Notes for Rev. Christian Frederick Spring:

Battle Creek, Sept. 3, 1995 - The Zion Lutheran Church traces its beginning to 1848 when the Rev. Frederick Schmid of Ann Arbor first came to serve 40 Lutheran families. He came to Marshall once every six weeks on his regular circuit through central Michigan. The Church was formally organized in 1856, and the old Trinity Episcopal Church on the present site was purchased in late 1857. The Church's first pastor was Rev. H. Spring.

An early Marshall pioneer, S. J. Burpee gave the congregation his old store building which was moved to the church property, and used as a school. By 1868, 160 students were enrolled in Sunday School, which was taught by eleven teachers. On October 2, 1900, the congregation decided to build the current church for a sum not to exceed \$10,000, and it was to be known as the Zion Lutheran Church.

The cornerstone was laid on June 9, 1901, and the congregation had grown to 500 members. The Church was built largely through the efforts of Pastor Christopher Heidenreich who was called to serve the original building before on December 8, 1896. the construction of the Pastor Heidenreich educational wing in 1969. served the congregation for This tremendous project was nearly 50 years, before retiring in 1946. The current Pastor, Rev. Maurice G. Shackell has been with Zion Lutheran Church since 1976. Many additions and modifications were made to 1970. The woodwork in the Sanctuary is charming and enhances the beauty of the church interior. The altar, pulpit and pews are all made of beautiful oak.

Marshall, Feb. 22, 1970 - The congregation of Zion Lutheran Church today began marking the first of four weeks of dedication services denoting completion of the new educational-fellowship building and the rededication of the renovated church. Former pastors and church leaders are scheduled to speak at each of the Sunday dedication services March 1, March 8 and March 15. A fellowship dinner will be served at 5 p.m. today and at the same time during the following three Sundays. The dedication of the educational-fellowship building was to take place at 10:30 a.m. today. Guest speaker was to be the Rev. E. H. Hessler of Trinity Lutheran Church. Conklin. Evening speaker will be Donald Kell, assistant superintendent of Christian education for the Lutheran Church, Missouri Synod of Michigan. Activities will close with a vesper service conducted by the Rev. H. H. Hasten, Zion pastor.

About 122 years have lapsed since the first church service for German Lutherans was held at the Calhoun County Court House and the dedication today of the new and refurbished facilities. The handsome educational wing affords an all-purpose room on the main floor, including a basketball, volleyball and shuffleboard area, plus a kitchen, a church office and pastor's study. The second floor contains a choir robing and music area, a large classroom and a balcony overlooking the main floor. In the lower level are 14 individual classrooms and a service area.

The church building, dedicated 69 years ago, has a "new look." The brick has been sandblasted and tuck-pointed and the framework painted. A new entrance has been added, including outside lights and a white steeple topped by a gold cross. New wiring and lights have been installed. There's a new floor in the nave, the pews have been refinished, and a new public address and radio broadcasting system added. The interior has been given a n extensive redecorating job. The Kilgen pipe organ that served the congregation for a half-century has been rebuilt and will continue to provide music for the services. An added new feature are the Calhoun County fieldstone bulletin board and accents at the entrances. The history of the Marshall congregation goes back to 1848 when the Rev. Frederick Schmid of Ann Arbor, armed with his Bible and liturgy, a blanket and a hatchet, traveled 70 miles every six weeks to conduct services here.

The church was organized in 1856 with the Rev. Christian H. Spring as first pastor. The following year, the congregation purchased the old frame former Trinity Episcopal Church then on the site of the present church. Someone donated an old store building which the church converted into a school, where classes were held six months out of the year to instruct children of the church in the German language and the doctrines of the church. In 1867 the congregation raised enough money to build a parsonage south of the church. By the late 1880's the old church was in need of extensive repair and remodeling to meet the needs of the growing congregation. Plans were launched to build the present church which was dedicated in December 1901.

The Rev. Christopher Heidenreich, then pastor of the church, officiated at the dedication ceremony. He served the church as pastor for 50 years before his retirement in 1946. A special service in his honor was held at the church on Feb. 21, 1954, two days before his 80th birthday anniversary. In 1934, the church became the place of ordination for his son, Herbert M. Heidenreich, when he entered the Lutheran ministry.

A son of the congregation. the Rev. Mr. Heidenreich, now pastor of Trinity Lutheran Church, Sturgis and counselor of the Sturgis Circuit, will be one of the guest speakers at the dedication services, Sunday, March 15. Another son, Theophil Heidenreich of Marshall, played the organ for church services for many years. The church celebrated its centennial on Sunday, March 25, 1956. There have been more than a dozen pastors serving the church since its organization over a century ago. The most recent is the Rev. H. H. Kasten, installed August 10, 1969. Remainder of the dedication services scheduled: Sunday, March 1, guest pastor will be the Rev. Marcus Buuck, who served here from 1946 to 1957. Evening speaker will be the Rev. Theodore Zeile, pastor of St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Flint. Sunday, March 8. will be a folk service at 10:30 a.m. under the direction of the Concordia Swingers of Fort Wayne, Indiana. Morning speaker will be Capt. Kenneth Kuhlman of Ft. Knox, Kentucky. The Swingers will be featured in a hourlong program at 3:30 p.m. Sunday, March 15, the Rev. Theodore Taykowski, former pastor, will be guest speaker. Assisting him will be Prof. Roland Haas of Concordia Senior College, Fort Wayne, Ind. Guest speaker for the afternoon service will be the Rev. Herbert M. Heidenreich of Trinity Lutheran Church, Sturgis. Architect for the church was Christopher King of Vermontville.

Contractors were: F. J. Skidmore & Son, Inc., Battle Creek, general construction; Behnke and Sons, Inc., Charlotte, mechanical construction, and Union Electric, Inc., of Battle Creek, electrical work.

Rev. Christian Frederick Spring was born in Reussen, Germany and died in New Hamburg, Wilmont Township, Waterford County, Ontario. He married Anna Maria Jedele in 1856. She died April 26, 1858. Together they one child who died in infancy. He later remarried.

Rev. Spring was pastor from 1866-1872 at St James' Lutheran Church. He arrived Dec 27th, 1866 to serve New Dundee and to get New Hamburg back into the Lutheran Canada Synod again, which he succeeded in doing. He became full pastor to New Hamburg in August 1873 where he worked until his passing in 1888.

Past and Present of Washtenaw County, Michigan by Samuel W. Beakes, Chicago: The S.J. Clarke Publishing Co., 1906:

Charles Steinbach, who since the spring of 1872 has been engaged in the harness business in Chelsea, with a patronage that makes him a prosperous merchant, while his business methods and enterprising spirit constitute him one of the leading representatives of commercial interests in the town, was born in Hessen, Germany, in 1844. His parents were Henry and Catherine (Volland) Steinbach, The father came to America with his family in 1854 and made his way at once to Michigan. He was first engaged in the grocery business in Europe, but by trade was a weaver. When he arrived here he purchased a farm of eighty acres north of Ann Arbor, which he cleared and improved continuing its cultivation until 1865, when he sold that property and removed to the Nowland farm a mile and a half to the north. He rented that place for a year and in the fall of 1865 bought a farm a guarter of a mile west of Lima Center, comprising one hundred and ten acres, to which he added by additional purchases until his place comprised one hundred and ninety acres of rich and valuable land. He was thus identified with agricultural pursuits up to the time of his death, which occurred December 3, 1891. His wife died July 30, 1896. In their family were ten children: Charles, born July 15, 1844; Jacob, August 27, 1846; Martha Elizabeth, February 10, 1849; Burnett, February 17, 1851; Martin, who was born April 8, 1853, and died in March, 1885; Caroline, who was born November 1, 1855, and is the wife of Peter Oesterle, of Sylvan township; Minnie Eva, who was born October 27, 1859, and is conducting the Utopia Millinery Parlor at Ann Arbor; John Henry, born March 3, 1862; George, born May 3, 1866; and Anna Catherine, who was born May 22, 1872, and is the wife of Herman Fletcher, of Lima Township. The father was a republican, active in the work of the party and deeply interested in its success. His wife was a sister of Herman and Jacob Volland, the oldest harness merchants of Ann Arbor.

Charles Steinbach acquired his early education in the schools of Germany and laid the foundation for a successful career. After coming to America he remained on his father's farm until 1861, when in August of that year he entered the employ of Jacob Volland, of Ann Arbor, with whom he remained for three years during which time he learned the harness maker's trade. In the fall of 1864 he returned to the home farm spending the winter with his father's family, and then came to Chelsea, where he spent six months. In the spring he removed to Lima Center, where he engaged in business on his own account for five years, and in the spring of 1872 he returned to Chelsea, where he has since engaged in the harness business with gratifying success. In 1894 he erected a fine brick business block forty by sixty feet and two stories in height. Here he is conducting an excellent business, being accorded a liberal patronage. In 1880 he was granted a patent on a harness pad and in 1881 was granted a patent on a gig tree for harness. He began the manufacture of those articles at Ann Arbor but owing to a destructive fire and the competition of others who forced him out of business he was never able to place his inventions on the market. He has, however, prospered in his industrial and mercantile efforts and is now conducting a good business in Chelsea.

On the 19th of March, 1872, Mr. Steinbach was married to Miss Martha Hutzel, a daughter of August Hutzel, who is represented elsewhere in this work. They have seven children: Henry A., who is married and is connected with the Bell Telephone Company; Otto, who is a piano tuner living in Adrian, Michigan; Charlotte Anna, who is engaged in teaching in Jackson; Emily, who follows the profession of teaching in

Sylvan; Helena Louise, who is a graduate of the Michigan University and is engaged in teaching music; Edgar T., who is in the west; and Albert Martin, at home. The family possesses exceptional musical talent and skill and Mr. Steinbach at one time was a teacher of the violin. In his political views he is an earnest republican and for some time he served as township treasurer in Lima, while for four years he was postmaster at Lima Center. Fraternally he is connected with Olive lodge, No. 156, A. F. & A. M., with the Knights of the Maccabees and the Ancient Order of United Workmen. There have been some discouraging and disheartening features in his career but the obstacles he has met have been overcome by determined and earnest purpose and he has gradually and steadily worked his way upward, gaining a comfortable competence and an honored name as well.

Hermann Hutzel is a member of the firm of Hutzel & Co., plumbers, steam and gas fitters, and dealers in paints, oils and glass, their place of business being at No. 14 South Main Street, Ann Arbor. Mr. Hutzel was born in this city April 5, 1850, his father being August F. Hutzel, and his mother Sophia (Mann) Hutzel. The mother emigrated to the United States in the year 1824 from Germany, coming to Michigan in 1829, and the father in 1836. They were married in Washtenaw County. Mr. Hutzel at that time being a trader and a practical business man, afterward went into the paints, oil and glass business in Ann Arbor until 1856, when he added a stock of groceries, continuing in the business until 1888, when he retired, transferring the business to his two sons. He died the same year, aged eighty-three. His wife still survives him and is now residing with her daughter at the old homestead. They were the parents of twelve children, eight of whom are living, six girls and two boys, Hermann being the eldest of the family.

Hermann Hutzel was educated in the schools of Ann Arbor, which, with the High School, have a very high standing. On leaving school he entered the store of his father as an assistant, afterward purchasing an interest in the same. In 1878 he added to his business piping, plumbing and steam supplies, not only doing business in Ann Arbor, but in different parts of the State, besides doing considerable in the building and construction of waterworks, chiefly the waterworks at Elgin, Illinois, and also at Streator. The Hutzel

Bros, built the waterworks at Ann Arbor. Mr. Hutzel was married, in 1877, to Miss Paulina Graf, of Ann Arbor, daughter of Christian Graf. Six children have been the result of this union.

Our subject has always been a public-spirited man and has held many prominent offices. He was Alderman from the Second Ward for four years, member of the Board of Public Works two years and Vice President of the Allmandinger Piano and Organ Company. He and his wife are members of the Lutheran Church. In his political views he is an advocate of the Democratic Party. They reside in a handsome brick house on one of the finest streets of the city.

Muncie, Jan. 16, 1995 - The downtown Muncie building into which Christian Ministries of Delaware County recently moved has housed several organizations significant in local social and cultural history. Located on the southeast corner of Elm and Main Streets, the two-story brick structure is now covered with modern siding, so whether it has a capstone or cornerstone with a name and/or date can't be seen. Until a generation ago, the ground floor housed the offices, showroom and shops of Hutzel and Co., for two generations a major heating and plumbing contractor in Muncie and East Central Indiana. Hutzel & Co. opened in Muncie in 1900. Its founder was Herman Hutzel, who came here with his family from Ann Arbor, Michigan, where his grandparents, natives of Germany, were among the community's first residents.

A 1915-16 Muncie City Directory lists Herman and Max Hutzel as principals in the firm, although Max is listed as living in New Castle. There might have been a branch of the company there, and he later lived in Muncie. Herman Hutzel and his wife Pauline lived at 715 N. Elm St. There were two daughters: Elizabeth, who taught German in Muncie High School until the subject was discontinued at the outset of World War I, and then taught mathematics, and Melita, who was instructor in German at Muncie Normal Institute, a predecessor of Ball State University. Neither of the daughters ever married. In addition to Max, Hutzel sons included Victor, who in 1915-16 was listed as manager of Hutzel & Co., and Hugo, then not with the company. Herman Hutzel died in 1932. Victor Hutzel remained with the firm until his death nearly a generation later. Following the death of Max Hutzel in 1943, Hugo returned to Muncie after living in Buffalo, New York, Detroit and Kenosha, Wisconsin. In one of his positions he had headed the air conditioning division of the Nash-Kelvinator Co., manufacturers of automobiles and refrigeration equipment. An engineering graduate of the University of Michigan, he died in 1971 at age 82 after a number of years as head of Hutzel & Co.

The firm was engaged not only in domestic and commercial heating and plumbing (and, later, air conditioning) projects but also in major construction. Plumbing and heating systems installed in Ball State buildings from its beginning as a teacher's college in the 1920s until the late 1950s were done by Hutzel; one of the last major projects was Woodworth Residence Halls, completed in 1956. According to Royce Lewis of Muncie, who was with the firm for a number of years beginning soon after Max Hutzel'sdeath, the firm was sold to another company in 1962. But the acquisition did not work out, and a few years later Tibbetts Inc., an Ohio-based mechanical contractor, acquired Hutzel & Co.

Robert Hutzel, son of Max Hutzel, might be the only third-generation survivor of the Hutzel family. A graduate in 1937 of Burris High School and later of the United States Naval Academy, he was a commissioned officer in the Navy through World War II and for many years afterward. Now retired, he lives in Arlington, Virginia.

Max, Victor and Hugo Hutzel were also involved in an organization that in the 1930s and '40s was located on the second floor of their building: The Muncie Club. A social organization of several dozen Muncie businessmen, the club was founded early in the 20th century and met in the Anthony Block, northwest corner of Jackson and Walnut Streets. From there it moved to the second floor of the Arcade Block, on the northwest corner of Main and Elm Streets, and then it moved to the Hutzel Building. In the late 1940s it built its own building across Main Street to the east, and it remains there today. During its stay in the Hutzel Building (and for several years after it moved), The Muncie Club's food and bar service was supervised by Lee Ton, a gentleman of Chinese descent who had the rather ornate title of chef steward. Noon and evening meals were served, and on Sunday nights through World War II, family dinners were held. The club staff included Reuben Poole, who took, over management following Lee Ton's death; Kenneth Ivy and Mary Helen Thomas. Its operation was characteristic of clubs in much larger cities.

Succeeding the club in the Hutzel Building was Muncie Amvets Post 12, a veteran's group newly formed after World War II. The post remained there for a few years before moving to its longtime location

at 3421 S. Walnut St. Then in the 1960s along came the Children's Playhouse, a theater organization founded by Irene Belcher in the late 1930s and operated by her and her husband, longtime Muncie firefighter Aaron Belcher. The playhouse had been in several downtown locations, including east of the courthouse on Walnut Street and in the Commercial Club building on the northeast corner of Jefferson and Main streets. The Hutzel Building was its last location. The theater group disbanded in the late 1960s, but the Belchers remained active with Muncie Civic Theatre, where he was technical director for several years, for the balance of their lives. Numerous businesses have occupied the ground floor of the Hutzel in recent years, including Indiana Dearing Co., Fire Equipment Service Co. and the Pittsburgh Paint Center. Wiley W. Richmond, Indiana, July 28, 1917 - Charles Davis, 45 years old, foreman of the steam fitters for Hutzel and Co., plumbers of Muncie, was fatally injured, and Victor Hutzel, 26, a member of the Hutzel firm, and Albert Glaser, 25, a contractor, also of Muncie, were cut and bruised when an automobile in which they were driving overturned two miles northwest of here at 8 o'clock, this afternoon.

Davis's abdomen was lacerated, exposing; the intestines which could not be returned to their normal position despite the efforts of three physicians. Death occurred at 7:20 o'clock tonight. Relatives in Muncie have been notified. Davis was taken to the Reid Memorial Hospital here, to which place Hutzel and Glaser were taken to have their injuries dressed. Both of the latter were able to leave the hospital immediately.

Glaser sustained a deep cut on the cheek and Hutzel suffered minor cuts and bruises about the body. The trio was returning to Muncie from Eaton, Ohio, in the Hutzel truck, where the men are employed on the construction of the Preble County courthouse. Davis held the wheel while Hutzel, who was driving, lighted his pipe. In going around a curve, Hutzel suddenly grasped at the wheel, and the car swerved from the road and off an embankment. The windshield brace pierced Davis's abdomen. Davis ran a distance of 100 yards to a nearby house, supporting his intestines in his arms.

Tlitus F. Hutzel is a member of the firm of Hutzel & Co., of Ann Arbor, plumbers, steam and gas fitters, and dealers in paints, oils and glass, their place of business being at No. 14 South Main Street. Our subject was born in this county, February 18, 1855, and is the second son of August F. and Sophia (Mann) Hutzel, natives of Germany. Mrs. Hutzel's father was one of the pioneers of the State. Titus F. Hutzel, our subject, received a good education in the city schools of Ann Arbor and on leaving school became an assistant in his father's grocery store.

Not finding this business congenial to his taste, he concluded to change it and learn the tinner's trade with John Shumacher and Weitbreeht, with whom he spent three years. He then traveled as a journeyman for the firm. Leaving them, he went to Detroit and learned the plumbing trade, spending four years at the Detroit Nittle and Heating Works. Returning once more to Ann Arbor, he went into the plumbing business on his own account, continuing the same until the firm of Hutzel & Co. was formed in 1878, devoting his time entirely to the plumbing department of the business.

In 1880, our subject having shown good business ability, was taken in as full partner of the firm, his father being one and his brother Herman the other members' of the firm, incorporating the plumbing business with that of paints, oils and glass. The firm did an extensive business running up to 1889, when the two brothers purchased their father's interest, still continuing business on the same stand, under the firm name of Hutzel and Co.

In addition to their other business Hutzel & Co, have turned their attention to the construction of water-works, having put in the water-works at Ann Arbor, also at Elgin and Streator, 111. Titus F. Hutzel was married in 1884 to Miss Emma Brehm, of Ann Arbor. She was a daughter of Peter Brehm, whose ancestors came from Germany. Mr. and Mrs. Hutzel have had three children: Eleanor L., August F. and Ima. Mr. Hutzel is President of the Ann Arbor Sporting Club, is also a member of the Ann Arbor Workingmen's Society. He and his wife are both members of the German Lutheran Church, in the interests of which they take an active part. They have a handsome residence at No. 81 West Huron Street. Mr. Hutzel has been one of the directors of the Ann Arbor Water Company since its organization. He is also one of the stockholders in the Michigan Furniture Company, as well as being a stockholder in the Ann Arbor Piano and Organ Works. Mr. Hutzel's success in life is entirely due to his own push, pluck and perseverance, from a small beginning having risen to a position of prominence in this community, where he is so well known and thoroughly respected.

Past and Present of Washtenaw County, Michigan by Samuel W. Beakes, Chicago: The S.J. Clarke Publishing Co., 1906:

Titus F. Hutzel. The name of Hutzel has figured for half a century in connection with the business of which Titus F. Hutzel is now a representative and which he has conducted continuously since 1878. His father, August F. Hutzel, came to Ann Arbor in 1838 and entered business life here as a grocer. He likewise became interested in a tannery established by his father-in-law, Henry Mann, and his enterprise and activity contributed to the early commercial and industrial progress and up building of the city. He was married on the 30th of June, 1839, to Miss Sophia Mann, a daughter of Henry and Louisa (Haller) Mann, who came to Ann Arbor May 20, 1830, having made the journey from Detroit with a wagon caravan, it requiring three days to complete the trip. At that time there were only eighteen or twenty houses in Ann Arbor and most of these were not plastered. Mr. Mann became almost immediately a factor in the growth of the embryo city and he purchased a tannery in which he ultimately built up a very extensive and profitable business until his years of labor were crowned with a period of ease, and in honorable retirement from further commercial or industrial pursuits he lived in Ann Arbor up to the time of his death. which occurred August I8, I865. In the family were three children: Emanuel, deceased, who was a druggist and member of the legislature in 1868; Mrs. Louisa Schmid, deceased, whose husband was the first German Lutheran minister in the Territory of Michigan; and Mrs. Sophia Hutzel. August F. Hutzel, after a happy married life of more than a half century, passed away on the 18th of September, 1889, his remains being interred in the German Bethlehem cemetery at Ann Arbor. His widow still survives at the age of eighty-four years. She is a cultured lady, still active, retaining her mental faculties unimpaired. She has a wonderfully retentive memory and can relate most interesting incidents of the early settlement of the county when the wilderness was unsubdued and the district had scarcely been reclaimed from the

domain of the red man. She was born at Stuttgart, Germany, and in 1824 her father came to America, landing at Philadelphia. Soon afterward he went to Mexico but returning to Pennsylvania located at Reading and in 1825 sent for his family to join him. They started in the spring of 1826, traveling down the Rhine, their boat tying up each night, while the passengers sought shelter in the inn of a neighboring village. At Amsterdam they had to wait six weeks for a packet to Philadelphia and the voyage covered seventy days. For four years the family lived in Reading, Mrs. Hutzel being then a little girl. Her father made a prospecting tour to Michigan, walking all the way from Reading to Buffalo, and being greatly pleased with Ann Arbor and Washtenaw County, returned east for his family, and early in the spring of 1830 they started for their new home, traveling in the primitive manner of the times. Mrs. Hutzel has since lived in this city. Her children and grandchildren now number sixty and she also has fifteen greatgrandchildren. She is a most loved member of this now numerous family and as one of the venerable and esteemed pioneer ladies of Washtenaw County we are pleased to present to our readers this brief record of her life.

In the family of August and Sophia (Mann) Hutzel there were fourteen children. Sophia, who is living with her mother, is the widow of the Rev. C. F. Spring, by whom she had the following children: Samuel J. is deceased; Emanuel C. is a member of the firm of Hutzel & Company; August F. is now with the Swift Company at Detroit; Sophie is the wife of Rev. F. Volz, of Saginaw, Michigan; Mary W. and Victor J. are both deceased; Julius T. is a printer of Cedar Rapids, Iowa; Herman G. is a druggist at Unionville, Michigan; G. Adolph is a minister at Bird City, Kansas; Louisa H. is deceased; Hannah M. is at home; Clara C. has passed away; Emma P. and Thusnelda M. are still with their mother. Pauline, the second child of Mr. and Mrs. August Hutzel, is now the widow of Frederick Wurster, by whom she had twelve children, namely: Louise, the widow of Jacob Wolpert, by whom she had one son, Jacob, Jr.; Christine Wurster, at home; August F. and Matilda, both deceased; Ernest M., who married Emma Fiegel; Carl Victor; Pauline; Johannes T., an electrician living in Cedar.Rapids, Iowa; Oscar H., Anna, Albert E. and Henrietta, all at home. Marie, the third member of the family of August Hutzel, died in childhood. Martha, the next younger, married Charles Steinbach, of Chelsea, Michigan, and they had seven children; Henry A., who wedded Mary A. Laney and has two children, Francis C. and Henry B.; C. Otto Steinbach, who wedded Maud Wortley and has one child, Marion; A. Charlotte and Helena L. Steinbach, both at home; Edgar T. Steinbach, a resident of Helena, Montana; and Emily and Albert Steinbach, who are still with their mother. Louise Hutzel, the fifth member of the family, died in 1868. August Herman, a resident of Muncie, Indiana, married Pauline Graf and their children are: Robert A., who married Lulu Spier and is living at Magdeburg, Germany; Melitha, Sophia E., Max H., Hugo and Victor C., all of whom are at home; and Louise, who was just older than Hugo and who is now deceased. Henrietta Hutzel, the next member of the family of August F. Hutzel, is the wife of Eugene K. Frueauff, whose husband is deputy county clerk of Washtenaw county, their home being in Ann Arbor. Titus Frederick Hutzel, whose name introduces this record, is the next of the family, Johnathan F. Hutzel is deceased, Hannah Hutzel is the wife of Henry Heim, of Saginaw, Michigan, who is president of the state board of pharmacy. Their children are: Dr. Arthur H. Heim, a dentist of Unionville, Michigan; Wanda C., Augusta J. and Henry T., all at home. Charlotte Hutzel is living with her mother. Carl Victor Hutzel is deceased. Two children of the family died in infancy.

Titus F. Hutzel was born in Ann Arbor, February 18, 1855, and has spent his entire life in the second ward of the city. He is indebted to its public school advantages for the educational privileges he enjoyed and in early manhood he embarked in his present line of business, establishing a plumbing plant in 1878 at No. 114 South Main Street. The business, however, has been conducted continuously for half a century under the Hutzel name. The original firm of Hutzel & Company consisted of August F. Hutzel, Christian Eberbach and Emanuel Mann. In 1878 this firm was dissolved and August F. Hutzel was joined by his sons, August Herman and Titus F. Hutzel under the firm style of Hutzel & Company. In 1888 the brothers purchased the father's interest and continued the business together until 1893, when Titus F. Hutzel purchased his brother's interest and associated himself with Emanuel C. Spring and Robert Gwinner, who are now carrying on the business under the firm name of Hutzel & Company. The safe, conservative policy inaugurated by its founder has always been maintained. The firm name is a synonym for business integrity and activity and Mr. Hutzel is recognized as a force in commercial circles of this community. He possesses untiring energy, is quick of perception, forms his plans readily and is determined in their execution and his close application to business and his excellent management has brought to him the high degree of prosperity which is today his.

In 1883 Mr. Hutzel was happily married to Miss Emma Brehm, of Ann Arbor, a daughter of Peter and Louise (Limbert) Brehm, at Ann Arbor. They have five children: Eleanore, twenty-one years of age; August F., eighteen years of age; Irma, Ruth and Matilda, aged respectively fifteen, thirteen and ten years and all now in school. Mr. Hutzel is prominent in fraternal and public interests in Ann Arbor. He belongs to the Masonic lodge and to the local German society and is likewise a member of the Bethlehem Evangelical church. That he has the entire confidence and trust of the people among whom he has always lived is indicated by the fact that he has twice been chosen to represent his ward on the board of city aldermen and he is now superintendent of the Ann Arbor Water Company. He is a man of attractive personality, of public spirit and a leader, in business circles of his community. Thoroughly interested in whatever tends to promote the moral, intellectual and material welfare of Ann Arbor, his popularity is well deserved.

Notes for Rev. Dr. Friedrich Volz:

Saginaw - The Rev. A. G. Bergener, of Detroit, on Sunday will preach at St. John's Lutheran Church, in commemoration of the fiftieth anniversary of the ordination of the pastor, the Rev. Frederick Volz. The Rev. Mr. Volz became assistant to his father, the late Rev. Conrad Volz, in 1886, and took full charge on his father retirement in 1900.

During his 50 years' pastorate, he has officiated at 3,378 baptisms, 1,869 confirmations, 2,026 weddings, and 2,370 burials. During this period, the present parsonage and school have been built and the church remodeled.

In 1888, Mr. Volz organized Christ Lutheran Church in Reese, and served it for nine years in addition to his work at St. Johns. An anniversary party will be held in the parish hall Monday night June 15, 1936, and other anniversary events throughout the week. The Rev. Mr. Volz, who has just passed his seventy-second birthday, has two loves in life, his church and his flowers. As he grows older, he lets his garden become a little smaller, but he still putters happily with his trowel among his choice plants and is something of an authority on gladioli.

The Rev. Conrad Volz became pastor of the church in 1854, succeeding his brother Christian, who had served the church for a year previously. Thus, the church has been served by a member of the Volz family for 82 consecutive years. Since 1926, the Rev. Hans F. Knauer has been assistant pastor. The Rev. Mr. Volz's son Emil has followed in his father's footsteps; as a lover of flowers, but not as a pastor. He is professor of floriculture at Iowa State College Ames, lowa.

Ames, Iowa, May 6, 1955 – Prof. and Mrs. E. C. Volz, 619 Ash, were called Monday to Saginaw, Michigan, by the death of Dr. Frederick Volz, father of Prof. Volz. On January 2, 1937, Carriage Manufacturer Ernst Wurster died; he was an Ann Arbor High School graduate in 1901, elected to the Board of Supervisors in 1913, and was elected President of the City Council in 1915, and became Mayor when Charles Sauer died, and served through 1921. He was elected Washtenaw County Sheriff, 1926-1928.

Ernst M. Wurster, who served the city and county in many capacities including those of mayor and

sheriff, died at 4 o'clock Saturday morning January 2, 1937 at his home at 605 E. Jefferson Street at the age of 63 years. He had been ill since September. His life was characterized by his public service which began almost 25 years ago with his election to the board of supervisors. His greatest Victory in politics was his election as sheriff in 1926, the first successful Democratic candidate for this office in 14 years.

Mr. Ernst M. Wurster was elected to the board of supervisors as a member from the First ward of Ann Arbor in 1913, and was returned to the board for another year in the spring of 1914. In 1915, he was elected president of the city council and automatically became acting mayor after the death in December, 1915, of Mayor C. A. Sauer. His term as acting mayor was followed by two terms as mayor. He was elected in 1917 and re-elected, in 1919. His leadership as mayor covered the critical period of the last of the World War and the years immediately following. He ran for sheriff on the Democratic ticket three times. The first time he was defeated by James W. Robison but ran 7,000 ahead of the Democratic ticket and this was the factor which led to the party's selecting him to head the county ticket in 1926. That year he won, defeating Richard Elliott. Two years later, Mr. Wurster was a candidate for re-election but lost. Mr. Wurster's last public office was as city treasurer, a position he held by appointment under Edward W. Staebler, then mayor. Mr. Wurster once was an unsuccessful candidate for probate judge.

Ann Arbor - Ernest M. Wurster, 63 years old, one of the few Democrats ever elected to the offices of Mayor and Sheriff in Ann Arbor, died at his home here Saturday morning Jan. 2, 1937 after a long illness. Wurster became acting mayor in 1915 when, as president of the City Council, he automatically became mayor on the death of Mayor C. A. Sauer. He was re-elected twice thereafter, serving until 1921. He was sheriff in Washtenaw County from 1927 to 1929, and after that was appointed city treasurer for two years. Until he became ill in September, he was employed by State Highway Department as highway inspector. Wurster was a lifelong resident, of Ann Arbor. Funeral services will he ne, at 2 p. m. Monday in the Bethlehem Church.

They were whirled to the county seat, five miles away; routed the deputy clerk of the courts out of bed and got a marriage license. He told her of his success at the university and he came here again to work during the summer vacation. The two were together much.

But in the meantime, another handsome man, and wealthy, favored by the girl's parents, had been trying to win her hand and heart. When Wurster went back to college again, without having asked Jessie to be his wife, she yielded to the persuasions of her other admirer and her family, and consented that her engagement to him be announced. The announcement said that the marriage would take place early in October. In spite of the telegraph strike the news was telegraphed to Jack Wurster at Ann Arbor and he took the first train for Cedar Rapids. The question which he ought to have asked years before now was put with desperate earnestness and it won the answer for which he pleaded. In order, however, to avoid a scene it was planned that she should attend the dinner which had been arranged by a number of friends in honor of herself and Mr. Winne, the groom-elect. When she sprang down the steps of her home and into the big motor car she entered into the fullness of her heart's greatest desire.
