In our daily lives, this might look like offering a listening ear to a friend in need, extending a helpful hand to a neighbor, or speaking words of encouragement to someone who is struggling.



FINANCE - 2024 FINANCE REPORT

Income in March was 7% higher than the prior year. Easter fell one week earlier than last year and the extra services during Holy Week often affect giving for the month.

March was a month full of activities at Calvary. The UND Concert Choir held a concert to begin the month. Individuals interested in joining Calvary's visitation team were invited to learn more about this important ministry. Palm Sunday kicked off Holy Week and the many opportunities for worship. Fifth grade students were invited to a time of teaching on Maundy Thursday that concluded with a worship service where some took communion for the first time. High school youth hosted a ready-made Easter egg hunt fundraiser and hid over 3,500 eggs the night before Easter in the Grand Forks area. Noisy Offering in March was collected for Feed My Starving Children in the amount of \$2,080.50.

Year-to-date income through March was 14% higher than our five-year average while our expenses were only slightly higher for the same time period. Calvary has so many opportunities to "be the church" each week. We pray our members and friends take advantage of those weekly opportunities and invest their time, talents, and treasures in their church home.

OLD BUSINESS

Visitation ministry progress. The first of a two-part visitation training has occurred led by Pastor Jared. Pastor Aaron, staff member, Mary Ann Devig, and seven congregation members are enrolled. A wide range of ages is represented with more members interested in a potential future class.

Employee Handbook update is still being worked on. A revised handbook will be presented to the council at a future meeting.

Kirk modeled this love in visits and in his gardening. Now Calvary will bear witness to his love by tending to this garden plot and sharing its abundance. Love Feast


