan by Samuel W. Beakes, Chicago: The S.J. Clarke Publishing Co., 1906:

William W. Wedemeyer is one of the younger representatives of the legal fraternity in Ann Arbor. There is no profession in which advancement depends so largely upon individual merit as in the law, and the fact that Mr. Wedemeyer is now accorded a liberal and distinctly representative clientage is an indication of his excellent qualification for legal practice. He is a native son of Washtenaw county, born March 22, 1873. His father, Frederick Wedemever, was a native of Lilienthal, Germany, and came to America as the business representative of his brother, Theodore, who was an extensive dealer in sugar and tobacco. He acted in this capacity in the West Indies and North and South America. He was a man of superior education, speaking fluently several languages and traveled extensively, visiting almost every known portion of the world and gaining the knowledge and culture which only travel can bring. He was married in this country to Miss Augusta Gruner, a native of Germany, and in 1855 he settled on a farm in Lima Township, Washtenaw County, Michigan, near Chelsea, where he carried on agricultural pursuits throughout his remaining days, his death occurring in 1885, when he was fifty-seven years of age. His political allegiance was given to the Republican Party and he was actively interested in township and county affairs, co-operating in many measures for the general good. He served as director of schools in Lima Township for a number of years, and was always interested in anything that tended to promote intellectual development. In his family were a daughter and three sons; Mrs. Nellie Klein, the wife of Jacob Klein, of Lima Township, and twin sister of the subject of this review; Fred and Theodore, who reside at Chelsea; and William W.

In the district schools William W. Wedemeyer acquired his early education and was graduated from the Ann Arbor High School with the class of 1890. Afforded superior educational privileges, he entered upon the literary course in the University of Michigan, which he completed by graduation in 1894, and then took up the study of law, being granted his degree in that department in 1895. Through the two succeeding years he filled the position of commissioner of schools of Washtenaw County, and in 1897 and 1898 was deputy railroad commissioner of Michigan. In the latter year he was a candidate for the nomination for congress before the republican congressional convention, but was defeated by a small majority, and was again a prominent candidate for that office in 1902, but he threw his strength to Hon. Charles E. Townsend, the present congressman of this district. Upon his retirement from office Mr. Wedemeyer formed a partnership with Martin J. Cavanaugh, who is mentioned elsewhere in this work, and the firm of Cavanaugh & Wedemeyer has had a continuous and prosperous existence since the first of January, 1899. They have been accorded a liberal patronage and the records of the courts show that they have been connected, with much of the important litigation of the district. In 1905 Mr. Wedemeyer was appointed by President Roosevelt to the position of United States consul to Georgetown, British Guiana, and left that place in April, but returned to Ann Arbor on the 3rd of July, having resigned because the climate was so detrimental to his health. He was taken ill almost immediately after his arrival there, suffering with fever, so that he had to be sent to the hospital, where he remained until starting for home, going from the hospital to the ship on which he returned to the United States. He immediately entered

upon his law practice again upon his return. Mr. Wedemeyer is also interested in various business enterprises. He is first vice-president and one of the directors of the Glazier Stove Company, one of the leading manufacturing institutions of this part of the state, and has for some years acted as counsel for the company. In former years he had some extensive experience in newspaper work and is now president of the Ann Arbor News Publishing Company. Mr. Wedemeyer gave proof of the elemental strength and force of his character by the determination which he displayed in acquiring an education. While attending the university he engaged both in teaching and in newspaper work in order to help pay his way through the school. He has always been active in politics, interested in the vital questions of the day from his youth, and reading so extensively that he has since attaining his majority been able to support his position by strong and intelligent argument. He has done much campaign work in behalf of both the state and national tickets, and has also done much public speaking along educational and other lines throughout the state.

On the 9th of January, 1900, Mr. Wedemeyer was married to Miss Louise Locher, of Kalamazoo, Michigan, a daughter of Bernard and Sarah (Robischung) Locher. They now have one son, George Edward, who was born in Ann Arbor, July 7, 1902. Mr. Wedemeyer is one of the national trustees of the American Insurance Union, a member of the Masonic fraternity, of the Knights of the Maccabees and of the German Bethlehem Evangelical church, while his wife holds membership in St. Thomas Catholic church. Prompted by laudable ambition and unfaltering determination, Mr. Wedemeyer has steadily worked his way upward, and his position in professional and social circles in Ann Arbor is an enviable one.

CONGRESSMAN WEDEMEYER WAS BORN HERE AND LIVED HERE ALL HIS LIFE.

Hon. William W. Wedemeyer was born in this city March 22, 1873. His father, Frederick Wedemeyer, was a native of Lilienthal, Germany and came to this country as the representative of his brother who was an extensive dealer in sugar and tobacco. He acted in this capacity in the West Indies and in North and South America. He was a man of superior education, spoke several languages fluently and had traveled extensively, visiting almost every part of the world. He was married to Miss Augusta Gruner, a native of Germany, in 1855, and settled on a farm in Lima Township, this county, near Chelsea, where he engaged in agricultural pursuits until his death which occurred when he was 57 years old. In the family were a daughter, and three sons: Mrs. Nellie Klein, wife of Jacob Klein of Lima, and the sister of William W. Wedemeyer, and Fred and Theodore, who live at Chelsea.

Mr. Wedemeyer acquired his early education in the district schools and was graduated from Ann Arbor high school in 1890. He then entered the literary department of the University of Michigan and took a Bachelor's degree in 1894. One year later he took his degree from the law department of the University. Through the two succeeding years he filled the position of commissioner of schools of Washtenaw County, and in 1897 and 1898, was deputy railroad commissioner of Michigan. In the latter year he was candidate for the nomination for congress before the Republican congressional convention but was defeated by a small majority, and was once again a prominent candidate for that office in 1902, but the threw his strength to Hon. Charles E. Townsend, who won the nomination and election. Upon his retirement from office Mr. Wedemeyer formed a partnership with Martin J. Cavanaugh and this firm, formed in January 1899, soon became one of the most prominent law firms in the city. A few years ago George J. Burke, now prosecuting attorney, was received into the firm as a junior partner, and the firm name has since been Cavanaugh, Wedemeyer & Burke. In 1905 Mr. Wedemeyer was appointed by President Roosevelt to the position of United States consul to Georgetown, British Guiana, and left [for?] that place in April but returned to Ann Arbor on July 3, having resigned because the climate proved detrimental to his health. He was taken ill almost as soon as he arrived there, suffering from fever, and was at once sent to a hospital where he remained until he was taken home. Mr. Wedemever was interested in a number of business enterprises, and in former years he had some extensive experience in newspaper work.

On Jan. 9, 1901 he was married to Miss Louise Locher of Kalamazoo, and she, with the following children, survive him: George, Edward, Mary and Josephine. Mr. Wedemeyer was a member of the Masonic fraternity of the Knights of Maccabees and of the German Bethlehem church.

Wedemeyer, born in Ann Arbor in 1902, built a career on radio waves that ranged from working as a "sparks" on ocean freighters to starting a radio manufacturing and wholesaling business that has survived 65 years.

The son of pre-World War I Congressman William Wedemeyer, Wedemeyer got his first exposure to

the radio business during an inspection trip with his father to the Panama Canal. Wedemeyer became fascinated with the "sparks" - the radio operator on the ship - · and later became one himself before graduating from high school. That early fascination later propelled him to run WQAJ, Ann Arbor's first radio station, then to de- sign radios and start a radio manufacturing, repair and sales business in 1927. Wedemeyer Electronic Supply Co. still operates at 2280 S. Industrial Highway in Ann Arbor.

Along the way, Wedemeyer served as president of the National Electronic Distributors Association and the National Association of Wholesaler Distributors, a position that sometimes sent him to Washington, D.C., to offer testimony to congressional committees. Brett M. Fischbach, (formerly of Saline) editor of the Lake County Star, died Oct. 24, 2007, at his home in Baldwin. He was 54. Mr. Fischbach was born June 25, 1953, at the U.S. Naval Hospital in Corona, Calif., the son of Frederick and Marylouise Fischbach. Even as a child, he gave evidence of a lively intelligence, boundless

curiosity and a passion for fishing. Mr. Fischbach attended grade and high school in Ann Arbor and Saline, graduating from Saline High School in 1971. At the age of 18, he volunteered to serve in the U.S. Army and served in the Third Army at Fort Ord in Seattle and Fort Bliss in El Paso, Texas. He was honorably discharged in 1974. Following his Army service and 13 years in the Merchant Marine, he earned college degrees from Central Michigan University in zoology and history, ultimately attaining master's degree in both disciplines. He also taught undergraduate courses in ichthyology, fisheries biology, limnology and zoology, and served as assistant curator of the university's Museum of Cultural and Natural History. A longstanding love of ships and the sea inspired Mr. Fischbach to pursue a career in the Merchant Marine. Following his training at the Harry Lundeburg School of Seamanship in Piney Point, North Carolina, he received his Able Seaman's certificate and, for many years, worked on Great Lakes vessels, both as a deckhand and later as boatswain.

In 1983, Mr. Fischbach married Jennifer Lee Gross of Ann Arbor. His beloved first wife died after a long illness in 1991. In 2005, he was wed to Cappy Beins, originally from Toledo, Ohio, whom he recruited to write as a regular contributor to the Lake County Star.

Mr. Fischbach assumed the post of editor of this weekly newspaper in 2002. He quickly established a reputation for being a fine reporter who relentlessly pursued stories, and a clever feature writer who's popular and award-winning "Virtual Bait Shop" became one of the best-loved columns in the area. Being a Master Angler as well as an avid football fan, Mr. Fischbach was well equipped to cover a wide variety of outdoor activities and sports. He was also profoundly interested in politics and extraordinarily well informed about current events. A fervent champion of the common man, who despised cant and was always willing to speak his mind in the face of any opposition, Mr. Fischbach composed a fine series of "op-eds" on subjects ranging from war to the economy to public welfare and education, never failing to provoke thought and useful discussion. He was recognized for his outstanding work as a writer and editor by the Michigan Press Association.

Everyone who knew Mr. Fischbach well agrees that he was a most remarkable and truly unique individual. Humorous, bright, kind, and amazingly well read, he never lost his childlike fascination with ecology, gardening, chess, wartime strategy and field equipment. An expert on the American Civil War and World War II, he could identify any and every tank, plane or weapon from memory. There was not a single general on either side that he did not recognize by sight. While serving at Fort Bliss, Mr. Fischbach's Army colleagues who knew of his chess talent arranged a match for him with a Mexican National Master from nearby Chihuahua. Mr. Fischbach won the match when the master made a "poor move" in Mr. Fischbach's words at about the eighth move.

Mr. Fischbach was outstanding in biological taxonomy: his powers of retention were such that he could quickly classify any animal, whether terrestrial or aquatic, and explain its most important characteristics. Perhaps most of all, his relatives and friends will cherish the memory of his wonderful conversation. He lived a life that was jam-packed with adventures and could relate delightful anecdotes about rescues in the waters of Lake Superior, violent storms, occasional wild encounters with very colorful characters from Mexico to northern Canada, and fine musical concerts. Though he met literally hundreds of people during his life, Mr. Fischbach never forgot a name (or the lyrics to a song). Mr. Fischbach was a member of the American Legion, the Pere Marquette Watershed Council, the Lake County Property Owners Association, and the Federation of Fly Fishers.

Besides his widow and parents, survivors include three siblings, Cort S. (Maureen) Fischbach of Pinckney, Kristin Louise (Harold "Hal") Holcomb of Chelsea and Dirk F. (Kathryn "Katy") Fischbach of Saline; nephews Skylar Smith of Pinckney, Evan and Colwyn Fischbach of Saline, and Scott and Kenneth Gross; one uncle, R. Curtis Fischbach of Adrian; nine cousins; Jennifer's beloved mother, Jutta Gross; and a host of friends.
