This is the call and response that echoed through our worship spaces on Easter morning, and as we find ourselves continuing through the season of Easter for several more weeks, we know that the promise of the risen Lord has been fulfilled, and yet we still long for more.

The eggs have been found, the meals have been enjoyed, families have all returned to their own homes and lives, and we find ourselves back in the routine we so often find ourselves.

For some of us, the season of Easter is a blessed one, filled with spring flowers, new beginnings and hopeful anticipation.

For others, now that the celebration has ended, it feels hard to keep up the appearance. We just want to know how the good news we hear on Easter morning can possibly still be good news today. We find ourselves like so many others in those days and weeks following the first Easter wondering, what comes next? To answer this question, we turn to the end, which points us to what's next.

For the second Sunday in Easter, our lectionary turns us to the book of Revelation, a book of the Bible most often avoided for fear of it's dark and confusing images and metaphors. But so much of this particular book is beautiful imagery and a reminder of God's presence in the world.

Revelation means "to make known." What is being made known is God's constant and ever loving presence in the world, and our own lives. Revelation 1:4 says, "Grace to you and peace from him who is and who was and who is to come..." This is the Revelation of Jesus Christ and the good news for us all this Easter season. Wherever we find ourselves this spring, through excitement, new possibilities, grief, loss, uncertainty, or any other emotion we know that Jesus Christ has been through it, is still going through it with us, and will always accompany us in our lives. The resurrection promise was what the disciples were waiting for in those days after the crucifixion. And the promise was fulfilled. We in this day are waiting for the resurrection promise to be fulfilled again, and we know that in our waiting, we have a God who is, who was and who is still to come.

Let us pray,

God of love, the empty tomb has been our destination all this time. But we see, with Mary Magdalene, that this is not a place to stop. This is not the end toward which we have been traveling. This is the beginning. Amen.


