A NOTE FROM PASTOR KIRK

"The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men (in dazzling clothes) said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen." Luke 24:5

Like every Christian community, Calvary Lutheran proclaims this Easter message: God fulfills the promise made to Abram and to all of his

descendants (which now includes gentiles like us) in the Easter event of resurrection! And since Jesus was raised for all time, then forgiveness of sins forever triumphs over even our best attempts at evil-doing. And since forgiveness wins the day, all day, every day, then authentic reconciliation between the nations is made possible too!

This year, on April 17, by the power of God's Holy Spirit, Calvary, alongside the whole Christian Church on earth, will be grabbed hold of through this new "arrangement" - to be made God's beloved for the entire world. This same Spirit promises to reveal Calvary Lutheran Church to be a blessed community of people who cannot help but proclaim Christ crucified and risen in all that we say and do!

How is God calling Calvary Lutheran members out to be God's beloved people in April, 2022? How are we **wearing resurrection** these days and in the days and weeks to come? First and foremost, we are being called to enter into God's story through the last weeks of Lent. Holy Week's revealing, obviously painful story involves/implicates our sin-sick hearts. Our sinful selves in this redemptive story foists a defeated Jesus onto Rome's cross, only to have death utterly destroyed on that first Easter Sunday morning – for us!

For all of us, so when I read that the average time it takes a Lutheran to actually invite anyone, ANYONE, to worship with them is THIRTY YEARS, I cannot help but implore you to ask someone to join you in worshipping God this month. Try praying and imagining who that person (or persons) might be? As I've been saying over the past two years, so much of our calling as baptized people of God isn't about us, **it's about others**.

Like you, I am troubled by the lack of civility and the abundance of division these days. I am doubly troubled when congregations, denominations and whole religions add to this dilemma. May our prayers continue to reform our voices when we judge others words to be unworthy of God's grace.

But in all cases, God's story for the sake of the world welcomes even sinners like us to see beyond our own agendas, bias and well, hatreds. Please continue to pray for God's presence in and through our congregation. God bless you this Easter season!

Highlights of the CHURCH COUNCIL

February 8, 2022 @ 7:00 p.m. - 8:30 p.m. | Calvary Lutheran Church

Income received in February was 16% higher than the prior year A few annual and quarterly gifts were received in February which contributed to higher income for comparison purposes between the current and prior year. The timing of when gifts are given is generally the largest reason for differences between months of income.

Calvary hosted a number of events in February. Confirmation students were invited to "Baking Through the Bible" which as an end result provided cupcakes for the LaGrave meal the following week. Calvary hosted the Eastern ND Band Ensemble day on February 8. It was wonderful to see Calvary filled with high school students and hear the music pieces they had been practicing. The Unforgettables Memory Choir resumed on February 23 which was a welcome opportunity for those who love to sing in the choir. February worship ended with "Pajama Wednesday and Sunday" to close out our month of collecting pajamas for our community.

Year-to-date income through February was 4% (\$5,500) higher than the five-year average and expenses were 9% (\$17,000) higher than the five-year average. While the income is higher than past years, our expenses are also higher and may be closer to what we see regularly moving forward. With our 2022 budget our staff costs did increase which is a large part of our higher expenses, but also maybe that means our lives are returning to a new "normal," that includes a return of some ministries and development of new ministries. We pray that our congregation continues to be excited and energized about the mission and ministry of Calvary. It was approved to bring on a part time position 10-15 seasonal hours per week (44 weeks per year) to help with free Morgan & Nicole with children, youth and family ministry. On April 26 there will be an event here at Calvary to discuss and brainstorm how our synod can be of help with Lutheran Disaster Response. We need lots of volunteers to help greet people and help with the offering on Easter Sunday- if you can volunteer email Pastor Kirk or call the church office to let them know. The youth board met last night; they discussed a youth welcome statement- to promote the culture "all our welcome"; they are going to Albuquerque in July 2022- 17 students are going. The mask requirement ended in March and it has eemed to go well with the new recommendations. Covid tests are widely availbale and we will continue to encourage people to watch online if they are ill.

There are many reasons such as the change in rhythm, the feeling of solemnity, and it being a pilgrimage with Jesus towards the most awful which leads to the most wonderful. And yet, there is one thing that I love about Lent that doesn't fall into any of the categories I already mentioned. The fact that when Lent begins it is often cold, snowy, and gloomy but as the pilgrimage towards Holy Week continues, there is a sense of coming out of the depths into the deep breath of spring. Or, to put it less eloquently, Lent ends in spring, which is intentional because the word Lent means 'spring'. It's almost like someone knew what they were doing when they decided what to call this season of the church year!

Isaiah 43:19 says, "Look, I am doing something new! Now it springs forth - can't you see it? I'm making a road in the desert and setting rivers to flow in the wasteland." Something new 'springs' forth! I'm not going to take this where you expect it. I'm not going to point to the promises of God popping up from the wet soil like a spring tulip. I'm not going to talk about the symbolism of the season. I am, however, going to talk about the new things springing forth from us.

When we are pilgrims with Jesus (not just tourists taking in the sights) we are taking part in the transformation and change that happens in his baptism, death, and resurrection. We become new. When we are washed in the water of baptism, something happens that is impossible to

explain. When we are nourished in communion, something happens that is impossible to explain. It's a mystery but it does something that changes us. There is power in the elements to bring something springing forth that is God's work. Lent changes us because Christ changes us and we are pilgrims with him. In this time with Jesus, spring is coming, spring has come, and spring is yet to come. It's impossible to explain and yet here it is. Spring. A season of fresh air, a season where we bust out of the old and a new thing is happening. What is new with you?
