Relatives and friends gathered last Sunday July 8, 1951 to celebrate the 80th birthday of Mrs. Katherine Fritz, a longtime resident of this city. Her birthday was last Tuesday, July 10, but the Sunday celebration afforded a larger gathering. Mrs. Fritz, the former Katherine Schittenhelm, was born in 1871. She came to this country when she was in her late teens. In 1896 he was married to Mr. Fritz. He passed on in 1938. Still very active, "Kate," as she is so well known to Saline people keeps her own house and garden. A few days ago she picked a pan full of cherries for use in some of her famous

baked goods.

Funeral services for Mrs. Katherine Fritz, 83, of 10660 Milan Road, were held Sunday Jan. 13, 1957 at the Lockwood Funeral Home, with the Rev. H. L. Engel officiating. Burial was in Oakwood Cemetery. Mrs. Fritz for the past three years lived with her daughter, Mrs. Arthur Alber at the Milan Road, address. She was taken to the Ridgewood Osteopathic Hospital on December 24. She was born on July 10, 1871, at Oberjettingen, Wurttemberg, Germany. She was the daughter of John and Katherine Dinger Schittenhelm. She came to this country with her parents when she was 17 years old and lived first in Ann Arbor, later in Scio Township and then in Saline. On April 9, 1896, she married John Fritz in Lodi Township. April 25, 2002 - By Renee Lapham Collins Associate Editor In its "World Fact Book," the Central Intelligence Agency defines Cambodia as a "land of paddies and forests dominated by the Mekong River and Tonle Sap," with an estimated population of more than 12 million. The Southeast Asia country grabbed headlines in the 1960s and 1970s when U.S. involvement in Vietnam was at its peak, and in 1975 when more than a million people were killed by communist Khmer Rouge forces. After a 13-year war with its Vietnamese neighbors to the east, the United Nations intervened and helped Cambodians bring some sense of order to their chaotic government. Still, Cambodia is considered a third-world nation filled with poverty, disease, and a population with a life expectancy of less than 60 years. Many families, seeking a better life for their children, abandon them at orphanages, where they are sought for international adoption. Such an orphanage currently is the home of a 7-month-old girl that has been

adopted by Diane and Richard Alber of York Township. The couple, already the parents of four grown children and grandparents as well, have been waiting since December to pick up the daughter they plan to call Malaya. "We received our approval September 12, and found out that the Embassy in Cambodia had received it," says Diane. "We thought, what a blessing, soon we'd get a referral. And on September 28, we did." But allegations of baby trafficking and reports of Cambodian women having their children stolen for sale internationally shook the INS, which already was reeling from the September 11 fallout, and delayed hundreds of foreign adoptions. "We should have had our decree and been able to go and pick her up since we had our approval long before December," says Diane. "But, things were at a standstill because of the Cambodian Embassy, and December 21, the INS called for a moratorium on U.S. families adopting children from Cambodia." The country is one of the most popular for prospective parents because adoptions reportedly are completed much more quickly than in other countries.

"Since the process isn't that long, we expected to have her soon," says Diane. The Albers are concerned for the health of their adopted daughter. In Cambodia, Diane explains, "once children are 8 years old, if they aren't adopted from the orphanages, they are turned out in the streets to try and make it on their own. "Many of the children in the orphanages are sick, malnourished, and need medical attention," she adds. Diane thought at first it was a case of the "empty nest" syndrome, but, once their four children were grown and on their own, "we had time to do other things besides raising children, but we felt like something was missing in our lives." She and Richard first considered adopting another child in 1998, but found that adopting a child from the U.S. was difficult. "We made many calls to many agencies to adopt, and finally I talked with a person that I knew had adopted a U.S. child," Diane recalls. "She told me that if she considered adoption again, she would pursue an international adoption. "Most of the children in the

U.S. are bounced from foster home to foster home before they are placed into adoption. The wait was very long, and the cost overwhelming." Members of Fellowship Baptist Church, the Albers had seen a brochure tacked to the church's bulleting board about a meeting in which they could get more information on adopting a child from China. At that time, they decided the cost was "more than we could afford," but after investigating the possibilities of adopting a U.S. child, they turned again to the international scene. "We decided the Lord was leading us to reconsider China," says Diane. "We searched on the Internet and made many calls, and Finally found an agency." They attended a meeting, put in an application and continued with applying for the I-600-A orphan petition for International Adoption. The process is a long one, but it went smoothly for the Albers. "We didn't know where we would get the money to pursue this, but as time went on, the Lord started to provide income," Diane says. "My son hired me to work as a secretary for his carpet cleaning business, and we gave up our yearly vacation and a new car." As part of the adoption procedure, a social worker had to conduct a home study, and the Albers had to provide proof of income, marriage, birth certificates, and be fingerprinted and investigated by the FBI. "In July 1999, we received our approval to adopt, and our petition was sent to China in August," says Diane. "Then the wait began." Eight months later, the Albers received word that they would be able to adopt a little girl, and in May 2000, they traveled to China to pick up Shiyona, who now is 4. "She runs to every baby she sees," says Diane. "She was raised with a baby in China, and she misses her.

Richard decided that the Lord was again speaking to us to adopt another child, and we asked our social worker what she thought. "She said that if we did indeed adopt another child, we needed to choose a younger child since Shiyona is doing so well." ' Richard says he balked at adopting a child at first, because he felt they had raised their children, but soon changed his mind. Says Diane with a smile, "When we talked about adopting a second child, he was the one who wanted to do it and I was the one who was hesitating. Then, when we talked Richard woke me up one night and said that the Lord told him not to worry about his age. Richard felt it would be best for Shiyona to have a sister to grow up with." Since hearing that their decree has been held up, Diane and Richard have been "faxing, e-mailing, and calling our senators and congressmen. "Some of them are members of the adoption coalition," she says. "Senator Carl Levin is one of them. Senator Debbie Stabenow's office also has been involved in trying to help the families proceed to bring their children home to the U.S." Some families are receiving their decrees, including several who were on the waiting list behind the Albers. In particular, Diane points to actress Angelina Jolie, who with, her husband, Billy Bob Thornton, picked up her adopted Cambodian child while on a location shoot for a new movie in Africa. Jolie starred in *The Bone Collector* and *Lara Croft: Tomb Raider*. According to an article published by the Associated Press, Cambodia is the ninth

largest source of foreign babies adopted by Americans, with upward of 100 children each month being picked up by their new American parents. Diane, who continues to work with their son for Authentic Cleaning, was born and raised in Milan. Her father, Charles Woolcott, was a barber. Richard grew up on a farm in York Township—in fact, the Albers live on property that once belonged to Richard's parents. He graduated from Saline High School with a number of record-breaking performances in track, and now works for Russell Finch and Sons Trucking in Milan. Diane says that she and Richard have a friendly rivalry when the Big Reds and the Hornets face off in prep sports. Three of their children were in the Milan High band program, their youngest attended Saline Schools, and their granddaughters have been involved in Milan swimming. "We really have been blessed," she says. "We love each of our children and grand-children."

The Albers hope to go to Cambodia and bring their new daughter, 7-month-old Malaya, home. children dearly," The Albers have been in touch with a number of other families who are in the same boat—with children awaiting them in Cambodian orphanages. Already, some of them have marched on Washington, D.C. in hopes of expediting the process. In March, the INS announced that dozens of parents who had been waiting for their adopted children could see the paperwork finalized by April. Diane and Richard are hopeful that they will be among those who will finally get their "visa appointment" in Cambodia, the last step before they receive the INS immigration visa for their daughter. A second march is being planned for May, depending on the outcome of the latest announcement. Diane says that she would be willing to go to Washington and be part of the second march because she feels that the INS and state department have not been consistent or fair in determining which children will be allowed to leave the country with new adoptive parents and which will remain behind. "We can only pray that our government is listening to the pleas of other parents and that all the families who are involved in this situation will be allowed to proceed. "The government can change the process later if it needs to be changed, but right now, these children need to be allowed to come home." Diane says she 'and Richard could have adopted another child from China, but age requirements would not allow them to receive a child younger than Shiyona. So they continue to wait. "In our hearts, we feel that these children need families, love, and homes to call their own," says Diane of the Albers' decision to adopt Shiyona and Malaya. "We feel that if we would not have been led to adopt, Shiyona might not have had this opportunity. To hear her say that she loves family and that she has said those words so many times is just awesome. "Having Shiyona has been nothing less than a blessing—we have enjoyed every moment. "The truth is, we are the ones that have received the blessing and our lives would not have been this kind of joy if we hadn't been led to adopt Shiyona."

Michelle Simecek has been teaching in Clarkston for 20 years and has loved every minute of it. On May 30, 2019, the Bailey Lake Elementary third-grade teacher was honored by the Clarkston Foundation as its Teacher of the Year, something she said was very humbling. "I was completely shocked, but very honored," said Simecek. "The whole process itself was very amazing. It really was an incredible time to reflect and look back on what makes me who I am. When I first received the nomination, I thought, 'What am I doing different than other people?' I am who I am – that's my personality. It was a good time to write down my belief statement and what I truly believe. Relationships are truly what is important, making that connection with a child. When we do that, then we can move on to the learning."

Not only are the kids growing and learning, but I am as well. There is always something new to do. When you leave the end of a day, my thought is, 'Have you made a positive impact on someone else?' That comes in so many different avenues that you never know where it will take you."
