



A NOTE FROM PASTOR KIRK

"But law came in, with the result that the trespass multiplied; but where sin increased, grace abounded all the more, so that, just as sin exercised dominion in death, so grace might also exercise dominion through justification leading to eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord" (Romans 5:20-21).



Probably the number one reason the summer months in the Grand Forks region gets so wonderfully celebrated stems from the "other season" that will not be spoken of. Yes, there's a certain beauty and rhythm that takes place from November to April, but let's get real, summer is a beloved time.

As I'm getting my summer on, I was saddened by a recent story that told of a religious leader using the phrase, "the law of God," to justify excluding a group of people from gathering in his local jurisdiction (in this case a church building). Who these members happened to be wasn't what I found disturbing. Actually my surprise and my sadness was the religious reason the leader used to assert God's law clearly excludes others. I also couldn't help but notice what was revealed in such an official, religiously legal, pronouncement.

In an opposing account from 2,000 years ago, the devout Torah follower turned Christian theologian, St. Paul, reminds us how easily humans, especially religious leaders, speak and act too confidently about using the law of God to be an instrument of exclusion – after all, he was one of those leaders early on. The reason Paul repented of his use of God's law to kick members out was because Jesus opened his eyes to not only the plight of tossed out people but how these people are key to God's grace on behalf of the abusers! How does that make any sense?

In other words, those people we tend to treat as foreign or disturbed or just plain wrong, God doesn't. Biblically speaking now, from Psalm 118:22-23 to Matthew 21:42 to Acts 4:7 to I Peter 2:7, we read these words, "The stone that the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone."

May God's Spirit crash into our lives ala Paul (Acts 9) this beautiful summer, creating new hearts that not only notice all who are rejected by society, including the church, but to be converted through them! This is resurrection living!

Highlights of the CHURCH COUNCIL

FINANCE - 2023 FINANCE REPORT

Giving in May was 15% higher than the prior year. There were a number of larger annual/quarterly gifts that were given in May which helped reach the higher income. Calvary's income each month seems to be returning to a higher level than we have seen in the recent past which is a promising sign for our congregation.

Activities in May helped close out the school year. The Unforgettables Memory Choir held their spring semester concert, Calvary celebrated their 70th anniversary with a potluck and program, and confirmation students and their mentors served a meal at Zion Methodist for Love Feast.

Year-to-date income through May was 2% (\$9,565) lower than the five-year average and expenses were also lower, at 1.8% (\$7,339) year to date. Each month our numbers seem to be trending closer to the five-year average which is our goal. As we enter the summer season when many of us take time to enjoy the warm weather and are away from Calvary, we pray for continued support through the sharing of individuals' blessings.

Old Business

Global Friends - We would like to thank everyone for the generosity that enabled us to set up an apartment for the mother and son from El Salvador.

Widow-Widowers - Pastor Kirk, Brian, and Diane met with the leaders of this group and they will be returning to Calvary in the fall with Kirk being included in the leadership.

The Rev. Elizabeth A. Eaton, presiding bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), has announced the launch of the ELCA's Truth and Healing Movement. The ELCA's Truth & Healing Movement is an opportunity for this church to increase our understanding of our colonizing impacts on Indigenous people in the past and present. Over the next several months, there will be opportunities to learn, raise awareness and engage in other ways to impact hearts and lives across this church. We believe that the truth, and our knowing and embracing it, is the first step toward healing for all of us.

"We must be in better, right, and healthy relationships with the Indigenous people of Turtle Island," said Eaton. "As we know, the truth and our knowing and embracing it, is the first step toward healing for all of us."

In 2016, the ELCA Churchwide Assembly adopted the Repudiation of the Doctrine of Discovery. Following this action, Eaton commissioned a task force to lead the work outlined in the repudiation. The task force also developed "A Declaration of the ELCA to American Indian and Alaska Native People," which confessed the church's complicity in the oppression and genocide of Indigenous people and recommitted the ELCA to the work of Repudiation.

The ELCA's Truth & Healing Movement will enlist and empower members to become involved in the areas of focus started by the task force: development of appropriate settler narrative from a Lutheran perspective; encouraging the ritual practice of land acknowledgement; understanding Lutheran participation in Indian Boarding Schools; and support for communities impacted by murdered and missing Indigenous women and girls. The movement will also offer ways to participate in the national Truth and Healing Movement.

Since the 1960s Lutherans have supported the American Indian Movement, working towards justice for and with Indigenous People. The ELCA's Truth & Healing Movement commits this church to building and strengthening right relationships with our Indigenous neighbors.

<u>Ingredients</u>

- 1 c. salad oil
- 1 c. sugar
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. dry mustard
- 1 tsp. celery seed
- 1/2 medium onion
- 1/2 c. white vinegar
