10:30 a.m. Worship in the Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall April brings us to the conclusion of our Lenten journey with Holy Week. During this week, we walk day by day through the last week of Jesus' life beginning with his entry into Jerusalem, a shared meal in the upper room and the washings of feet, the betraval and arrest in the garden, the denial of devoted followers, the abuse and mock trial at the hands of his accusers, Jesus' death on the cross, and the silence of the tomb of Holy Saturday. All of Jesus' love is met by the ferocity and backlash of political and religious leaders who opposed the living Christ. And it is against the backdrop and darkness of Holy Saturday that Easter morning comes the risen Christ proclaims a brilliant "Yes!" in the face of the world's, "no." Yes to sinners, yes to forgiveness, yes to welcoming the stranger, yes to women, yes to God's ways of justice and mercy, yes to care for the hungry, oppressed, orphaned, widowed and vulnerable. And yes to using our unjust mammon to serve the world and all whom God has made. In response to God's YES, say "yes" to joining us in worship during Holy Week at Calvary Lutheran Church.

LET'S HAVE A "GREAT CONVERSATION" PASTOR JARED CARSON

Talking with others can be challenging. My grandmother used to remind me, "God gave us two ears and one mouth for a reason...so that we could listen more and talk less." Maybe you had a grandparent with the same wisdom. I fear that my vocation makes it hard at times to put the wisdom of my grandmother into practice. Pastors are expected to speak publicly, preach. Through seminary Pastoral Care classes, I learned to ask more open-ended



questions, which allow a conversation partner to share freely. And beyond asking open-ended questions, I have had to practice active listening and attentiveness. I do hope in some way, that as your Interim Pastor, I have been able to make space and model this at Calvary Lutheran Church and in my pastoral conversations.

The wisdom of my grandmother is reflected in the scriptures too. From the book of James (1:19), "Know this, my beloved brothers and sisters, let every person be quick to hear, slow to speak, slow to anger." Or from the wisdom writings of Proverbs (18:2), "A fool takes no pleasure in understanding, but only in expressing his (or her) opinion." We don't need to look too hard to identify some of the chief culprits in our society. Yet, it seems easier to hear the "siren's call" of verbose speaking or sound-bite politics, rather than rooting ourselves in the faith and humility of Jesus Christ. For early Christians, Jesus is the personification of Wisdom from the Hebrew Bible.



Wednesday, April 16 at 7 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion To help us all practice listening, I would like to invite members of Calvary and the community to participate in a "Great Conversation" on *Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion*, Wednesday, April 16 from 7-8:30 p.m. This "Great Conversation" will be an opportunity to engage with others in civil public discourse. Engaging in conversation will give each of us time for thoughtful listening and reflection. Together, we will listen to the joys and concerns of other participants. We may agree or disagree with others' views, but as people of faith we are rooted in the conviction that all people are made in the image of God and therefore endowed with dignity and divine worth. This kind of conversation invites us to see others as beloved children of God. Sure, we may not solve all the world's problems, but if we can't even engage in civil discourse together, why would we suspect that we would do it on our own.

For those participants from Calvary or other faith communities engaging in these conversations is gospel-centered ministry in Jesus' name. In doing this we cultivate and nurture a sense of belonging among participants. We belong to Christ, in whom we are baptized, and we belong to each other... warts and all! God in the power of the Holy Spirit brings us together through our shared conviction that we are linked to the life, ministry, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Thanks be to God for you the members and friends of Calvary Lutheran Church. You are the children of God, the salt of the earth, the light on a hill, yeast in the dough, which is enlivening the Grand Forks community and this corner of North Dakota.

Highlights of the **CHURCH COUNCIL**

FINANCE - 2025 FINANCE REPORT

Calvary's February income was received at a much lower level than expected when comparing to the prior year. The timing of Lent is a factor when comparing giving on a monthly level. In 2024, Ash Wednesday occurred on February 14, whereas in the current year, Ash Wednesday was three weeks later on March 5.

February events included welcoming new members and education opportunities for 1st and 2nd graders. Calvary welcomed 21 new members in February. First graders were invited to remember their baptism and second graders discussed how they picture God and created artwork to share with the congregation. Noisy offering February was collected for the four agencies (CVIC, Ernie's Place, Global Friends, Journey Home Animal Rescue) recognized at the ELCA Youth Night in the amount of \$780.68

Year-to-date income through February was 11% lower than the five-year average while expenses were 4% lower for the same time period. As we finished 2024 with an excess of gifts, there is a bit of a letdown as the first two months of the year are at a lower level than we expected. One avenue we as leaders of Calvary can take is to continue to share the amazing things happening at Calvary, and how none of these things are possible without the generosity of our congregation members.

NEW BUSINESS

Call Committee

We have shared this, but want to remind you that Elizabeth Wild has resigned from the Call Committee for personal reasons. She was the chairperson. Lael Schmidt has been selected by the committee to take up the chairperson position. The Call Committee does not feel a need to replace the seat vacated by Elizabeth Wild. The Congregation was asked to provide names of possible pastors who should be invited to serve at Calvary. Calvary had a strong response with 15 envelopes of names submitted. Those were given to the Office of the Bishop for follow-up conversation with Bishop Tessa. The Call Committee is preparing to begin initial interviews.

Worship

We have moved into Lent with the Burning of the Palms and Ash Wednesday. Just remember that attendance is only one marker of health and vitality of a congregation. Calvary continues to have youth helping with Lenten midweek worship services.



A Message from the Call Committee


Greetings friends and fellow members of Calvary! I would like to provide a quick update on our mission to call a qualified lead pastor for Calvary Lutheran Church who will lead our congregation in faith, worship and service. Our Calvary Call Committee consists of eight members who were commissioned earlier this year. We have met once with Bishop Tessa (for organizational purposes) and have held four subsequent meetings on our own. Our initial efforts have focused on prayerfully learning call protocol, studying our Ministry Site Profile and planning next steps. One of our initial steps has been to ask for suggestions of pastoral

candidates by our congregation. We were excited by the response of our Calvary family! Quite a number of names were uplifted by our congregation which have been forwarded to the Eastern North Dakota Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. These names are currently being processed by the Bishop's office. Our Bishop will reach out to those who are qualified and good matches for our congregation to discern their interest. Once interested parties are identified, those names will be forwarded to us for further review. We are looking to provide a further update to you during church services on Palm Sunday. 
