"Charlie Gehringer is in a rut. He hits .350 on Opening Day and stays there all season." - Lefty Gomez, joking about Gehringer's hitting prowess

Charlie Gehringer, who played all his nineteen years in the majors with the Detroit Tigers, was American League MVP in 1937 and second in the MVP voting in 1934. He ranks (as of 2007) 19th all time in both runs scored and doubles. A many-talented player, Gehringer led the league in stolen bases, doubles, triples, runs scored and hits in 1929, but did not figure in MVP voting that year. Gehringer, who was called "The Mechanical Man" because of his consistent approach to the game, played before there were Gold Glove awards, but was a good defensive player for much of his career. He was also named as one of Detroit's "G-Men", along with Goose Goslin (who was with the team during Gehringer's great 1934 and 1937 years) and Hank Greenberg (who became a regular with the Tigers in 1933).

Gehringer came up originally at age 21 in 1924. Born in Michigan, he was at the University of Michigan in 1923 and played in the Michigan-Ontario League before coming up with Michigan's major league team, the Tigers. He played most of 1925 at Toronto. He became a regular in 1926, at a time when Ty Cobb was player-manager and Harry Heilmann and Heinie Manush were in the outfield. Manush won the batting championship that year, hitting 101 points higher than Gehringer. Later, Gehringer would give Cobb credit for teaching him how to swing. Gehringer hit 60 doubles in 1936, putting him # 6 on the all-time single-season list.

After his baseball career he joined the Navy in 1942 and stayed for four years. Thereafter he ran a successful auto accessories business. He was also general manager for the Tigers for a couple years and vice president of the Tigers after that. Before he died in 1993 he was the oldest living member of the Hall of Fame.

Widely regarded as one of the greatest second basemen of all time, Gehringer was elected to the Baseball Hall of Fame in 1949. During his career, Gehringer compiled a .320 batting average and had seven seasons with more than 200 hits -- a hit total never reached in a season by Ted Williams or Mickey Mantle and reached only once by Willie Mays. He was the American League batting champion in 1937 with a .371 average and was also named the American League's Most Valuable Player. He was among the Top 10 vote recipients in the Most Valuable Player voting for seven straight years from 1932-1938. He was the starting second baseman and played every inning of the first six All Star Games. His career totals of 2,839 hits and 574 doubles both rank 19th in Major League history.

Gehringer also led the Tigers to three American League pennants (1934, 1935, and 1940) and one World Series Championship (1935). Gehringer hit .379 and .375 in the 1934 and 1935 World Series. Gehringer was

also one of the best fielding second basemen in history, having led all American League second basemen in fielding percentage and assists seven times. His 7,068 assists is the second highest total in major league history for a second baseman. He also collected 5,369 putouts as a second basemen (the 6th highest total for a second baseman) and 1,444 double plays (the 7th highest total for a second baseman). Known for his consistency as a hitter and fielder, Gehringer was given the nickname "The Mechanical Man" by Yankee pitcher Lefty Gomez.[2] Teammate Doc Cramer quipped: "You wind him up Opening Day and forget him." A durable player, Gehringer had two consecutive game streaks of more than 500 games—one from 1927-1931 and the other from 1931-1935.

Early Years: 1922-1926

Gehringer grew up on a farm outside Fowlerville, Michigan. In 1922, he enrolled at the University of Michigan, about 30 miles from the family farm. Gehringer took physical education classes and played basketball and baseball. Gehringer later recalled that he lettered in basketball but not baseball.

In the fall of 1923, after his first year at the University of Michigan, Gehringer was discovered by Detroit Tigers left fielder Bobby Veach. Veach heard about Gehringer, and brought him down to Navin Field to work out for a week and show the Tigers what he could do. (Anthony Connor, "Voices from Cooperstown" (1982), p. 37) Player-manager Ty Cobb was reportedly so impressed with Gehringer that he asked club owner, Frank Navin, to sign Gehringer to a contract on the spot. "I knew Charlie would hit and I was so anxious to sign him that I didn't even take the time to change out of my uniform before rushing him into the front office to sign a contract." Ty Cobb

In 1924, Gehringer played with London Tecumsehs in the Class B Michigan Ontario League. He was called up briefly at the end of September and played five games for the Tigers, batting .462 in 13 at bats. Nevertheless, the 21-year-old Gehringer returned to the minor leagues where he played in 1925 for the Toronto Maple Leafs of the International League, and 8 games with the Tigers.

Gehringer's first full season in the big leagues was 1926, which was also Ty Cobb's last season as the Tigers' player-manager. At first, Gehringer recalled that Cobb "was like a father to me." Gehringer's father had died in 1924. Cobb even made Gehringer use his own bat. According to Gehringer, Cobb's bat was "a thin little thing," and though Gehringer would have preferred a bigger bat, "I didn't dare use another one." Gehringer hit .277 in his first full season, and collected 17 triples (2nd best in the American League). Cobb and Gehringer subsequently had a falling out, and Gehringer later described Cobb as "a real hateful guy." (Al Stump, Cobb: The Life and Times of the Meanest Man Who Ever Played Baseball (1994), p. 419)

Playing for the "small ball" oriented Cobb, Gehringer also had a career-high 27 sacrifice hits in 1926. Six Tigers from the Cobb era (Donie Bush, Ty Cobb, Harry Heilmann, Bobby Veach, Sam Crawford, and Ossie Vitt) rank in the Top 50 all time for sacrifice hits.[7] After Cobb's departure, Gehringer never again came close to 27 sacrifice hits.

Gehringer Becomes A Star: 1927-1933

In 1927, the Tigers had a new manager in George Moriarty and a lineup full of great hitters, including Heinie Manush, Harry Heilmann, Lu Blue, and Bob Fothergill. The 1927 season was also the beginning of Gehringer's many seasons as a reliable .300 hitter. In 1927, he hit .317 and scored 110 runs – 4th best in the American League. He also led American League second basemen with 438 assists and 84 double plays.

In 1928, he played in all 154 games for the Tigers, hit .320, collected 193 hits (5th best in the league), scored 108 runs (5th best in the league), and had 507 assists (best in the league for a 2nd baseman). At the end of the 1928 season, Gehringer placed 19th in the voting for the American League's Most Valuable Player.

Gehringer's steady improvement as a hitter continued in 1929, as he hit .339 with an on base percentage of .405, a slugging percentage of .532, and 106 RBIs. He also led the American League in many offensive categories, including hits (215), doubles (45), triples (19, including 3 in one game), runs (131), and stolen bases (27). He also led the league in putouts (404) and fielding percentage (.975) by a second basemen.

Gehringer's consecutive game streak continued in 1930, as he played in every game of the 1928, 1929, and 1930 seasons. In 1930, he hit .330 with a .404 on base percentage and a .534 slugging percentage (9th best in the American League). He also scored 144 runs (3rd best in the league) and collected 201 hits, 78 extra base hits, 47 doubles (3rd in the league), 15 triples (5th in the league), and 19 stolen bases (2nd in the league).

Each year from 1926-1930, Gehringer improved his statistics in the three triple crown categories (batting average, home runs and RBIs). The only other player to do that for five years running is Rogers Hornsby.

In relative terms, 1931 was an "off" year for Gehringer. His consecutive game streak ended, as he played in 101 games. He also fell below the .300 mark (batting .298) for the only time between 1926 and 1941. Gehringer still had a fine year by most standards, and ended up No. 17 in the 1931 American League MVP voting.

In 1932, Gehringer was back at full strength, playing in 152 games and hitting .325 with 112 runs, 107 RBIs, and 44 doubles (2nd best in the league). Not generally known a power hitter, Gehringer even hit 19 home runs in 1932, 7th best in the American League. At the end of the year, Gehringer was 9th in the league's MVP voting.

In 1933, the "Mechanical Man" continued his string of consistent seasons, playing in 155 games, batting .330 (5th best in the American League), and collecting 204 hits (2nd in the league), 42 doubles (4th in the league), 105 RBIs, and a career-high 542 assists (best in the league for 2nd basemen). Gehringer was once again among the top vote recipients in the 1933 MVP voting, this time placing 6th.

A Quiet Man

Gehringer had a reputation as quiet and unassuming. Player-manager Mickey Cochrane joked that "Charlie says `hello' on Opening Day, `goodbye' on closing day, and in between hits .350."

Gehringer acknowledged his quiet demeanor: "I wasn't a rabble rouser. I wasn't a big noisemaker in the

infield, which a lot of managers think you've got to be or you're not showing. But I don't think it contributes much." Gehringer also had a sense of humor about his reputation. At a civic banquet in his honor, Gehringer's entire speech consisted of the following: "I'm known around baseball as saying very little, and I'm not going to spoil my reputation." When asked why he signed his name "Chas. Gehringer," he responded: "Why use seven letters when four will do?" On another occasion, when asked about his closed-lip reputation, he responded: "Not true; if somebody asked me a question, I would answer them. If they said, 'Pass the salt,' I would pass the salt."

His unassuming nature is also reflected in his reaction to a "Charlie Gehringer Day" held by the Tigers in 1929. Fans from Gehringer's hometown and throughout Detroit filled the stands for a 17-13 win over the Yankees. Gehringer handled 10 chances at second base, had four hits including a home run, and stole home. In a ceremony, the people of Fowlerville presented Gehringer with a set of golf clubs. Though the clubs were right-handed, and Gehringer was left-handed, Gehringer learned to golf right-handed rather than trade for a left-handed set of clubs. [9]

Back-to-Back Pennants in 1934 and 1935

In 1934, Gehringer had his best year to date, playing all 154 games and leading the Tigers to their first American League pennant in 25 years. His .356 batting average and .450 on base percentage were both 2nd best in the league. He led the league in runs scored with 134 and hits with 214. He was also among the league leaders in doubles with 42 (2nd best in the league) and RBIs with a career-high 127 (5th best in the league). Gehringer finished 2nd in the American League MVP voting, just 2 points behind Detroit's player-manager, Mickey Cochrane.

The Detroit infield in the mid-1930s was one of the best-hitting combinations in major league history. With Hank Greenberg at first, Gehringer at second, Billy Rogell at shortstop, and Marv Owen at third, the 1934 Tigers infield collected 769 hits (214 by Gehringer, 201 by Greenberg, 179 by Owen and 175 by Rogell), 462 RBIs (139 by Greenberg, 127 by Gehringer, 100 by Rogell, and 96 by Owen), and 179 doubles (63 by Greenberg, 50 by Gehringer, 34 by Owen and 32 by Rogell). Three members of the 1934 Tigers infield (Gehringer, Owen and Rogell) played in all 154 games, and the fourth (Greenberg) played in 153.

Gehringer's 127 RBIs in 1934 is all the more remarkable given the fact that he played in the same lineup with one of the greatest RBI men of all time, Hank Greenberg. Gehringer later recalled that Greenberg would tell him: "Just get the runner over to third," so Hank could drive them in. Gehringer noted that "Hank loved those RBIs," to the point that Gehringer once kidded Greenberg: "You'd trip a runner coming around third base just so you could knock him in yourself."

The 1934 World Series was a match-up between St. Louis's "Gashouse Gang" and Detroit's' "G-Men" (so named because of stars Gehringer, Hank Greenberg, and Goose Goslin). Even 50 years later, Gehringer (interviewed in 1982) felt the Tigers were robbed of the 1934 championship by umpire Brick Owens. Detroit was ahead 3 games to 2, and in Gehringer's view "we should've won the sixth game." Late in the game, Brick Owens called Mickey Cochrane out on a play at third base "even though all of the photographs show that he was safe by a mile." Gehringer insisted that, if Cochrane had been called safe, "we would've had the bases loaded with nobody out and we could've had a big inning." The Tigers wound up losing Game 6 by one run. They then lost Game 7 in an 11-0 shutout thrown by Dizzy Dean, despite a 2-for-4 game from Gehringer. Gehringer can't be faulted for the World Series loss, as he played all seven games, batting .379 with an on base percentage of .438 and a .517 slugging percentage.

In 1935, Gehringer and the Tigers won a World Series, beating the Chicago Cubs 4 games to 2. For the year, Gehringer hit .330 with a .409 on base percentage and a .502 slugging percentage, collecting 201 hits, 123 runs, 108 RBIs, and 19 home runs. Once again, Gehringer was among the top vote getters in the MVP race, again losing to one of his own teammates, Hank Greenberg. Gehringer also continued his consistent hitting into the 1935 World Series, where he played all six games, and hit

.375 with a .423 on base percentage, a .500 slugging percentage and 4 RBIs.

After the 1934 season, Gehringer was part of the Major League All Star tour of Japan. The American team included Gehringer, Babe Ruth, Lou Gehrig, and Jimmie Foxx. They played 18 games against a Japanese All Star Team. The American team won all 18 games by a combined score of 189 to 39, but on November 20, 1934, 17-year-old Eiji Sawamura pitched seven shutout innings and had consecutive strikeouts of Gehringer, Ruth, Gehrig, and Foxx. Gehringer recalled that, during batting practice, the Japanese fans would fill the 60,000 seat ballpark for every game. (Anthony Connor, "Voices from Cooperstown," p. 240.)

Life in the Off-Season

During the off-season, Gehringer worked as a sales clerk in the downtown Detroit Hudson's. He also spent many years barnstorming with other Major League players. One year, he traveled with a touring group from the Negro Leagues, including Satchel Paige, Buck Leonard, Judy Johnson, and Mule Suttles. Gehringer recalled that trying to hit Paige's fastball and hesitation pitch was "no fun." Satchel Paige is also quoted as saying that Charlie was the best white hitter he ever pitched against.

An MVP Award and Batting Crown

Although the 1936 Tigers finished in 2nd place, 19-1/2 games behind the Yankees, the 33-year-old Gehringer may have had his best season. He led the American League in assists, double plays, and fielding percentage by a second baseman. And he had career-bests in hits (227) slugging percentage (.555), runs (144), extra base hits (87), total bases (356) and runs created (152). He also had a career-low 13 strikeouts in 641 at bats during the 1936 season. That equates to a strikeout every 49.3 times at bat. He finished 4th in the MVP voting, as Lou Gehrig became the only non-Tiger to win the MVP award from 1934-1937.

Gehringer finally secured his own American League Most Valuable Player trophy, and a batting crown, in 1937. Gehringer won the batting championship with a career-high .371 batting average and placed 2nd in on base percentage with another career-high .458. The 1937 season also saw Gehringer collect 209 hits (his 7th 200 hit season) and score 133 runs (one of twelve 100-plus run seasons).

In 1938, Gehringer had another solid year, batting .306 with a .425 on base percentage (6th best in the American League), 133 runs (3rd best in the league), and career-highs in bases on balls with 113 (4th best in the league), and home runs with 20. Gehringer finished 10th in MVP voting in 1938. Rogell and Gehringer

Gehringer played over 1,000 games with Billy Rogell as his double play partner at shortstop, making them one of the longest tenured double-play combinations in the history of the game. The two twice led the league in double plays. Rogell's fiery demeanor was a stark contrast to the calm, quiet demeanor of Gehringer. On one occasion, after both failed to cover second on a steal attempt, player-manager Mickey Cochrane charged out from behind the plate shouting at Rogell and Gehringer. As reported in The New Bill James Historical Baseball Abstract: "Rogell, astonished, looked at Gehringer to see if he was going to say anything. Gehringer, of course, had nothing to say. 'Goddamn you,' yelled Rogell. 'Don't you come charging out here telling me how to play shortstop. You go back there and do the catching, and I'll play shortstop. If I'm not good enough, you can find someone else.' Cochrane went back to his own position."

Gehringer's Advice for Breaking Out of a Slump

Gehringer believed that "worry" can shorten your career and life. Gehringer recalled that, when he was in a bad slump, he and his roommate Chief Bender decided to go out on the town and forget about baseball. "But I played, and it was uncanny! I hit the fences with four straight line drives. I was so relaxed!" (Anthony O'Connor, "Voices from Cooperstown," pp. 158–159)

Final Years and the Hall of Fame

Charlie Gehringer's number 2 was retired by the Detroit Tigers in 1983. Although he missed a number of games in the 1939 and 1940 seasons, he continued to hit above .300, batting .325 in 1939 and .313 in 1940. On May 27, 1939, Gehringer became the first player in major league history to hit for the cycle and do it in order: a single, followed by double, a triple, and then a home run. The 1940 season also saw the Tigers return to the World Series after four straight years of dominance by the Yankees. Gehringer finished 14th in the MVP voting in 1939 and dropped to 23rd in 1940. Gehringer hit .214 in 28 at bats in a losing effort in the 1940 World Series against the Cincinnati Reds.

In 1941, Gehringer's 17 seasons began to catch up with him. His batting average dropped almost 100 points to .220, but with 95 walks (5th best in the American League) his on base percentage remained high at .363. In 1942, Gehringer lost the starting second baseman's job to a young Billy Hitchcock. Gehringer played only three games at 2nd base in 1942, finding himself relegated to a pinch-hitting role. He hit .267 with a .365 on base percentage in his final year.

Gehringer enlisted in the U.S. Navy after the 1942 season. He served three years and was released in 1945. Gehringer considered making a comeback at age 41. "I came out of the service in such good shape that I felt I could've played a few years." Instead, Gehringer went into business selling fabrics to automobile manufacturers.

In 1949, Gehringer was elected to the Baseball Hall of Fame by the Baseball Writers. Gehringer received 159 votes on 187 ballots (85.03%).

Gehringer and his Mother

During his Major League career, Gehringer lived with his mother in Detroit. Gehringer's father died in 1924, and Gehringer moved her from the family farm outside Fowlerville, Michigan to Detroit. Gehringer recalled that she was a diabetic and "needed someone to look after her."[9] Gehringer speculated that he might have married earlier (he didn't marry until he was 42) "but I couldn't see bringing a wife into that kind of situation." Gehringer noted that his mother was a "great fan" who would either come out to the ballpark to watch her son play or listen to Harry Heilmann's radio broadcasts on the porch.

Gehringer did not marry until after his mother died, and when he did get married in 1949, he did not let anything stand in the way—not even his induction into the Baseball Hall of Fame. Gehringer missed his Hall of Fame induction ceremony on June 13, 1949, because he did not want it to interfere with his wedding, which was to take place five days later.

Life After Baseball

In 1950, Tigers' owner, Walter Briggs asked Gehringer to be the Tigers' general manager, and he agreed to do so. Gehringer later said that the job was a "nightmare." As he put it: "We had a lousy ball club, and I'd been away from baseball at that time for ten years. I didn't know who was and who wasn't." After serving as the Tigers' general manager from 1951-1953, Gehringer was given the title of Tigers vice president in the mid-1950s. He went back to his business selling fabric to the automobile companies, continuing with the company until 1974 when he sold his interest in the business.

Gehringer also served as a member of the Baseball Hall of Fame Committee on Veterans from 1953-1990. At a 1983 ceremony in Tiger Stadium, the Tigers retired uniform numbers 2 and 5 worn for many years by teammates Gehringer and Hank Greenberg. Both players attended the ceremony. At age 82, Gehringer served as the American League honorary captain at the 1986 Major League Baseball All-Star Game at the Astrodome in Houston, Texas. Gehringer died in Bloomfield Hills, Michigan at age 89. In 1999, he ranked Number 46 on The Sporting News list of the 100 Greatest Baseball Players, and was nominated as a finalist for the Major League Baseball All-Century Team. Also in 1999, Sports Illustrated published a list of "The 50 Greatest Sports Figures From Michigan" (in all sports), and ranked Gehringer third on the list behind Joe Louis and Magic Johnson. "The 50 Greatest Sports Figures From Michigan," Sports Illustrated, December 27, 1999.

Notes for John Andrew Smoltz:

John Smoltz - This article was written by Warren Corbett

The Atlanta Braves' three aces may be the greatest pitching combination in history: the artist Greg Maddux, the stylist Tom Glavine, and the electric John Smoltz. In seven seasons, from 1993 through 1999, the Braves won almost two-thirds of the games started by their Big Three. Maddux claimed four straight Cy Young Awards, Glavine two Cys, and Smoltz one. Atlanta pitching coach Leo Mazzone said Smoltz "had the best stuff of all of them. Greatest slider I've ever seen from a right-handed pitcher. Powerful fastball.A nasty split-finger.A changeup.And a curveball." 1 Smoltz owed his 22-year career to a live arm, determination, and medical science.

When the Braves won an unequaled 14 consecutive division championships from 1991 through 2005, Smoltz was the only player to celebrate everyone.2 His election to the National Baseball Hall of Fame in 2015 came one year after Maddux and Glavine were inducted along with manager Bobby Cox. Smoltz is the only pitcher to record more than 200 victories and more than 150 saves, but that is a junk statistic; Dennis Eckersley totaled 197 victories to go with 390 saves. Smoltz's unique achievement was his excellence as a starter, then a closer, then a starter again. He led the National League in wins at age 29, in saves at 35, and in wins at 39.

Before all that, Johnny Smoltz was a good boy. John Andrew Smoltz was born on May 15, 1967, in Detroit but grew up in Lansing, Michigan, the eldest of three children of John Adam Smoltz and the former Mary Tersigni. His father, a salesman and a joker, embarrassed the children when he decorated his car to look like the calculators he was selling. Both parents moonlighted as accordion teachers. Johnny joined the family business when he was 4, playing at polka parties and winning prizes for musicianship. By age 7 he set a new goal. He told his mother he would be a professional baseball player. Fine, she said, but you should have a backup plan, just in case. Okay, the boy replied, I'll be a gas-station attendant.

In the Smoltz home, the rule was "God first, family second, schoolwork third, athletics fourth."3 Baseball became Johnny's obsession. He spent hours bouncing a rubber ball off the side of the house, pitching the seventh game of the World Series while providing his own play-by-play broadcast, imitating the voice he heard on the radio, Ernie Harwell. As a teenager he didn't go to parties and generally avoided trouble, channeling his energy to the diamond and the basketball court. He described his younger self as "a people pleaser."4

Johnny's grandfather John Frank Smoltz worked for the Detroit Tigers for three decades as an usher and groundskeeper. (His father also worked briefly as an usher.) When Johnny was a junior at Waverly High, the granddad persuaded a Tigers executive to send a scout to see the boy pitch. Scout Ken Madeja was not happy to be chasing yet another tip on somebody's son or nephew or grandson, but he reported back, "This time we got a good tip. This kid is pretty good." Other teams were taking notice, and several scouts told Johnny he would likely be drafted in the first three rounds. His hometown school, Michigan State, had offered a baseball scholarship, so word got around that he might be difficult to sign. He fell to the 22nd round, when the Tigers claimed him with the 574th pick of the 1985 draft. At the time of his election, Smoltz was the lowest draft choice to make the Hall of Fame.

The Tigers' interest picked up after Smoltz was chosen for the junior Team USA that summer and pitched, and lost, the Junior Olympics championship game to Cuba. He was invited to Tiger Stadium for a workout. While the club negotiated with his father, Johnny was lining up his freshman class schedule and dorm room. He signed the night before classes started. Joining the favorite team of his childhood was "almost too good to be true." Smoltz was not an immediate success in pro ball. Although he was promoted to Double A in his second season, his ERA for the Eastern League's Glens Falls Tigers was 5.68 in August 1987, with a 4-10 record, when lightning struck. An infamous (in Detroit) trade with Atlanta brought the Tigers a veteran right-hander, Doyle Alexander, who went 9-0 as a two-month rental to help the club win the American League East championship.

In return for Alexander, Detroit gave Atlanta a choice between two young pitchers, left-hander Steve Searcy and Smoltz. Years later the Tigers' then-GM, Bill Lajoie, said, "Smoltz had not done anything out of the ordinary to indicate that he would become the pitcher he has become."7 But the Braves scouts saw a 6-foot-3 stringbean, just 20 years old, who might be special. The Atlanta Journal-Constitution said the Braves' new acquisition was "known for throwing hard but not always accurately." Smoltz was distraught, feeling rejected by his hometown team and dispatched to the depths of hell, or at least the National League. "As far as I was concerned, the Braves were the worst team in all of baseball." He wasn't far wrong; the club was bad and getting worse. The Braves did have something the Tigers did not: minor-league pitching coaches. Smoltz said the roving coaches in the Detroit system had given him little instruction, and the advice he had received was often contradictory. Joining Atlanta's Triple-A club in Richmond, he began a 19-year collaboration with Leo Mazzone. Mazzone didn't tamper with Smoltz's mechanics, "one of the most beautiful deliveries I'd ever seen." Instead, he concentrated on improving the youngster's curve and slider.

Improvement came quickly. Smoltz posted a 2.79 ERA at Richmond before Atlanta called him up in July 1988. The frightened 21-year-old made his debut for the last-place Braves against the first-place Mets. Shea Stadium was packed for Tom Seaver Day. Smoltz allowed only one run and four hits in eight innings before Bruce Sutter closed out the rookie's first victory. He won just once more and finished with a 5.48 ERA, but the next year he made the All-Star team in his first full season. The Braves lost 300 games in Smoltz's first three seasons, finishing last in the NL West every year. While losing, the club was assembling a core of pitchers who were promoted as the "Young Guns." Tom Glavine had been called up after the Alexander-Smoltz trade, and Smoltz never let him forget how he got to the majors first. Pete Smith, Tommy Greene, and Derek Lilliquist

showed early promise. Steve Avery and Kent Mercker, a pair of first-round draft choices, joined the staff in 1990. Smoltz thought they benefited from being rushed to the majors with a lousy team, under no pressure to win: "We weren't very good so we had to get our brains beat out and learned from it."

General manager Bobby Cox moved into the manager's chair in midseason 1990 and John Schuerholz took over as GM. They added veteran third baseman Terry Pendleton and first baseman Sid Bream to a young nucleus of hitters including David Justice and Ron Gant. Clearly the Braves were getting better, but no one anticipated the magic of 1991. Smoltz almost didn't make it for Atlanta's worst-to-first surge. By the All-Star break he stood at 2-11 with a 5.16 ERA. His confidence had collapsed. "Anytime things started to get a little hairy, I would begin to unravel; ... it became a foregone conclusion in my mind that once runners were on, they were going to score." In desperation, Schuerholz suggested he see a psychologist, Jack Llewellyn. Llewellyn calls himself a mental-development coach. After a few sessions with his new patient, Llewellyn gave him a video showing some of his best performances and told him to watch it before every start. "Remembering my little highlight reel helped me break out of it and banish the negative thoughts from my head," Smoltz said. He went 12-2, 2.63 in the second half, then shut out Pittsburgh in the seventh game of the League Championship Series to send Atlanta to the World Series.

That shutout established Smoltz's reputation as a big-game pitcher. He went on to set postseason records with 15 victories (since surpassed by Andy Pettitte) and 199 strikeouts. But the biggest Game Seven of his life is known as the Jack Morris game, not the John Smoltz game. In the deciding contest of the 1991 World Series, Smoltz shut out the Minnesota Twins until he was relieved in the eighth. Morris, refusing to come out, pitched 10 scoreless innings for the victory that sealed the championship. That was the start of Atlanta's run of 14 straight division titles and the first of many postseason letdowns. The club made it to the World Series five times but won just one championship. After another disappointment in the 1992 Series, Atlanta signed free agent right-hander Greg Maddux, that year's Cy Young Award winner with the Cubs. He joined the 1991 Cy Young winner, Glavine, and Smoltz at the top of the rotation. The three maintained an intense, though unspoken, competition; nobody wanted to be left behind. Smoltz knew where he stood. "My sense is that I was the guy riding in the backseat most of the time," he acknowledged. "As good as Greg was, Tom was right up there with him." With the Big Three and a changing cast of supporting pitchers, Atlanta allowed the fewest runs in the National League for 11 straight seasons, 1992-2002.

The trio bonded over their mutual love of practical jokes, trash talk, and golf. All were dedicated golfers, but Smoltz was the most fanatical – and the best. He also served as the concierge who arranged tee times and rental cars. Of course, he insisted there was more to it than play. "Golf is the closest thing to the anticipation of getting ready to pitch a game," he said. "There are all kinds of things that can go wrong, and it's about how you handle them and what your process is like. When you pitch, you make 115 pitches and decisions, and golf is the same." Even as he topped the league in strikeouts and starts in 1992, Smoltz began suffering elbow pain. Atlanta's orthopedic surgeon had told him he had, in layman's terms, extraordinarily loose joints. Smoltz thought his flexibility made him a better pitcher, but it also made him a pitching time bomb. By 1994 he had to shut down in July and underwent elbow surgery to remove a bone spur and chips shortly before the season was canceled because of the players' strike.

He rejoined the rotation as the Braves won their only World Series in 1995, over Cleveland. The next year he moved into the front seat, leading the league in wins with 24 and in strikeouts with almost 10 per nine innings. He won 14 straight decisions. The spectacular season earned him the Cy Young Award (Maddux had won the previous four). In 1996, pitching coach Mazzone said, "John Smoltz was as awesome and dominant a pitcher as I've ever seen."

Smoltz capped the season with one of his best World Series performances. After beating the Yankees in Game One, he came back in the fifth game to strike out 10, allowing just four hits in eight innings. Only two Yankees reached third base, one of them after center fielder Marquis Grissom muffed a fly ball. That man scored an unearned run and Andy Petitte shut out the Braves for a 1-0 victory. Smoltz said it was the best game of his life, but added, "My arm, for the last seven innings, I ain't lying, my arm was tired, hurting." The Yankees won the Series to begin their own dominant run, claiming four championships in five years. Smoltz signed a four-year contract at an average \$7.75 million per year, making him briefly the highest-paid pitcher in the game.

In 1997 he led the league in innings pitched for the second straight year while dealing with more elbow pain. After the season he needed a second arthroscopic surgery. Although he posted a 17-3 record in 1998, around two trips to the disabled list, the pain didn't go away. There were days when he couldn't stand to throw a slider. "I am absolutely serious when I say that I pitched some of my greatest games in some of my worst conditions," he said. The team doctor told him Tommy John surgery was inevitable, but he resisted. By August 1999, he told a reporter, "I'm at the point right now where I just don't know how long it's going to last. It's pitch to pitch, start to start now." To relieve the pain, he gave up throwing overhand and dropped to a low three-quarters, almost side-arm, delivery. "I basically taught myself how to pitch a whole new way," he said. "Nobody knew how hard it was. I was trying to fake it." The elbow gave out during spring training in 2000. Smoltz made the dreaded visit to the pitcher's best friend, surgeon James Andrews, for an elbow ligament replacement that cost him the entire season. Returning in 2001, he managed just five starts before heading back to the DL. Along with Cox and Mazzone, Smoltz concluded that his elbow couldn't stand up to pitching a full game every fifth day. The club sent him to the bullpen and by the end of the season he had taken over as the closer. He recorded 10 saves in 11 chances, then finished all three games of the Division Series as the Braves swept Houston. It was the last postseason series the Braves wor; they lost the league championship to Arizona.

Smoltz called the fall of 2001 the Offseason from Hell. With his contract expiring, the Braves told him they wanted him back, but only as a reliever. He balked. He had organized his life around a starting pitcher's schedule, waking up early on his days off to take his children to school and play golf. When he tested free

agency, at least half a dozen teams offered him a starting job. The Yankees put a reported \$52 million on the table for four years. After agonizing and praying, Smoltz accepted a \$30 million, three-year deal, with an option for a fourth year, to close for Atlanta. "I looked at the total picture," he said. "Family, lifestyle, my charity and community work, financial, friends and family. And baseball." He, his wife, Dyan, and their four children were settled in the community and he was leading a fundraising drive to build a new Christian school.

Smoltz had won 159 games as a starter; now he was a reluctant reliever. His personality didn't seem to fit the role. He was hyperactive and something of a control freak. Fellow reliever Mike Remlinger said, "If he's awake, he's full tilt. He's like a 10-year-old." He had to come to the ballpark every day and sit around for six hours waiting to learn whether he would pitch. Smoltz asserted control over his new environment by renovating Turner Field's bullpen, paying to install air-conditioning and bringing a favorite recliner from home. In his second outing of 2002, Smoltz entered a tie game against the Mets in the ninth and was rocked for eight runs. For the rest of the season he was nearly automatic. He set a National League record with 55 saves (matched by Eric Gagne the next year) while blowing only four opportunities. In 2003 he was even more dominant, with his fastball clocked at 99 mph. He allowed just eight walks and eight earned runs in 64? innings for a 1.12 ERA, with 45 saves in 49 opportunities. He saved 44 more in 2004. In 3½ years, Smoltz racked up a 91 percent success rate closing games. But he had to visit Dr. Andrews again after the 2004 season to clean out more chips in his battered elbow.

Smoltz had accepted the bullpen assignment to preserve his elbow, but he eventually concluded that closing was more dangerous than starting because he was throwing all-out all the time. With Smoltz owning the ninth inning, the Braves had won four more division titles but never advanced past the first round of the playoffs. The Ted Turner era in Atlanta had ended and the new owner, Time Warner, squeezed the club's budget. Glavine and Maddux had left as free agents because the team couldn't afford them. Smoltz believed he could contribute more as a starter. Now he had to convince GM John Schuerholz. Smoltz made his pitch over dinner at McCormick and Schmick's in December 2004. Schuerholz was skeptical that his arm could hold up for 200 innings; Smoltz hadn't reached that level since 1997. Smoltz told him, "Take my baseball card and turn it over." Schuerholz agreed to bet on his track record as a starter. It was a gamble at long odds on a pitcher who was nearly 38 years old with an elbow that belonged in a medical textbook. On Opening Day in 2005 Smoltz made his first start in almost four years. The Florida Marlins knocked him out in the second inning after he gave up seven runs. Schuerholz's bet looked like a loser.

Five days later Smoltz struck out 15 Mets, matching his career high, and held them scoreless for 7? innings before he served up a two-run homer. Pedro Martinez pitched a two-hitter to beat him. Smoltz took his place at the top of the Braves rotation, leading the team with 33 starts, 229? innings, and a 1.145 WHIP. He finished 14-7, 3.06. The elbow held up, but he developed pain in his shoulder. He won Game Two of the Division Series against Houston on "pure grit," Schuerholz said. It was the Braves' only postseason victory as their run of division championships finally ended. Smoltz tied for the NL lead with 16 wins in 2006, followed by 14 the next year. On May 24, 2007, he recorded his 200th career victory when he defeated the Mets. Losing pitcher: Tom Glavine. But shoulder pain sent Smoltz to the disabled list two months later. He opened the 2008 season taking a shot of Novocaine before every start. When he could no longer pitch through the pain, he underwent arthroscopic surgery in June.

Smoltz was determined to keep pitching, but the ball club was no longer willing to gamble on a 42-year-old. Schuerholz offered a contract for 2009 loaded with incentives tied to health and performance. Smoltz's 22 years as a Brave ended with him and Schuerholz barking at each other through the media. For many, his departure turned out the lights on the brightest era in the club's history. "I lost a brother," teammate Chipper Jones said. "If he's retiring, that's one thing. But for him to be playing somewhere else is unacceptable." Unacceptable or not, it was a fact. Smoltz signed with the Boston Red Sox, even though he wouldn't be able to pitch until June. He interrupted his minor-league rehab stint to get married. He and his first wife had divorced in 2007. His new bride, Kathryn Darden, was a divorcee with two children. Smoltz joined the Red Sox rotation on June 25. He labored through eight starts, most of them ugly, before Boston released him and his 8.33 ERA. He still refused to quit. The St. Louis Cardinals were willing to give him a shot. In his first start for St. Louis he struck out seven in a row and shut out San Diego for five innings. That was his only victory for the Cardinals, but he pitched well enough to earn a spot on the postseason roster. Relieving in Game Three of the Division Series, he struck out five straight Dodgers in two innings.

The Cardinals did not invite Smoltz back for 2010. He began a new career as a broadcaster with TBS, the television home of the Braves. Later he joined MLB Network as a studio and game analyst. He appeared at ease in front of cameras and brought an endless supply of corny jokes. (San Francisco's Candlestick Park was so cold because "there was a Giant fan in every seat.") Still craving competition, Smoltz looked forward to joining the PGA's Champions Tour for senior golfers. One of Smoltz's TV assignments took him to Cooperstown, New York, to cover the induction of Maddux, Glavine, and Cox into baseball's Hall of Fame in 2014. Smoltz followed them into the Hall in 2015, the first year he was eligible. Among the many tributes was this from Bobby Cox: "When John was on the mound, you always thought you were going to win a ballgame."

April 12, 2012 - Lima Township (AP) -- Authorities say a fire destroyed a 150-year-old wooden barn on a family farm near Ann Arbor, killing about 300 animals. The fire broke out Wednesday at the farm in Lima Township, about 12 miles west of Ann Arbor. Owner Douglas Welshans says the dead animals include a horse, a steer, about 200 rabbits, 50 hens and 50 chicks. He says his daughters planned to show some of the rabbits and chickens and the steer at the Washtenaw County 4-H show this summer. The horse was a mare named Tina and was a gift to the girls from another family. Authorities say about 40 firefighters from Chelsea, Dexter, Manchester, Saline and Scio Township battled the blaze for about an hour. Smoke billows from a red-hot barn fire in Lima Township as cattle stand outside Wednesday.

Robin Welshans and other family members huddled together in the driveway Wednesday afternoon wiping away tears and ash from their faces as firefighters unrolled caution tape around the smoldering remnants of their centennial barn. Lying heavily on their hearts was the knowledge that more than 300 animals, including rabbits, chicks, a horse and a steer, had perished in the fast-burning blaze, which reduced the barn and everything in it to a pile of rubble.

The family took comfort in the fact that at least no one was inside the barn, at Scio Church and Parker roads in Lima Township, when the fire broke out. But the loss still hurt deeply. Douglas Welshans said his wife met his daughters, ages 10 and 12, at school to tell them about the fire so they did not discover it when they came home on the bus. They cried, he said. "That's their life. We don't do sports and stuff," Welshans said.

The loss is compounded by the fact that he doesn't have insurance to cover it, Welshans said. The animals and equipment alone were probably worth \$50,000, he said. Besides the steer and the horse, the fire killed about 200 rabbits, about 50 hens and 50 young chicks, Welshans said. His daughters had planned to show some of the rabbits and chickens and the steer at the Washtenaw County 4-H show this summer. The horse, a mare named Tina, was a gift to the girls from another family. Besides the animals and barn, which was family-owned for 150 years, Welshans said he lost hay equipment as well as cages and other equipment used to show the rabbits.

The fire was reported, apparently by a neighbor, around 11 a.m. About 40 firefighters from Chelsea, Dexter, Scio Township, Manchester and Saline battled the blaze, which took about an hour to get under control, said Chelsea Fire Chief Jim Payeur. Firefighters were at the scene for about five hours, Payeur said. "With that heavy timber construction ... it's very dense material so it takes a tremendous amount of water to penetrate," he said. The cause of the fire still is under investigation, he said Wednesday evening. He didn't have a damage estimate. As Douglas Welshans pondered the future Wednesday evening, he wasn't sure whether the family would replace the animals. "Possibly," he said. "We haven't really got to that stage yet."

April 16, 2012 - Sisters Madison and Bailey Welshans are back at home and have a new pet show rabbit just days after a fast-moving fire destroyed a large barn on the Lima Township family farm last Wednesday. The girls stayed with friends in the days following the fire, which killed more than 300 animals, as parents Douglas and Robin Welshans began the long process of cleaning up. The girls arrived home Saturday afternoon to find a group of about 16 volunteers - family, friends and strangers - clearing rubble from the site of the fire. In fact, the girls said, they pitched in, moving rocks and other debris as part of the group.

The girls also were surprised over the weekend by the arrival of Carly, a black Mini Rex show rabbit, a gift from an American Rabbit Breeders Association judge. They also have three new fish in a tank in the living room. The girls lost all of their show rabbits and chickens, about 300 small animals in total, as well as a steer, and a horse in the fire. The family farm is about 150 years old. And although the new little bunny can never replace Pumpkin, Frosty, or Skittles, a few of the bunnies that perished in the blaze, Carly's arrival did put a smile on the girls' faces.

Plus, the girls said they are excited about the impending arrival of a pair of lambs, which they plan to show, along with new rabbits and chickens at the 4-H Youth Show in July.

Madison, a fourth-grade student at Wylie School in Dexter, said she'd already picked out a name for her lamb: Lucy. Bailey, a sixth-grader at Creekside, said she hadn't thought about a name for her new pet lamb, but she is looking forward to the arrival of some new chickens and rabbits next month. The girls are getting Speckled Sussex and Columbian Wyandotte chickens, which were ordered before the fire, their father said. The family was joined Saturday by the volunteers who helped them clean up the area where once a 40' X 80' white barn stood. Once the area is cleaned of debris, the family plans to replace the barn, but in the meantime, there is still a lot of work to do. "It's all so overwhelming, the offers of help and the donations," said Douglas Welshans. "We want people to know, family, friends, people from out of

town, people we didn't even know, how much we appreciated their help."

In addition to the large barn, several out buildings caught fire, and a small portion of the Welshans' home was charred. "In one day," Robin Welshans said, "Thanks to everyone's help, we got almost one building completely cleaned up." She said about 16 people worked most of the day as part of the cleanup efforts. The family plans two more work days the next two Saturdays beginning at 9 a.m. In addition to the small animals, the family raises cattle, and seven cows and one calf survived the blaze because they were outside in pastures. The family arrived home from church Sunday to find several rabbit cages and chicken laying nests, feeders, bowls and other rabbit and chicken equipment had been dropped off at the farm at the corner of Scio Church and Parker roads while they were gone. The family was worried that more potential sorrow would hit them Sunday after their beloved 8-year-old yellow Labrador retriever Daisy ran away from home. But the family received good news Monday when a Saline resident saw the dog running scared on Scio Church Road. Daisy was "very upset" with all the commotion, the storms that blew through the area Sunday and the fire, Robin Welshans said.

In addition to 4-H competitions, Madison and Bailey show four breeds of rabbits as junior exhibitors at American Rabbit Breeders' Association shows. The sisters raise Californians, Holland lops, Mini Rex and Havana rabbits and said they are looking forward to working with their new bunnies — whenever they arrive and there's a place to house them. Their 4-H leader, Cathie Mason, is working with the rabbit community to find the girls more rabbits in time for upcoming 4-H competitions.

A fund has been set up at Chelsea State Bank to assist the family in rebuilding the barn, which could not be insured because of its age, and to help replace the estimated \$50,000 worth of animals and equipment lost in the fire. In addition, a bank account has been set up in Robin Welshans' name at the University of Michigan Credit Union, 4440 Jackson Road, in Ann Arbor or donations can be sent to the Welshans Family, P.O.
