Notes for Wilhelm Immanuel Metzger:

Wilhelm Metzger was born in 1894 to Johannes, a baker, and Frederike Metzger, in the town of Wilhelmsdorf, Württemberg, Germany. He joined the German army in 1914, and was soon after sent to the front in France, where he was wounded. When he was well enough to return to duty he was sent to fight in the Alps as a ski trooper, where he served under the Company Commander Irwin Rommel. Walter Metzger still has his father's 'passbook" detailing all of his movements while in the service. Wilhelm was discharged from the army in 1918 and awarded the Iron Cross. Following the footsteps of his father, Wilhelm went to Stuttgart to apprentice as a baker soon had attained the title "Master Baker." He married the daughter of Jacob and Frederika (Steck) Lamparter, Maria, who had grown up on a small farm, which she worked with her mother. Meanwhile, their future partner, Christian Kuhn was also born in Wilhelmsdorf. Christian served in the German army, was captured by the Canadian forces, and released after the war. As it became harder to make a living in the economic climate of Germany, Wilhelm, Marie, and Christian sought passage to the United States.

They were sponsored by Sam Heusel, a German baker who had established himself in Ann Arbor. Sam Heusel was the grandfather of popular radio personality, Ted Heusel who passed away in 2007. Because of immigration quotas, Wilhelm could not bring Marie and their young son Hans, who was born in 1922, to the United States with him in 1923. They were finally permitted to join him fifteen months later. Together the small family ran the Liberty Street boarding house, while Wilhelm also worked at Sam Heusel's "Home Bakery." After working for Sam Heusel, Wilhelm worked as a baker for the University of Michigan for one year, where friend and future University of Michigan Football Coach Bennie Oosterbaan was also working, washing pots and pans.

Marie cooked and cleaned for the family as well as six boarders. Their second child Walter, was born in 1926. When the Flautz family, owner of a local restaurant at 122 West Washington decided to return to their native Germany, they rented their location to the Metzger family and Christian Kuhn. At the same time that Wilhelm and Marie came to the United States, two of Wilhelm's brothers, Fritz and Gottfried, emigrated to the United States. Fritz later bought the Old German from it's original owner, Gottlob Schumacher, who retired in 1946. Gottfried owned the Deluxe Bakery on East Washington, and would supply bread and baked goods to both the Old German and the Metzger's German Restaurant for many years.

"The German American Restaurant" opened on December 8, 1928. They served breakfast, lunch, and dinner to an appreciative American clientele, and business was good. Prohibition was in full swing at the time and alcohol was not permitted in any form. One day, the cider that the Metzger's served was found to have fermented, and the family was severely reprimanded. Wilhelm was placed on probation for five years. And an enormous fine (in those days) of \$100 was applied. Furthermore, a monthly fine was demanded for a total of sixty months. Despite this financial setback, business continued to thrive, until the nation entered the depression of the 1930's starting with the Stock Market Crash in 1929. No one had any

money to spend frivolously, and the family worked long hours to keep its doors open. When Prohibition was repealed, the restaurant was one of the first in Ann Arbor to get a license to serve beer and wine, and things continued to improve.

Among the employees, working for the Metzger's at the time was Herman Weber, later to be the founder of Weber's Restaurant in Ann Arbor. Weber worked in the kitchen of the restaurant from 1934 until 1936 and sold chickens to the restaurant from his family farm. He even taught Walter Metzger to drive a car. In those days, the driving age was only fourteen.

Another setback was to arise in 1936, however, when the Flautz family returned to Germany. The restaurant then relocated to 203 East Washington and took on a new, shorter name, that of Metzger's German Restaurant. This new location was ideal, but for one detail: its front door was within five hundred feet of a church, and the restaurant intended to serve alcohol. In those days, the minimum distance between the front door of an alcohol-serving establishment and the door of a church was 500 feet. After a drawn-out legal battle, the Metzger's came up with a clever idea – to buy the alley behind the restaurant, and make that the main entrance, and neatly sidestep the law. Business improved in 1937, and the family was for the first time able to close Sunday afternoons. By 1938, they could afford to close for the entire day.

Berthilda (Bert) Emelia Wittke, 90, of Ann Arbor, Michigan, passed away peacefully on November 24, 2012 at the Memory Support Center at Brecon Village in Saline, Michigan. Bert was born July 2, 1922, in Wilhelmsdorf, Wurtemburg, Germany to the late Fritz and Bertha Metzger. She is survived by her husband of 65 years, Reinhard Wittke; one daughter Sigrid Wittke (Tom Keskitalo), grandson Eric Wittke, sister Ruth (Stig) Andersen, niece Kirsten Andersen, nephew Peter Andersen of Seattle Washington, niece Crystal Metzger (Robert Hernandez), grandniece Alexis Hernandez, Linda Metzger and grandniece Ashley (Dustin) and Lucy Hopkins. Bert was preceded in death by her parents, her brother, Robert "Bud" Metzger, sister-in-law Gretel Metzger and nephew Mark Metzger.

Notes for Reinhard Wittke:

Reinhard Wittke was born March 15, 1921 in Drossen, Germany (now OsnaLubice in Poland) and immigrated with his family to Sibley, Michigan (annexed to Trenton) in 1926. He attended the University of Michigan and received both his A.B. (1943) and M.A. (1945) in History and his PhD in Medieval History in 1956. From 1943-1946 Wittke taught History and Geography at the junior and high school levels in Trenton, Michigan and Rogers City, Michigan respectively. He served as a teaching assistant between 1946-49 at the University of Michigan.

Wittke married Berthilda (Bert) Emelia Metzger on January 30, 1947. Metzger also immigrated from Germany with her family in 1926 and lived in Ann Arbor. They met while Wittke was working at her family's restaurant, the German Inn in Ann Arbor, during his freshman year at the University of Michigan. They had one daughter, Sigrid.

From 1949-1951, Wittke took a position on the faculty at Mankato State in Minnesota teaching the freshman courses in History. Wittke and his family returned to Michigan in 1952 to assist in Medieval History at the University of Michigan, taking a one year leave from 1953-54 to study on scholarship with the Fulbright Program in Munich, Germany.

Wittke was hired by President Eugene Elliott to begin teaching at Eastern Michigan University (EMU) in the fall of 1956 in the Department of History. During his tenure at EMU, Wittke taught the two-semester sequence of History of Western Civilization, the World in the 20th Century, in addition to his areas of specialty, Medieval and German History which he taught at the graduate and undergraduate levels. Wittke was the first faculty member on campus to offer course via closed-circuit television during a trial period between 1961-63. At the end of the trial, Wittke concluded that if he would be required to teach large numbers of students, he would prefer to deal with them face-to-face, which helped establish the 'mass section' course offering. Beginning in the fall of 1963, for more than 26 semesters, Wittke was responsible for teaching sections ranging from 100 to 450 students. Wittke was one of five finalists chosen by Student Council in 1964 for the first Outstanding Instructor Award, elected to Phi Kappa Phi for the 1979-80 class, and consistently received high marks in his evaluations. He was awarded the Senior Distinguished Faculty Teaching Award in 1981, recognized by the EMU Board of Regents in 1989.

While known for his teaching on campus, Wittke is also best known for his European Travel Study Program (which became International Studies). In 1960, under the title of "The Clinical Approach to History," Wittke travelled to Europe with an averaged size group of 30 mixing travel and lectures throughout Europe. EMU President Brickley wrote, after his visit with the group to Munich, Germany in 1977: "I have told many people here at the University that to listen to a lecture by Dr. Wittke on the unification (or disunification) [sic] of Europe while standing in downtown Munich is an unforgettable experience." Wittke led more than 40 tours, and while most were in Europe, there were also tours to Australia, China and New Zealand.

Active on campus in other capacities, Wittke served on the Faculty Council (now Faculty Senate) and the Curriculum Committee of the Council; board member of Inter-Collegiate Athletics (1962-64); Departmental Executive Committee and History Section Chairman; and the College Personnel and Finance Committee. He also gave lectures on his travels to student groups at area high schools and dormitories on campus as well as area organizations like Rotarty, Kiwanis, Lions, and the "20" Club.

Reinhard Wittke retired 1990 December 31 and was granted emeritus status by the Board of Regents. Wittke continued to travel with students and faculty from Eastern Michigan University and celebrated 47 years of touring in 2007. In 2014, the Reinhard and Bert Wittke Travel Scholarship was established support participation in international travel and study abroad. Preference will be given to graduate students in history section programs, followed by undergraduate students in those programs. Wittke continues to live in Ann Arbor.
