
AN UPDATE FROM PASTOR KIRK

February Newsletter



Welcome to February Calvary! Because of deadlines, I am writing my February newsletter article two weeks before our Annual meeting on January 30 – but just after our Council's January meeting and five days after Pastor Aaron Bye's ordination and installation.

In case you missed our Annual meeting, there are a couple of items I'd like to highlight. First, because God calls us to be a loving, generous community, Calvary's giving, reflected in our annual budget, came in at



Second, our three year capital campaign, Forward in Faith, has been nothing short of awesome! Back in November, with one year left to go on our total pledged amount of \$801,207.87, we received \$571,931.55. In addition to those committed dollars, an unpledged amount of \$147,087.32 was given for a grand total of \$719,018.87. Thanks be to God!

Third, Calvary isn't sitting back waiting for "things" to improve. We just voted to call Pastor Aaron Bye to be our third pastor, we hired Julie Pedersen to be our Volunteer Coordinator earlier this year and we just recently hired Marcus Vivier to be our full-time tech coordinator. For the sake of the gospel, we hit the road running. Please introduce yourself to these fellow "runners" when you get a chance.

Ok, that gets us up to date. So what about 2022? How is God stirring Calvary in the days and months to come? Amid all the unknowns, not knowing how God's future will impact us, I can think of three opportunities to engage as a congregation:

- 1. Because we have come to believe that Calvary's "super power" is carrying children, by way of our Christmas Angel Tree event, we started a relationship with our neighbors over at the Lewis and Clark Elementary School. We're hoping God will build this relationship up over the next year.
- 2.We are putting together an informal relationship with the Northwood two-point parish (Northwood Lutheran and Washington Lutheran). Please join us in prayer for all parties as we learn how to be sister congregations throughout 2022 and beyond.
- 3. The season of Lent (Ash Wednesday is March 2) is always a highlight of Calvary's worship life - a beautiful, Christ-centered bridge from the brightness of Epiphany stars hidden in the dark of ND winter to the season of Christ's glorious resurrection – a brilliant display that defines us as God's beloved.

Highlights of the CHURCH COUNCIL

January 11, 2021 @ 7:00 p.m. - 8:30 p.m. | Calvary Lutheran Church

Pastor Aaron, Opening Prayer

Pastor Kirk made a motion to approve December's minutes with Dexter seconding the motion. All voting in favor. Pastor Kirk talked about the book "Opening Israel's Scriptures" written by Ellen Davis. The book reflects on our relationship with God and how he yearns for a closer relationship with his people. He is as dependent on us as we are on him. He reflected that the church's mission will be more important than ever after the pandemic. People have had more problems to deal with and issues related to covid to recover from after things get back to the new normal.

Pastor Ivy added that the Lead Journey Team has been invited to do a video for promotional purposes on what they have been doing. Matt reported that the stewardship committee finished strong with the video presentation and the \$45,000 matching funds. Didn't quite meet the goals but was close. Nominating Committee: Pastor Kirk reported most of the positions had candidates but were still waiting to hear back from a few individuals. Parish Nurse, Mary Ann Devig, reported that Omicron is increasing quickly and now is not the time to stop wearing masks. It will be an ongoing disucssion. Other countries show the increase in cases is very sharp but once it peaks it drops very quickly too. It's ok to shake peoples hands but use hand sanitizer and wash your hands.

Budget 2022: Dexter handed out the proposed budget and discussed the rationale for the changes from last year. Many items in the past several years have been significantly different in the budget and actual dollars due to Covid. The staff is getting a 5% salary increase and with the addition of Pastor Aaron the salaries have increased significantly. Brian Harris moved to approve the proposed budget and Matt Vanderpan seconded with all voting in favor. Bylaw Updates Erin Navarro presented her proposal to change the wording of the bylaws to have a member of the Youth or Education committee have a vote on the council as well as an Evangelism or Worship committee member. Erin made a motion to bring it to the congregation at the annual meeting, Brian Harris seconded and all voted in favor

Scripture SPOTLIGHT

I remember a time when watching television provided opportunities for bursts of cardiovascular activity. Picture (or remember) this: your show hits a moment of suspense when all of a sudden a jingle begins and products and services appear on the television screen.

MATTHEW 11:28-30

Your heart begins to race and a challenge begins. It's a race against time - a race against commercial time. In these precious moments you need to make it to the refrigerator to grab a beverage, rummage through the cupboard to find a snack, or the more daring souls might even try to pop a bag of popcorn, trying not to miss many moments of the television show. But this wasn't the only challenge with television. The final moments usually led to a cliffhanger or a big reveal making us so impatient for the next week. Today, I intentionally wait until an entire season is available on a streaming service before beginning to watch it because then there's only one cliffhanger at the end of the season that I have to endure.

And now we find ourselves in the doldrums of winter. Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Year's Eve are done and the cloudy, cold days of January and February are upon us. Seasonal Affective Disorder affects many people. It is frustrating and difficult to drive some days and walking can be treacherous. I don't want to wish time away but I want to wish the cold and challenges of winter away. I want to get to the 'end of the season' cliffhanger by charging through a time of the year that can be miserable.

As a society, even a global one, we are facing grief and trauma due to the pandemic that many people have never experienced before. We want to barrel through, get to the end of the season because we are hurting, tired, frustrated and burned out. It's a cliffhanger that isn't really all that fun. It is in these times that Jesus comes to us and says something very important: "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." (Mt 11:28-30)

You who are weary, who are heavily burdened, turn toward Jesus who promises the beginning of a new season for us daily. We don't have to wait for this promise. New seasons are Jesus' specialty and these seasons are better than we expect. They are promised. Will you join me in a moment where we anticipate the next season while living in this one knowing that the promised future is at hand?

2021 FINANCE REPORT

For fiscal year 2021, Calvary Lutheran Church reported annual revenues of \$889,618 and total disbursements of \$888,018. Annual revenues in 2021 did see a 3.7% decrease over 2020 levels. Disbursements also followed with a comparable decrease. The decrease in disbursements can be attributed to the ability to do ministry in the ways we have seen in past years. Some of the programs we have done in the past could not be done at the same level so a simplified program was done. With less programming, there has been less of a need for cleaning services which lowered disbursments. The winter of 2021 was milder and not as much snow so there was a savings for snow removal.

While our capital campaign push concluded in 2019, the need to retire the debt on the building is still present in the day-to-day life of Calvary. Our mortgage interest is reported as a budgeted item each year. During 2021 Calvary was able to pay \$200,000 down on the principal of the mortgage. The balance on the mortgage at year-end 2021 was \$700,913.01.

The 2022 proposed budget calls for \$1,141,369 of gross receipts which represents a 22% increase over 2021 actual revenues of \$889,618. As Calvary moves forward into 2022 continued stewardship efforts will be placed on increasing general fund giving which supports the ongoing ministry of the church. The 2022 proposed budget also calls for \$1,141,369 in gross disbursements. A number of items changed within the proposed budget over 2021. The majority of the increase was related to staff configuration. Positions added to the staff include a technical coordinator, worship technology support, worship cantors, and a third pastor for the entire year. A 5% staff pay increase of \$20,006 was included in the budget. In closing, we would like to recognize all Calvary members and friends, for the continued support of Calvary and our ongoing mission of "Called by God, Centered in Grace, Calvary Serves and Ignites People for Christ."


