In October, we will hear more about "What We Can Do?" as we kickoff the 2025 Fall Stewardship Appeal. When we speak the Lord's Prayer and say, "Give us this day, our daily bread," this is not an individual request for food for today. It is a communal, collective, appeal for what we need. Remembering our Small Catechism, Martin Luther in his explanation of this petition writes, "Daily bread includes everything that has to do with the support and needs of the body, such as food, drink, clothing, shoes, house, home, land, animals, money, goods, a devout husband or wife, devout children, devout workers, devout and faithful rulers, good government, good weather, peace, health, self-control, good reputation, good friends, faithful neighbors, and the like." Reading this list we might think that we provide those things, but it is God who gives us the skills, gifts, abilities, intellect, and acumen to earn a wage or offer our time to provide "Daily Bread" for us, our families, our neighbors, and our community. So, "what can we do," in response to God's lavish generosity? God's gifts come to particular people, in particular places, in particular times. Because we are made in God's image, we, too, uniquely embody God's steadfast abundance, love, and mercy. We are equipped to be generous where we are. Drawn more deeply into the body of Christ, we are reminded of our belovedness, and we can respond with generosity, love, and service on behalf of our neighbors. This is stewardship and stewardship is another way to frame discipleship.

A MESSAGE FROM COUNCIL PRESIDENT TONY SCHROEDER

My brothers and sisters in Christ, greetings from the Calvary Church Council!

I am not sure about you, but one of the things that I love about living in the upper Midwest is the fact that we experience four seasons throughout the year. I especially love fall: the changing of the leaves, the harvest time for the things planted months earlier and returning to a usual routine after the summer months. Fall is also an exciting time in the church because it brings us back to a new season at Calvary with our return to Sunday School and multiple worship services.

With the changing of seasons outside of Calvary, I have also been thinking about the changing of the seasons inside of Calvary. The power of prayer is effective! Calvary members benefit from making and sharing prayer requests. We invite you to share prayer requests for yourself, family, and one another with us. You can request that information be shared only with pastors, only with pastors and staff, or allow the request to be shared through the Calvary Prayer Chain. Prayer may not change the outcome of a healthcare situation or a life circumstance, but it will certainly allow others to surround us with care. Remember, even though "the Spirit intercedes for us with sighs too deep for words to express," our companions in Christ at Calvary can't unless we share our needs. Please call or email Cathy Bubb in the church office to share prayer requests.

I believe that both feelings are natural, and both can live together in the same heart. What steadies whatever our emotions we are feeling is the promise that God's timing is always good. The God that walked with this congregation with the passing of Pastor Kirk, through the season of transition, is the same God who will walk with us into this new beginning. I am reminded of the well-known words from the book of Ecclesiastes 3: "To everything there is a season, and a time to every purpose under heaven." This verse reminds us God has divine plans for every event in our lives, and this new beginning for Calvary is not by accident. It is a season appointed for us, and God is already working in it.

As we enter this new season together, may we do so with open hands and open hearts. Pastor Racheal's first Sunday preaching will be October 19. To help introduce Pastor Rachael to everyone a brief biography is provided. Please be sure to welcome her when she arrives and let us give thanks for the new season that God is providing for Calvary.

Highlights of Church Council

FINANCE - 2025 FINANCE REPORT

Month of August

Giving: Calvary's August congregational giving was \$15K higher than last year. This can be attributed to one large annual gift and two smaller gifts in August 2025. August 2025 giving compared to budget was \$7K lower than planned. Weekly giving in August was 78% of budget.

Expenses: August expenses compared to last year were \$3k lower primarily due to staffing costs (lower headcount), the reclassification of a scissor lift purchase of \$6.1k to a capital asset and timing of fees received for Sunday School and Confirmation. August expenses compared to budget were \$34k favorable primarily due to lower headcount, fees collected for Sunday School and Confirmation and reclassification of a capital asset from expenses. **Income (Loss):** August income of \$26.7K is favorable \$17K to last year and \$26.7K favorable to budget.

Year to Date

Giving: YTD August giving is \$6K lower than prior year. This can be attributed to timing of one-time gifts and lower weekly giving than prior year. YTD August giving is under budget \$151K at 78% of budget.

Expenses: YTD August expenses are \$45K lower than prior year due to \$57K lower staff ministry costs and \$5K lower office costs offset by \$3K increased utility costs and \$15K maintenance costs.

Income (Loss): YTD Net Loss of \$28.2K is \$39K lower than last year which is the result of the reduction in income of \$6K offset by \$45K in favorable spending compared to last year.

Forecast

Giving: Based on current trends and an analysis of historical giving patterns, we are forecasting a year-end shortfall in contributions. This gap is projected to be approximately \$132K, representing a 13% deviation from the budgeted amount for the year.

Expenses: Expenses are projected to continue trending at the current YTD average of \$77K per month, ending the year at \$911K and \$130K under budget.

Income (Loss): The anticipated deficit between income and expenses is estimated to be approximately \$3K.

NEW BUSINESS

Transition Process

Pastor Rachael Puttbrese has accepted the call and will begin October 15 and her first day of preaching is October 19.

Staffing

Hospitality Coordinator position posted and deadline was August 24. No prospects at this point. Pastor Rachael to provide input on the position.

Staff reviews and evaluations were completed by Pastor Jared before he left. This was beneficial because Pastor Rachael can meet with the staff to set goals for 2026.

Finance and Budgeting

Council Reps plan to meet with their staff person to listen to ministry plans and assist in aligning budget request to these plans.
