

### **Treasurer's Report - Overview**

Income in May was 14% higher when comparing with the prior year. There were a number of gifts generally given on a quarterly basis that were received in May that helped the income to be higher in the current year over the prior year. Noisy Offering in May was collected for St. Joseph's summer lunch program in the amount of \$1,200. May events at Calvary began with the annual spring luncheon. Calvary finished the education year with a celebration on the last day of Sunday and Wednesday school and recognized high school seniors during a baccalaureate service. May wrapped up with the opportunity to serve at the Love Feast which is a monthly community meal at Zion Methodist Church.

Income through May was \$19,600 lower than the prior year and \$14,000 lower than the five-year average. Year-to-date expenses through May were \$18,000 lower than the prior year and \$6,900 lower than the five-year average. Continued sharing of all the great things happening is a way for individuals to become invested in Calvary with both their hearts and their treasures.

Income in June was 12% higher when comparing with the prior year. Although current year June did have five Sundays while in the prior year there were only four, income was still 6% higher the prior year if the final Sunday income was removed. Noisy Offering in June was collected to support summer Bible camp attendees in the amount of \$1,000. Vacation Bible School started June activities at Calvary. Activities continued with a book club for third through fifth graders, a reception for Jackie Spiros as she retired in June and the Calvary men's retreat was held over Father's Day weekend. Year-to-date income through June was \$12,800 lower than the prior year and \$10,000 lower than the five-year average. Expenses through June are \$26,000 lower than the prior year and only slightly higher than the five-year average. As the summer months continue, receipts and disbursements will continue to be monitored. Please pray for continued support and faithfulness in Calvary's partnership in ministry.

### **Council Business**

Approved offering the Director of Education and Family Activities position to Nicole Bye.  
Approved offering the Youth Director and Confirmation Coordinator position to Morgan Olson.  
Anna Larson has agreed to chair the capital campaign committee. A private consultant has been hired to help with this. Six men attended the men's retreat to Minneapolis. Wednesday night worship is being moved to 6:00 p.m. with the idea that dinner church will be incorporated and will be held the first Wednesday of each month. It will be geared to Wednesday school and confirmation students and their families, but is open to all members.

### **Officers and Ministry Teams**

Pastor Kirk, Pastor Ivy, and three council members represented Calvary at the Eastern Synod Gathering. They were very impressed with the theme of One.  
Over 120 students attended Vacation Bible School with the theme of God is Good. The students and teachers laid their hands on Jackie Spiros to thank and bless her for her 28 years of ministry at Calvary. The retirement reception held for Jackie on June 9 was well attended.  
A huge thank you to Daxon Mason and Brian Harris and their teams for installing the new window shades that Ray and Carolyn Fischer purchased for the east side of the Sanctuary.

Nichole Bye and Morgan Olson both accepted the education and youth coordinator positions respectively. A job description for some of Nichole's former positions have been combined into a new Congregational Life Coordinator position and it has been posted. Registration is open for fall education programs.

## OUTREACH


### Positives:



# COMING SOON TO CALVARY

## COMING THIS FALL: A CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

In the fall, Calvary Lutheran Church plans to launch a capital campaign that will focus on three major need areas our church must address.

**Ministry:** Annual Operations & Stewardship Support

**Mortgage:** Reduction of Church Mortgage Debt

**Maintenance:** Church Building Maintenance Needs

Over the summer, Calvary has organized an initial steering committee to lead the campaign activities through the guidance of Brenda Moore. Although the core committee has been formed, we will be needing the assistance of volunteers to help with our campaign efforts. ### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS REGARDING OUR MORTGAGE:

**1. What is the current financial status of our Mortgage?**

As of July 17, 2019, our mortgage balance is \$983,060.28.

Calvary is making steady progress towards paying down the mortgage, but not at a rate that would allow the debt to be at zero prior to September 2022, when the interest rate on the loan will increase.

**2. What is the backstory of the Mortgage?**

Between September 2012 to December 2013, Calvary was able to raise \$2,348,578 to build a new Fellowship Hall. After securing a loan for construction, we broke ground April 2014 and by 2015 we were able to worship in the sanctuary and new classrooms within the basement.

In September 2017, Calvary refinanced the mortgage to include a five-year maturity amortized over 23 years with a fixed 3.875% interest rate. In other words, our interest rate will remain fixed for five years from the date of the refinance.

In September 2022, our interest rate on our mortgage will be adjusted, most likely a higher rate on the balance. Calvary is making steady progress towards paying down the mortgage, but not at a rate that would allow the debt to be at zero prior to September 2022 when the rate will change.

If we as Calvary can work together to move toward a zero balance prior to the rate change a lower level of interest will be paid out and a much higher level of our gifts will be able to be allocated to the principal of the mortgage.

**3. How is a Capital campaign going to help?**

Since we know the mortgage rate will be increasing soon, we would like to be fiscally responsible in paying down the mortgage now. By doing this, we can reduce the financial burden of our congregation and allow for future funds to be allocated toward other necessities and ministry opportunities.
