It was about that time when my grandmother took a trip to see her sister and brother-in-law in Oregon. She returned with stories about her visit, a toy for me, and with a wooden token... "A Round Tuit." The next time grandpa said, "I'll do it, when I get around to it," Grandma promptly walked over to his is recliner and forced that wooden token in his hand. After which they both had a good laugh. I'm not sure that he was any speedier about fulfilling repair requests after getting his Round Tuit, but this story has caused me to reflect on whether, I've been

waiting for someone to give me a Round Tuit when it comes to my life of faith.



God in Christ has already given us everything that we need. We don't need a Round Tuit to take action, but we might need a nudge to get us up and moving. God calls us to care for our neighbor, the stranger in our midst, the widow, the orphan, and the poor. As the Grand Forks area heads back to school this August, we are keenly aware of the needs of others. Acts 20:35, where Jesus says, "It is more blessed to give than to receives," reminds us that we are called to be generous with our time, not only our financial resources. We derive happiness and fulfillment by helping others. It is a spiritual blessing of generosity and selfless service. Or consider, Philippians 2:4, "Let each of you look not only to our own interests, but also to the interests of others."

Organizations all over the county are working to help school children and families get what they need. As servants of God, we hear this calling too!

- Calvary is collecting school supplies for children at Lewis and Clark.
- We are seeking financial support for the Lewis and Clark Backpack program, a partnership with the Northland Resue Mission. Last year, 98 children received backpacks from Calvary each month.
- Each month we collect nonperishable food items for St. Joe's Food Pantry.
- Pack food in February for Feed My Starving Children (FMSC).
- Volunteer with Global Friends Coalition, which welcomes new Americans to the Grand Forks area and helps meet their basic needs.
- Participate in the Honduras Rummage Sale or even, go on the trip in 2026.
- There are lots of ways to get involved in the ministries of Calvary: Sunday/Wednesday School teacher, greeters, ushers, scripture readers, assisting minister, musicians, tech crew, altar guild, coffee hour volunteers, etc.

"It Takes A Village" to make the ministries of any congregation a success. We don't need Round Tuits to be servants of Christ, we GET to do that every day because of the surpassing joy of knowing God through Christ. Though, we might need a little reminder to help make us aware of the needs of those around us. So, people of Calvary, this article is your - Round Tuit!

In August we will join the Calvary community for the special polka music worship featuring the polka band from the Fargo Sons of Norway.


#### **CIRCLE GROUPS**

## Synod Assembly Recap

On June 7-8, 2025, members of Calvary Lutheran Church attended the Eastern North Dakota Synod, ELCA, Synod Assembly. We gathered under the theme "Grace upon Grace," a reference of what we each receive as a result of Christ's Incarnation (cf. John 1:16). There were a total of 263 people in attendance (177 lay voting members; 70 rostered minister voting members; 16 visitors). The business items included hearing reports from officers, adopting the Synod Mission Plan (budget), elections for Synod Secretary, Synod Treasurer, Synod Council and Synod Committees, and adopting the 2026 Compensation and Benefit Guidelines. Participants also heard a State of the Synod report from Bishop Tessa Moon Leiseth and State of the ELCA report from our churchwide representative, Rev. Tim Brown. Two keynote presentations were shared by Rev. Tim Brown, ELCA Director of Congregational Stewardship. There were nine workshops offered for participants on a variety of topics. Rostered Ministers and congregations celebrating significant anniversaries were acknowledged.

Rev. Brown's keynote addresses focused on how sharing and telling stories about what our congregations are doing is vital to the mission of the gospel in and through our congregations.

Dave Tack, said about the assembly, "I really appreciated my second experience at the Synod Assembly and was reminded how excellent our group of representative congregations are. I really appreciated the opportunity to learn from all who were there, and I especially enjoyed and learned much from the featured speaker, Pastor Tim Brown."

Another voting member, Alyson White, commented, "Stewardship is discipleship which is very biblical. My biggest takeaway from the Synod Assembly is we must encourage each other to tell our stories. Stories influence us, especially in our generosity (financial and otherwise) and how we invite new members."

Several of the voting members from Calvary attended a workshop on Narrative Budgeting, this is a way of telling the stories of how the money shared with the congregation will be used. "Sure, we can present the budget as a table filled with numbers, but it is the stories that are compelling," said Pastor Jared. "Calvary has so many stories to tell! We did some of this storytelling in Calvary's combined worship/annual meeting in January," added Pastor Jared.

Calvary should be very proud. We were among the few congregations that brought a bright and thoughtful youth voting member! Gabby Tack, a high schooler, said of the Synod Assembly, "I thought the Synod Assembly was very spiritually awakening, and brought me closer to my faith on a local level. It was really cool to see what goes on inside the church, and to be a part of the process."

"What a wonderful, spiritually uplifting weekend! I just keep learning more and more at these events", said Alyson White.

When he asked, the open rate (meaning out of all the people who receives the email, how many of them open it) was at 46%. His goal was to have it go up to 50% for the year. He can say, it is exactly at a 50% open rate and he wants to thank everyone for doing their part on staying updated and increasing the open rate by 4%.

#### **Communication Updates in September**

One of the things Marcus has worked on this summer is coming up with ways to update and modernize some of our communications. Some of the updates that will happen in September will be:

- Calvary Calling a simple redesign that looks more modern and helps the flow of reading
- **Website** the hope is that the website will be updated regularly and be more user friendly. The website will look clunky for a little while because all the updates wont happen in one day as it takes some time.
- **Sermon Videos** we have the whole service available to be re-watched but these videos will only be the sermon from the prior Sunday/Wednesday. With this happening we will be
- uploading these sermon videos to a YouTube account so keep an eye out for how to follow our page on YouTube.
- **Branding (new font pairing)** the fonts have been upated to a pairing that is more modern and traditional, which Marcus believes represents the whole church.
