Joseph A. Wurster, Sr., head of one of the oldest wholesale grocery firms in Philadelphia, died Wednesday night Jan 15, 1941, at his home, 908 W. Wyoming Ave. He was 74 and was ill a week. Mr. Wurster established his business at 817 Vine Street, in 1889 and remained at the same address ever since. Two years ago he gave up active participation because of his health and the business was carried on by four sons, all partners in the firm. They are Edwin A., Walter J., Charles I., and Joseph A. Wurster, Jr. According to Mr. Wurster's wish, they will continue the firm under the same name.

Mr. Wurster also is survived by his widow, Mrs. Carrie Ellen Wurster; a daughter, Mrs. Harry Smalley, of Collingswood, New Jersey; 13 grandchildren and one great-grandchild.

Funeral services will be held at 2:30 p.m. tomorrow from the funeral establishment of Harold B. Mulligan, 1119 Lehigh Ave. Burial will be in Northwood cemetery. The body will be on view tonight.

Charles Frederick Wurster Jr. (August 1, 1930 – July 6, 2023) was an American biochemist and environmental activist who was one of the founders of the Environmental Defense Fund (EDF) who were instrumental in the initiation of environmental law and legal action against the use of DDT. He was a professor emeritus at Stony Brook University.

A native Philadelphian, Wurster grew up in Olney, Philadelphia. He began his lifelong involvement in birdwatching when he was a teenager in high school. After high school education at Germantown Friends School, he graduated in 1952 with a bachelor's degree in chemistry from Haverford College. One summer during his youth, he worked in an Alaskan gold mine. After earning a master's degree in organic chemistry from the University of Delaware in 1954, he graduated in 1957 with a Ph.D. in organic chemistry from Stanford University. His thesis advisor was Harry Stone Mosher. For the academic year 1957–58, Wurster was a Fulbright Fellow in Innsbruck, Austria. Wurster was employed from 1959 to 1962 as a researcher by Monsanto and from 1962 to 1965 as a postdoctoral research at Dartmouth College. At Stony Brook University (SBU), he became an assistant professor in 1965 and retired in 1994 as professor emeritus in SBU's School of Marine and Atmospheric Sciences. In 2009, SBU awarded him an honorary degree. He was a visiting professor in Australia, Norway, and South Korea. In 2015, Oxford University Press published Wurster's book about the DDT struggles during the 1960s and 1970s.

The research of Wurster and his collaborators provided scientific evidence for the environmental dangers caused by chlorinated hydrocarbon insecticides. He participated in, and reported on, government hearings that resulted in various bans against the use of DDT. After DDT bans prompted by groups such as the EDF, many bird species quickly recovered. A 1969 paper on DDT residues in connection with fiddler crabs was coauthored by Wurster, George M. Woodwell, and William E. Odum (who was the first son of Eugene Odum). In 1976 Wurster and Arthur P. Cooley suggested that, in many high school and college courses, students' writing of term papers might be replaced by students' writing of petitions. Such petitions to federal, state, or local governments might request changes in policies with environmentally harmful consequences. Wurster and Cooley argued that motivation of students can be enhanced by real-world projects — furthermore, writing petitions can teach the students about their rights and responsibilities as citizens and how to participate in government. Wurster had many collaborators for his numerous scientific articles. R. George Rowland (1941–1990) was often one of Wurster's coauthors. In 1984, Wurster, Rowland, and Paul Lundy published a marine algal bioassay for detecting toxic chemical pollutants.

Wurster was a world class birder and leader for ornithology and ecology tours in the Arctic, Antarctic, Africa, and South America. He made an appearance in the NOVA television documentary Return of the Osprey, originally broadcast in the United States on March 18, 1986. Wurster served on EDF's board of trustees for over 55 years. He also helped to establish the Environmental Defence Society in New Zealand and served on the board of trustees of the Defenders of Wildlife.

Wurster's first wife was Dorothy Hadley Wurster-Hill (1932–2007), a cytogeneticist, an authority on the chromosomes of carnivores, and a faculty member in the Dartmouth Medical School's department of pathology. Before their divorce, Charles and Doris Wurster had a son Steven, who became a woodworker living in McCall, Idaho. Wurster's second wife was Eva Tank-Nielsen, a Norwegian diplomat. Before their divorce, they had a son Erik and a daughter Nina. Nina Wurster made her career in healthcare, but she and her children participate as volunteers for EcoAction Arlington. Erik Wurster became an expert in promoting sustainable energy projects. When Wurster died at age 92 in 2023, he was survived by his three children, four grandchildren, and his longtime companion Marie Gladwish, an artist and world traveler.

A lifelong asthmatic who never smoked, Wurster died at his daughter's home in Arlington, Virginia, from chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD).

July 19, 2023 - Charles F. Wurster, 92, of Silver Spring, Maryland, formerly of Philadelphia, cofounder of the Environmental Defense Fund and professor emeritus of environmental science at Stony

Brook University in New York, died Thursday, July 6, of chronic obstructive pulmonary disease at his home. A pioneer in environmental studies and activism, Dr. Wurster and other scientists, lawyers, economists, and volunteers founded the Environmental Defense Fund in 1967. Their strategy was to confront environmental dangers in courts around the country and provide industrial polluters with economic incentives to change. Those efforts resulted in, among other things, the United States banning the pesticide DDT in 1972, removing lead from paint and gasoline in the 1980s, and cutting sulfur dioxide emissions in half as part of the 1990 Clean Air Act.

In a 2015 interview posted on the EDF website, Dr. Wurster said climate change was the world's next big challenge. "It is a grueling marathon race," he said. "But EDF and the world can win if we all stay committed to fight it with everything we've got." After earning a bachelor's degree in chemistry at Haverford College, a master's degree in organic chemistry at the University of Delaware, and a doctorate in organic chemistry at Stanford University in 1957, Dr. Wurster eventually accepted a job as assistant professor of biological sciences at Stony Brook's Marine Sciences Research Center in 1965. He retired in 1995 as associate professor of environmental toxicology and received an honorary doctorate of science from Stony Brook in 2009. In his acceptance speech, he said: "The power of an idea is brought to fruition by the power of persistence."

Dr. Wurster was indeed tenacious. He served on the EDF's board of trustees for more than five decades and helped it grow to more than three million members in 28 countries. "I've never met a man more doggedly persistent than Charlie," Fred Krupp, president of the EDF, said in a tribute. "Without his legendary perseverance, the ban on DDT might not have been won and [the] Environmental Defense Fund might not have been born." Dr. Wurster published *DDT Wars*, a firsthand account of the EDF's early days, in 2015, and told Cat Lazaroff in an online interview that is posted on the Haverford website: "We were up against the biggest, most powerful opponents you can find. And we beat them. ... When you get thrown out of court, you don't go away. You go back and knock again. You keep banging on the system."

Dr. Wurster also helped establish the Environmental Defence Society in New Zealand, and he sat on international panels, committees, and commissions, including the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's Pesticides Policy Advisory Committee in the late 1970s.

He was on the board of directors at Defenders of Wildlife and traveled to Australia, Norway, South Korea, and elsewhere as a visiting professor and scientist. He received a 1991 Excellence Award from the State University of New York United University Professions, a 1977 Community Service Citation from Long Island University, and a 1972 alumni award from Haverford. "He was always interested in the natural world and talked often of its tremendous value and beauty," said his son Erik.

Charles Frederick Wurster Jr. was born Aug. 1, 1930, in Philadelphia. He grew up in the Olney neighborhood and graduated from Germantown Friends School. A nonsmoker, he lived with asthma for much of his life. He was a star pitcher on the baseball teams at Germantown Friends and Haverford, and spent one summer when he was young working in a gold mine in Alaska. He spent a few years as a chemist at Monsanto Research Corp. after college and first noticed the effects of DDT on birds while working as a biological science research associate at Dartmouth College in the early 1960s.

He married Doris Hadley, and they had son Steven. After a divorce, he married Eva Tank-Nielsen, and they had daughter Nina and son Erik. They divorced later. His first former wife died earlier. He and longtime partner Marie Gladwish were together for many years. A lifelong birder, Dr. Wurster led ornithology and ecology tours to Africa, South America, the Arctic, Antarctica, and elsewhere around the world. He could identify dozens of songbirds and appeared in the 1986 TV documentary *Return of the Osprey*. He liked to garden, make family dinners, and fix things around the house. "He was an attentive father," said his son Erik.

Dr. Wurster returned often to class reunions at Germantown Friends and Haverford, and gave this advice to listeners at Stony Brook in 2009: "Seek work that you love. Don't settle only for dollars, mansions, or yachts so that you thank God it's Friday. Make the world a better place. You will also be better, and it's much more fun." In addition to his children, partner, and former wife, Dr. Wurster is survived by four grandchildren and other relatives. Thomas Tweed is the W. Harold and Martha Welch Professor of American Studies at the University of Notre Dame, where he was also previously the director of the Rafat and Zoreen Ansari Institute for Global Engagement with Religion in its inaugural year. His research interests include the comparative and interdisciplinary study of religion, culture, migration, transnationalism, peace, and justice, sustainability, Buddhism, Catholicism, and architecture and landscape. He has been a Kellogg Institute faculty fellow since 2018.

He holds a number of affiliations at Notre Dame, where he is the Harold and Martha Welch Professor of American Studies and a member of the leadership council of the Keough School of Global Affairs. Nov. 14, 1984 - For more than a year, Gerald Tweed has been comatose in a nursing home bed, his brain nearly dead, his 27-year-old body racked by chronic infection. Antibiotics have kept Mr. Tweed alive. His wife and three brothers and sisters now want to let him die. His mother agrees her son would be better off buried, but fears he will feel pain as infection takes its course. The disagreement has put the case, which lawyers believe is the first right-to-die litigation in Pennsylvania, in Northampton County Orphan's Court, which Carole Tweed petitioned last month to halt procedures prolonging her husband's life.

Mrs. Tweed and her husband's sisters, Patricia Tweed-Kent of Vestal, New York, 28 years old, and Kathleen Tweed of Huntingdon, Pa., 25, and his brother, Thomas Tweed, 29, a doctoral candidate in religious studies at Stanford University, say the patient would want to die. She Fears Pain Is Felt.

But Mr. Tweed's mother, Janet Tweed of Philadelphia, 57, argues that allowing her son to be killed by the infections attacking his lungs and intestinal tract would amount to torture. She says doctors have no way to know if his brain, although almost dead, registers pain. "I'm sure that he wouldn't want to be slowly tortured to death," Mrs. Tweed said. "I would be glad to see him die if God wills it."

Unlike most other right-to-die cases, this case involves a therapy that most doctors consider routine, antibiotics. At issue is the clash between a patient's right to end life-saving treatment under privacy laws and the state's interest in preserving life. In her petition, Carole Tweed included a letter from Dr. Tamar D. Earnest, who treated Mr. Tweed after his motorcycle was struck by a car in Allentown on April 2, 1983. "Mr. Tweed's body may survive for a long period of time," Dr. Earnest said. "But, in terms of the personality and the brain functions we associate with human behavior, Mr. Tweed is no longer with us."

Thomas Tweed said he had no doubt that his brother would rather die than lie in a hopeless state. Support Is VoicedThe bottom line is that if Jerry could make a decision about this, there is absolutely no doubt he would want to have this incredible suffering, this incredible indignity, terminated," he said. Mrs. Tweed-Kent said, "We're supporting the petition because we feel that's what our brother Jerry would want under the circumstances." A hearing on Carole Tweed's petition is expected to be held in January before Judge Robert A. Freedberg.

Jan. 5, 1985 - Gerald J. Tweed, a motorcycle accident victim who had been comatose since April 1983 and whose family was divided over whether he should be kept alive with medication, has died before the issue could be argued in court. The case - which lawyers said would probably be dropped - would have been the first in Pennsylvania to test the right of a comatose patient's family to decide whether he should live or die. Twenty-one months after he suffered severe head and other injuries in the accident, Tweed was brought to St. Luke's Hospital in Bethlehem on Dec. 31, still comatose but also suffering from "an apparent allergic reaction, possibly

to some type or medication." said Martha Cusimano, a hospital spokeswoman. "It's not established what it was," she said yesterday. He died Wednesday. "I feel the obvious deep sadness at the loss of him, combined with some sense of relief that his incredible suffering and the indignity of the situation are finally ended." Tweed's brother, Thomas, said.

Thomas Tweed had supported the efforts of Tweed's wife, Carole Devey Tweed, a 26-year-old teacher from Bethlehem, who in October filed a court petition seeking the power to "authorize the discontinuance" of all extraordinary procedures for sustaining Gerald J. Tweed's vital processes." She was scheduled to argue in Northampton County Orphans Court later this month that, in her husband's case, the extraordinary procedures included the antibiotics be routinely received intravenously, as well as the administration of oxygen during his periodic bouts with pneumonia. She was also supported by her husband's two sisters, Patricia Kent-Tweed of Vestal, New York, and Katherine Tweed of Huntingdon, Pennsylvania.

Tweed, 27, was "gregarious, energetic, strong-willed, fiercely independent and extremely proud," Thomas, 29, a doctoral candidate in religious studies at Stanford University, said last month from his home in Palo Alto, California. "We are convinced he would want to be freed from this indignity and suffering. That's the crucial legal and moral issue to us." "If we could have relieved his suffering and indignity without going to court, we would have done so," he said yesterday from a relative's home in Haverford. They were opposed by Tweed's mother, Janet Wurster Tweed, 57, of Northeast Philadelphia, who recently took a housekeeping job in Bethlehem to be near her son, her lawyers said.

Janet Tweed, who is widowed, contended that because her son was able to breathe without a machine, it was premature to withdraw medication and other aids that sustained his life. A 1983 Pennsylvania law defines brain death as the "irreversible cessation of all functions of the entire brain, including the brain stem," which controls breathing. The President's Commission for the Study of Ethical Problems in Medicine and Biomedical and Behavioral Research has also recommended a definition that says death occurs when the brain stem stops functioning. "Gerald Tweed is far from dying," one of his mother's attorneys, Frank Doocey of Coopersburg, said last month. "If he couldn't breathe on his own, even Janet Tweed would agree that prolonging his life would be cruel, but he isn't at that stage." "It's awful," she said. "It's drastically quiet. We went from six to two to none. We went from 32 loads of laundry a week to hardly anything. It's a very different lifestyle, and we are trying to figure out the transition. What do I do now — volunteer, go back to work?"

Tweed-Kent is filling part of her time mentoring a single young mother of nearly 2-year-old twins. "The biggest thing is that you just have to have so much patience," Tweed-Kent said. "You have to remember that you leave an imprint on these kids that will last a lifetime. What they do in the first six years of their life is critical. If you treat them with kindness, they will learn kindness." Tweed-Kent said she received valuable advice — let the kids be her guide — from an aunt who raised three sets of twins. If they had different abilities, treat them appropriately. If they want to always be together, let them. If they want to be apart, help them.

Life will thrust them together enough, Tweed-Kent said. Like the time her twins took a math test and got the same question wrong and did the math the same (incorrect) way. "I think being a parent is giving a kid the feeling that they can do anything, empowering them and letting them think beyond what they may think is possible," she said.
