




A NOTE FROM OUR PASTORS



Sacred Time. Calvary Lutheran, as a member of the whole priesthood of believers, will now be participating in the season of Advent. This liturgical beginning of the church's life expresses God's deep desire to embrace the whole world. And even though, tragically, the world has not been terribly



We will approach this time of God's choosing, God's incarnation, like every other time of our lives - humbly acknowledging the odd, often disturbing, relationship God has engendered with sinners like us. In Jesus' conception, all life now comes into play; the boundlessness of God's beloved generosity runs absolutely rampant!

God will accomplish God's mission by inspiring his body, the church, to acts of worship that provoke us to love our neighbors. No, really, I'm not making this up! The church is called together in worship to receive God's Spirit, a living presence who connects our worship with acts of mercy for those we wouldn't, on our own, care about. We are those shepherds racing toward the manger because the angels proclaimed God's promise was to be discovered there!

Calvary Lutheran Church, as a gathering of (often smelly) shepherds, becomes the people of God because the Spirit continues to show up and announce redemption to a world that is both beautiful and one that is forever pushing folks like poor, pregnant young Mary into oblivion. Since 1953, we have struggled to recognize the largess of God's mercy for all. Like all places and people of faith, Calvary not only celebrates what God has done through us but is also called to honestly recognize when God's mission was defined by a certain smallness of heart; sometimes shepherds' love fences more than the sheep.

Hear the good news! God surely can mend fences, but come on, don't get all wrapped up in barbed wire! There's a party, and everyone has been invited! Even death is invited (but there's a surprise for "him" too!) THAT'S Sacred Time!



Imagine that you're driving down the highway. You miss your exit. With a little tug in the pit of your stomach, you realize that you're now heading somewhere new. Imagine that you're at a concert. A piece of music keeps surprising you with fresh chords and new sounds. The composer leads you somewhere you didn't expect, and you can't help but follow, curious to discover what comes next.

Change is at hand. Something unexpected is happening, and we're in the midst of it. Out of the blue, something new is arriving like lightning: hope, peace, joy, love. God's time is now. It's here to reorient our expectations and to sweep us into a future of hope and promise, even if we didn't expect it, even if it wasn't part of our plans.

This Advent, Calvary invites you to join the flow of a season that sweeps us off our feet, carries us forward, and invites us to join God in God's creative work. We'll find God beguiling us by inviting us to imagine something new, regardless of what came before. And if we're worried about the future and afraid of letting go of the familiar in our lives, God will meet us there too!

IT TAKES A VILLAGE

Our recent session was very successful as evidenced by the filling of 504 bags in an hour thanks to the 30 volunteers that helped out. We are sending 90 bags to Lewis and Clark Elementary each week to students identified as food insecure. We still need your help though. Outside the doors of each worship space is a list of items you can take with you. Consider grabbing a couple items when you are at the store and bring it in on Sundays. You can also donate a monetary gift for the backpack program. It takes about \$100 to feed one child for the whole school year. That's \$11 per month. It also costs \$250 per week to provide for all qualifying students. Give what you can. No amount is too small.

HOLY GROUNDS COFFEE HOUSE

Holy Grounds is open and we need your help! Be a part of this hospitality ministry at Calvary Lutheran Church to provide a welcoming place for fellowship before and/or after worship times at Calvary. Sign up for as few or many time slots as you would like. Have fun serving coffee and getting to know the people at Calvary. Our espresso machine is very user friendly and training is provided. 2 shifts are scheduled each Sunday for 2 people per shift. Families are also welcome to volunteer together. Shifts run from 8:30 am to 10:00 am and 10:00 am to 11:30 am.

Highlights of the CHURCH COUNCIL

FINANCE

Income in October was significantly higher than we saw in the prior year which feels hopeful as we look toward year-end. There were four quarterly/yearly gifts which helped make a difference in monthly income.

Calvary's events calendar was packed through the month of October. A flu and COVID shot clinic was held at the beginning of October for all those interested. New members were welcomed on October 9 and 12. There was a Memory Café service fair along with a speaker on October 11. Third grade students were invited to a time of teaching and then received their Bible at worship the following week. Calvary held a semi-annual meeting to share the state of the church on a ministry, mission, and financial level. October rounded out the month with Affirmation of Baptism of 23 students and Trunk or Treat for the community. Noisy offering in October was collected for the Lewis and Clark emergency fund in the amount of \$1,542.

Year-to-date income through October was \$26,000 lower than the five-year average and expenses were \$115,900 higher than the five-year average. As the finance team begins the budget process for 2023 there are many variables that will be considered. A large variable will be how the church financially finishes the current year. We are thankful for our community of faith and how we work together in our ministry at Calvary.

STEWARDSHIP

Good morning! My name is Erica Sundby, and I would like to share a guick message from the Stewardship Committee. As some of you may have already heard, especially if you attended our semi-annual congregational meeting a few weeks ago, we are in a place that Calvary has never been, financially. It's important for us to talk about the state of the church's financial affairs. We're not yet at the point of panic, but certainly at the point where we need to discuss this vulnerability openly and honestly with one another. If you would like any of the data shared at the semi-annual meeting, please just ask and it can be shared with you.

Calvary is such a wonderful place that my family has found a part of, and I hope that's the case for everyone here today. We, in this room, are Calvary Lutheran Church. Without us, and without the gifts God has placed in our hands, this wonderful place just wouldn't exist, let alone grow. But rather than simply asking for money from you today, let's reshape that way of thinking and ask what God is doing through us with the help of your gifts. There is no amount, too big or too small, every little bit creates an impact in the lives of so many.

Did you know that just \$1/week supports a Sunday School student for the entire year? Less than \$5 each week can provide a backpack for a child in the backpack program at Lewis & Clark Elementary. A gift of \$20 can buy a Bible for our 3-year-olds or third graders. It takes \$125 each day to keep the lights on and the building heated/cooled at Calvary! So we need your gifts, big and small, to continue making Calvary the faith home for others.

Offering is an act that we exercise during worship, and there are some changes coming to perhaps make this act a bit more lively and exciting (as it should be!). In this day and age of technology, many of us (myself included) don't have cash or our checkbooks at the ready, and don't know how to give or can feel left out of the fun. There are several ways you can pledge your gifts to the church outside of the offering plate. There are a few options up on the screen, if you would like more information on any of these, or would like help setting them up, please don't hesitate to ask.

As Kirk mentioned in the semi-annual meeting, our goal is to try and make November look like December in terms of giving. So we ask you to prayerfully consider what you can give to close out these last months of the year. And as you plan your budgets for next year, keep Calvary in mind. There will be commitment cards at the end of service today, and we ask that you bring them back with you to service next Sunday. Lastly, I am new to stewardship here at Calvary, and am desperately seeking a team to learn and walk this journey with me.

I invite anyone who is interested to please join us at our next meeting on December 5 at 5:30 pm here at Holy Grounds. No experience necessary! I've put my contact information up there
