A NOTE FROM PASTOR KIRK



Throughout September this year, the gospel lessons appointed for our worship services are stories Jesus tells his followers to challenge their "common sense" assumptions about what it means to be a religious community.

Here are the last lines of the four gospel lessons:

- 1. So therefore, none of you can become my disciple if you do not give up all your possessions. (Luke 14:35)
- 2. Just so, I tell you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents. (Luke 15:10)
- 3. You cannot serve God and wealth. (Luke 16:13)
- 4. He (Jesus) said to him, 'If they do not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be convinced even if someone rises from the dead. (Luke 16:31)

As many of us now (re)gather for worship after three glorious summer months, I invite us all to listen, and discuss together, how Jesus' challenges move us as a congregation. What are our treasured assumptions that Jesus plows into?

Here's just one example of the kind of assumption I believe Jesus is inviting us to reconsider in light of the ways of the world: How is God calling us to treat those in the minority, those with hardly a voice, those who simply cannot win?

Next month, Calvary, along with several other area congregations, anticipate joining up with two important organizations-one that has been serving the GF area for quite a while, and the other just now entering our community-in order to receive our newest minority population.

A little history-since at least 2011, the Global Friends Coalition (GFC) has successfully escorted hundreds of refugees through the labyrinth of the Grand Forks culture-a place we call home that is literally "all Greek" to them! And about two months ago, Church World Service (CWS) began partnering with GFC in order to relocate fifty refugees to our town. You can go on the GFC website for more info on their success story and you can ask me for a copy of the lengthy agreement both organizations signed (it's nineteen pages long).

Here's my challenge to Calvary: think about, pray about and talk about, how Jesus' four ending statements from this month's gospel readings relate to our newest neighbors who will be living among us starting in October. How is God calling us to see the month of September to prepare our hearts and minds to be disciples who care about the orphan, widow, stranger and alien resident.

I'm astounded at what faith communities can accomplish even in these days of postpandemic lethargy. God's Holy Spirit breathes hope into our collective lungs as we are called out of our "not knowing what tomorrow brings" in order to trust God is indeed doing a new thing, and we are truly blessed to be a small part of "repairer of the breach, the restorer of streets to live in," (Isaiah 58:12).

Highlights of the CHURCH COUNCIL

FINANCE

July's income was received at a slightly higher level than the prior year. There was one additional Sunday in the current year which made the difference in income for the month.

Activities in July were much less than prior months, but still provided opportunities for congregation members and friends to engage with each other and the community. Children were invited to attend a two-week Lego League camp and a book club. High school youth travelled to Albuquerque, New Mexico, for a week of service and learning in the community. The second Sunday of each month, Calvary's congregation has the opportunity to serve a meal at LaGrave on First. The staff provided a meal in July, and the council is volunteering their time in August. Noisy offering in July was collected for St. Joseph's Food Pantry in the amount of \$426.

Income through July was 6% (\$27,700) lower than the five-year average and expenses were 17% (\$115,600) higher than the five-year average. As Calvary enjoys the last month of the summer schedule, we also look to the fall and the excitement of all the opportunities for Calvary to "be the Church," both within our walls and in our community and everyone is invited!

CALL TO ORDER DEVOTION OLD BUSINESS

Cynthia Shaab from the Global Friends Coalition and CWS will give us a presentation at our September Council meeting regarding 50 refugees entering Grand Forks in October.

The roof is being repaired by C.L. Linfoot either this fall or early next year. Brian Harris is on top of this!

The Council cooked and served food at LaGrave on August 14 & 15.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

There was a call from the synod inquiring if Calvary would consider another new-grad pastor as a third pastor. Apparently a new pastor in Texas wanted to come to Calvary specifically. Since the Exec Team had already met and agreed to pause and look for the right signs, the Personnel Committee agreed to decline this opportunity. We have Rachel Puttbrese in the wings to preach once per month and we also have a desire to better define pastoral roles. All felt that the original timeline to pause was still appropriate.

COMMITTEE

Angie Gietzen reminded us of two things: first, the upcoming "Gift Sundays" which are scheduled for the last Sunday of each month. On these dates, there will be no Sunday School but rather, families and teachers will have the opportunity to worship on those special Sundays. And second, our annual Backpack Sunday will be August 21.

The other day, Nichole and I took our son Oliver to one of the splash parks in town. He was so excited to see his friends there he couldn't wait to run around chasing them and splashing in the water. If his friends thought it would be fun to sit on the sprayer, you could count on Oliver doing the same. If lying on the pavement letting the sun warm them was on the list, you bet Oliver would be laying right next to them. Whatever the idea, Oliver's response was always, "Let's do this!"

Which got me wondering, what would it look like if I were more like Oliver? In a world that is constantly pulling us in a bunch of different directions, what would it look like to prioritize my commitments and really go all in? How would my own faith life grow, if I trusted God more and said, "Count me in?"

Since the pandemic, we have been searching for a positive, life-giving way of connecting the various parts of the worship service (confession, hymns, prayers, sermon, Bible stories, etc.) with the offering. We will include a preface to the offering part of worship. I hope this part of worship is not received as "Calvary is always begging for money," of course.

This month we at Calvary are kicking off our fall with the theme of "Count Me In." Why? Because after the last few years, things have looked different. We have navigated pandemic protocols, limited capacity, online worship and more. As we become more comfortable working in an ever-shifting world, we are excited to encourage you all to think about where God is calling you to say "count me in."





Roof Repair Announcment An update on our leaky roof



Under the category of "in case you haven't heard," our sanctuary roof started leaking last winter and after many inspections and patching jobs, we now know it needs to be repaired at a cost of between \$78,000-\$88,000. C.L. Linfoot will be doing the work which will take place most likely next spring. Because we have no choice, we need to have a fund-raising strategy in place. We're calling our strategy "Raise the Roof." One of our "Raise the Roof" events will be a creative "Totally Tables" meal alongside a silent auction. This is something we did in the past and it was pretty well received. The timing of this is still being worked out, but it will be some time this winter. Another idea is to place an attention-getting bucket in both worship spaces (as well as all our communication platforms) as a reminder of our need to stop the leaks!! We even added a cute puppy barking, "Roof! Roof!" standing next to the buckets. Who can resist? Of course we don't have to wait to have a fund-raiser to start giving towards a dry worship space as we will be, unfortunately, hearing the sound of indoor rain throughout the winter and spring months on the traditional side of our building.
