June 21, 1945 - T. Cpl. Samuel Gall, Jr., is spending a 45-day furlough with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Samuel Gall, the first furlough he has bad since he went into service 31 months ago. After four months of training in Texas was sent landed at Casablanca on March 9, 1943. He went through the African campaign, being stationed at Bizerte. From there he was sent to Sardinia with his outfit, Hdq. Battery, 533rd AAA Bn., AWM for harbor installations and airfield protection, for 11 months. He reached Marseilles, France 15, 1944, and then went to the front lines at Aydoille for artillery protection.

They crossed the Siegfried line at Wiesenberg and thence to Offenbach, Mutlerstadt and to Heidelberg, the University City. From Heidelberg he went to Dallau where he visited one of Germany's underground factories. This particular factory was hidden in the side of a mountain and camouflaged with shrubbery. He states that it was absolutely invisible to any passerby. Motors for airplanes were made there From Dallau they went to Kochersteinfeld, to Mainhardt, Goppingen and Winterreiden, He left his outfit at Fussen near the Austrian border on a detachment furlough on April 30 to begin his trek homeward. They went by truck from Essen through the Black Forests to Saarburg, France. Then a three-day train trip to Marseilles where he was on V-E Day in camp awaiting embarkation. He spent the next 21 days coming through the Straits of Gibralter and though the South Atlantic, and was told upon arrival in New York on Jun e2 that this was the last convoy to cross the Atlantic in the blackout, which accounted for the long voyage. The convoy made up 37 ships, have four non-casualty troops to arrive in New York from the European front. His boat was the "Moses Austin." The last night before reaching the States was a sleepless one for all men aboard. They knew they would reach the mainland during the night or early morning and paced the decks all night watching for the first sight of the Statue of Liberty, and "The Old Lady" was finally caught sight of about 5 in the morning by one of the men who gave the alarm and the boys swarmed the decks half-dressed or win whatever state the alarm overtook them.

While in action he states that he averaged about seven warm meals a month and never milk, which he particularly carved. They would become so exhausted that they could sleep amid any amount of noise or falling debris. Cpl. Gal will report again for duty at Fort Sheridan on July 2, and since this is a detachment furlough begun before V-E Day he faces the possibility of being sent back to join his outfit. He has been awarded the Bronze Medal for shooting down a plane with one shot while on the Rhine.

This, she says, could be a reason why the Miss Saline Pageant is so important to them. DeeDe Starling Bormann, Katrene's daughter, wore the Miss Saline
